Thames Water have informed us that they are sending a team of river experts to identify and remove any weed growth in the Roundmoor and Boveney streams next week, commencing February 3<sup>rd</sup>, and most likely continuing into the following week. It is clear to us that there is little weed growth at this stage, other than the reeds that are encroaching the Boveney at lower Tilstone Close and the upper Roundmoor north of the cattle grid. However, they may also be cutting back overgrown brambles and branches where these are preventing a natural flow, especially around the back of Colenorton Crescent. This should normally be the responsibility of those whose gardens border the river, and which have been allowed to cause a blockage due to neglect. We have asked Thames Water to avoid removal of bankside vegetation so that birds can nest and hide during the breeding season. This is especially important for moorhens as well as spawning fish.

We ask riparian residents to be aware that contractors will be working alongside their gardens and if necessary, report to us, rather than Thames Water, if any of the work causes concern. At the same time, we are all aware that any assistance that we can get to keep the streams running will mitigate to some extent the flooding and pooling of polluted water into our gardens and surrounding fields. We are told by Thames Water that they will review the situation in the spring with a view to the timing of a second cut of weeds. From our own experience, we believe this will be necessary as soon as the closed spawning season ends in mid-June.

## Eton Wick Village Hall

The new trustees have been amazing in taking on the many roles and responsibilities to ensure the smooth running of the village hall. They have been very hands on to save money due to financial constraints. We have a strong maintenance team, who have successfully taken on fire checks, electrical works, Christmas lights, and many other daily maintenance tasks. Our secretary has had an induction of fire with many back-to-back meetings that needed minuting. Another trustee oversees the cleaning, and they have successfully drafted a contract and recruited a local village resident to take on this cleaning role. We now have three people managing the bookings, email, and phone calls.

Our legal expert has been invaluable in negotiations regarding contracts and commercial leases.

We have renegotiated several contracts to ensure best value and are putting together a budget plan to try and rectify the overspend.

All new trustees live in the village and are very keen to reopen the library in Eton Wick. To this end we are prepared to offer it rent free and the key focus of our work this month is to establish the best way this can happen. We have met with Eton Town Council, Councillor Mark Wilson, and Councillor Jack Douglas, and are in the process of formulating an agreement. These meetings have been very positive with considerable support for the reopening of Eton Wick Library.


As soon as we have definite information, we will hold a public meeting at the village hall to make sure that we keep all residents up to date with clear communications.

Our village NHW team continues to grow slowly, and welcome to our newest members. Together we will make a positive difference in our community.




