Welcome to November's edition of The Wick.

I think the biggest event this past month has been the Fireworks last weekend. An amazing bonfire and firework display put on by the Firework committee for the Eton Wick community. This year the committee selected the Youth Club to be the recipient of the donations from the night. About 10 Youth Club children with adult helpers turned up on the night, and, armed with charity buckets, sweets, and glow sticks, they collected more than  $\pounds 2000$  for the Youth Club. This is an amazing amount and will be gratefully received by the club. It will be spent on activities, art equipment, cooking ingredients etc.

The hanging baskets have been taken down, and in their place are the lamppost poppies. The baskets have given an amazing floral display this summer. We were so lucky to have had so many people, and local businesses, donate money to pay for the 2024 display of 16 baskets on 8 lampposts. A few weeks ago, we had a community Bingo night which was open to all ages. It was such a lovely evening with lots of laughter and chats. The night raised £568 for next years basket displays and the money raised will be spent on brackets to support the baskets on the lampposts. In 2025 we want to try and extend the display along the length of the Eton Wick Road, from the church to the cattle grid. We will be having another Bingo fund raising event at Easter so please do try and come along. We will advertise this nearer the time.

Upcoming events:

- The Remembrance Service in Eton Wick is on Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> November. At 2.30pm there will be wreath laying at the commemorative stone by the youth organisations of the village and Eton Wick Village Association. This will be followed by a 3pm service of remembrance at St John the Baptist church. All welcome.
- The Eton Christmas light switch on is on Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> November. The event starts around 5pm, and the light swich on is at 7pm in Jubilee Square. This is a very busy event with road closures so plan before you leave as I do not image there is any parking. It is good fun and is a gentle reminder that Christmas is on its way!!!




Weed growth throughout the period of 2023 to 2024 demonstrated to Thames Water (TW) that if weed cutting is not undertaken flooding will remain an issue. TW organised for a specialist company to clear the weed this year at a cost to them of circa £60k, which covered two cuts. The Environment Agency (EA) would not allow access for weed clearance until the end of the fish spawning season and work commenced on 17<sup>th</sup> June 2024 which was the earliest allowed date. The second cutback and removal of weed, which we expected to take place in September or October, will now start w/c 4<sup>th</sup> November.

We have an update from TW regarding planned improvements to the Slough Treatment Works (STW). TW acknowledges that STW is due for an upgrade and state that whilst it may seem that no work has been happening, behind the scenes a lot of engineers and designers have been working to find a solution that does not just shift the problem from location A to location B. The original proposal to route the wastewater through a tunnel from STW directly to the Thames has been shelved, and the revised plans are to implement a robust solution to process and treat the incoming sewage on a flow to fall basis.

So, what does that mean? TW advise that whilst the amount of effluent discharged will increase, the output will be much lower in ammonia, lower in phosphorus, and lower in particulates. There will be greater odour control and the high nutrient levels that have fed the weed growth resulting in spring and summer flooding will be removed before the water is released into the Roundmoor to make its journey to the Thames.

New storage and treatment tanks and other infrastructure are proposed to be built at STW as can be seen from the plan (existing in black, new in red). TW advise that this is a complicated build in a live working environment with hazardous areas so there are risks for which they must plan. This is not only for the safety of the live operations staff, the builders, and engineers, but also to ensure that no part of the facility is taken out of service without that process being able to run in a safe manner to protect the works and the environment.

They plan to make their final contractor selection for these works at the back end of 2024 with contract award around March 2025. There will then be 12 months of designing from the contractor with the build starting in 2026. Some works have already started on site as you might have seen. Meetings between senior project managers at TW and SSE (energy provider) have resulted in an earlier date for the additional power supply installation.




