Hi all

We've had an amazing community filled month which has been received so well by everyone.

The library opening was such a joy. So many of us turned out to see it finally opening again after being closed for so long. There were bacon rolls, cake, tea and coffee alongside the Mayor, Deputy Mayor, Councillor Mark Wilson and the chair of the Village Hall Lindsay Pardoe doing the official opening. Inside was story time with the children by a local author, plus games and a raffle for the children to win one of 4 book tokens. The day was blessed with beautiful weather and the sun shining. It was a very good feeling.

The following week, on both Good Friday, and Easter Saturday were Easter Egg Hunts at the Village Hall, and the Sports & Social Club. These were well attended by the community. Some of the photos of a large chick are a sight to behold. Everyone got involved which made for two very lovely events.

We have put the order in for the hanging baskets, but also three large planters. We had to alter our order slightly and so made the decision to have slightly less hanging baskets but add three planters for the Bell Lane area by the shops. These will be quite spectacular when established. The plastic flower towers will be removed soon. The one on the corner of Eton Wick Road and Princes Close will be replaced by three smaller planters (made by a local person) which will be full of flowers when established. We have decided to remove the three flower towers as they are proving very difficult to manage. They need huge amounts of plants to fill them properly, and then rely on people watering them, sometimes daily, if we are lucky enough to have a good summer. For six months of the year they are quite ugly. The three planters on Bell Lane, and those on the corner of Eton Wick Road and Princes Close can be planted up with winter flowers for much less cost. They should be much easier to manage, especially as the company who supply the baskets and planters will water them weekly throughout the summer and maintain them for us.

If anyone would like any part of the plastic tower planters for their garden or allotment then, please do let us know as we will be taking them away in a couple of weeks.

A full list of all those who contributed to the baskets and planters will be in the June newsletter. They are being installed mid-May.

I have been asked by Susan Mayo and Janet Armfield to say a very special community thanks to the person who crochets the post box toppers. I think we are all very grateful to whoever they are to take the time to design, crochet, and put them on the post box. The one to commemorate VE day is particularly brilliant and moving (photo takes pride of place at the top of this newsletter). Thank you from us all.

We are pleased to announce that the Water Restoration Project mentioned in the last newsletter is now underway. Ecologists conducted surveys of the 'baseline habitat' in and around the Roundmoor and Boveney streams. The data they submit will be used by the main contractor when submitting their plans to the Environment Agency later in the project. This will be followed in May by morphology and topographic surveys of both waterways. Residents may see surveyors out on the field taking measurements in this period.

On the last weekend of April, our own volunteers took samples of crustaceans such as freshwater shrimp and more importantly mayfly larvae down by the two bridges on the Boveney. These give us some idea of the current condition of the stream, since they are baseline species (low on the food chain). We also measured nitrate and phosphate levels of the water. All these measurements are recorded and can be used by ecologists to monitor the health of rivers.

The Boveney Stream is already becoming very congested with weed and the level of water is rising. This is entirely predictable, and most unfortunate that Thames Water has not yet acknowledged this inevitability. The rising level of water has nothing to do with output from the treatment works, and unless it rains heavily in the next month, we can assume that it is due to the weed overgrowth. Unfortunately, despite many pleas to the Environment Agency, we are not permitted to clear weed from waterways due to the fish spawning season, which ends on June 15th. We will be exerting pressure on Thames Water to send in a team to clear the Roundmoor and Boveney of excess weed immediately after that date. Our volunteers will also be clearing debris from the Colenorton and Common Ditches from the 15th of June. Meantime we are always on call if residents notice any debris that has fallen into the river and risks blocking the flow. We undertook some branch cutting and log removal over the last weekend of April and informed the landowner of a larger fallen willow on the Boveney that we were unable to remove ourselves.

# A new sport for Eton Wick!



Eton is known for its own unique sports. At the College, there is the Wall Game, Eton Fives and Eton's own version of football. But, for the last 18 months, a new game has landed and is played in our own Eton Wick Sports Hall.

For many, the name Pickleball will mean nothing. In America there are now 13.8 million players, including celebrities and former tennis greats, such as John McEnroe and Andre Agassi. In the UK the sport is being introduced at sports and tennis clubs, with great success.

Pickleball is somewhat of a "cuckoo" sport as it can share badminton court markings. This has helped the sport develop rapidly, as no special courts need to be built. It is played over a net that is 0.86m high, using a ball similar in size to tennis, but made of plastic, with holes in. These holes allow the ball to travel fast, but not very far, making for a great rally-based game. The racquet, or paddle as it is called (not to be confused with Padel, which is another great, but different sport) is, at first glance, like an over-sized table tennis bat.

Pickleball is a great game for players of all ages and, as it is played in doubles, makes it very sociable. Whilst the size of court doesn't allow for much running, you still get a good "sweat on", thanks to the constant involvement of all players.






