The Boveney and Roundmoor streams are now flowing as they should, the weed congestion having been largely cleared by Thames Water earlier in the summer. This has resulted in a considerable reduction in the size of the ponding on the common and the water levels on both streams have been much lower than before the clearance. However, there remains an area at the top of the Roundmoor that is still heavily congested with flag irises, willow and reeds. Thames Water are currently seeking to remove this by mechanical means, although we feel that it could be done manually and sooner. We will monitor the progress and report back by October.

The Water Restoration Project mentioned in the last two newsletters is now entering the second phase, during which various methods of improvement to the rivers and the biodiversity around and within them will be considered and modelled by the hydrology team. Data collected from the surveys will be used as part of this modelling.

Meantime there has been a promising development regarding the Moores lane footpath. Slough Borough Council are working with a team from the 'Slough Sponge Project' to model and propose some solutions to mitigate the regular flooding that is experienced by our residents. Cllr Mark Wilson is working closely with Slough Borough Council and will report on progress over the next couple of months. Once some flood mitigation proposals have been devised, we are assured that there will be community engagement with residents of our village to review the proposals.

Our team of volunteers will be carrying out monthly checks on river water quality on both Boveney and Roundmoor streams from this month onwards. The data collected will be submitted to the environment agency and used to hold the water company to account. This is a 'Citizen Science' activity and one which might interest residents of all ages to participate. For example, it could be counted as a volunteering activity for DOE students. We welcome volunteers to come forward for this activity even if you have never done anything like this before. There will be training offered and a safe environment will be ensured.

Eton Wick Football Club Renovations Fundraising

Eton Wick FC has offered grassroots football to Eton Wick village and the surrounding communities for the last 144 years. We were honored with a Centenary Award in 2025, presented by The FA (Football Association) for our dedication to football over the last 100+ years. Over the last few years, we have created a new club committee who are committed to rejuvenating our club. We have introduced a new youth system, offering football to boys and girls who play U8-U12's and a women's team, which run alongside our adult men's team. This year we are excited to introduce a brand new U17's team playing Saturday mornings for Eton Wick FC and in the future we want to offer football to all ages.

However, our changing facilities are old, tired, outdated, broken and not pleasant to use. They include communal showers - which no longer conform to current regulations, nor do they offer any privacy to the adult or youth teams that use them. The WC's are tired and broken, the flooring is coming up due to age and there are holes in the walls. All-in-all they need a huge overhaul to bring them up to date and make them inclusive - but we have very little funds to make this happen.

In order for us to modernise our facilities and offer a clean, safe environment for all teams - we really need your help in raising the necessary funds to make it happen. Any donation, no matter how big or small, would be gratefully received and will have a significant impact.

My name is Terry Adlam, and I have been Chair of Slough Writers for the past 35 years and I have recently moved into the village, and I'm loving it. This move coincided with Slough Writers looking for a new venue to meet in on a Monday evening, after having to leave our recent venue at The Burnham Working Men's Club and I'm so pleased, by lucky coincidence and saving me petrol money, that we have returned to The Skittle Alley at The Greyhound pub – a venue we once used for quite a few years back in the late 90s early 00s.

Established in 1967, Slough Writers is a friendly and supportive group for writers of all abilities, living in the Slough and surrounding areas. We don't teach writing as such, but we do support writers. The Group meets every Monday, from 7.30pm to 9.30pm, for three terms in the year. These roughly coincide with school terms - autumn, spring and summer - each being on average 13-14 weeks long. The meetings are now held in the Greyhound Pub, Eton Wick, with the opportunity for a chat and drink afterwards.

We run a varied programme that involves developing writing skills, critiquing member's' work, in-house competitions, guest speakers, socials and most importantly providing support for all the issues that writers face, from writer's block to getting published. The timetable is scheduled by the committee based on suggestions and topics given by the members. The styles of creative writing we cover ranges from short story writing to article writing, poetry to drama and play writing and beyond!

We offer potential new members two evenings for free to see if it is the type of group they are looking for and then it's a £36 subscription per year. We do not have any particular requirements for joining - apart from you being 18+ and that you enjoy writing in any genre. We always welcome new members, especially from the village.





This September, a team of 8 world-class swimmers will swim the length of Thames in a **non-stop**, **200+km**, **3-day relay**, finishing at the heart of Government in Westminster.
