Hi Eton Wick

Welcome to the May edition of the monthly newsletter. We've had some lovely feedback about it so thank you to everyone who has emailed or messaged us. It has already increased in length due to the amount of information that we think you may like to see. For instance, there are links to the current planning applications in Eton Wick that you can access quickly and have your say on. We have also included links to trade and businesses. As ever, if you would like to include something about your group or business then please do email us.

Before I talk about other things, I'd like to introduce you to the committee. There are four of us altogether. I am the chair of EWVA and have lived in the village for 16 years or so. Helen Branscombe-Davies is the Secretary of EWVA and has lived in the village since 1999. Helen is responsible for putting this newsletter together, the information posts on the Facebook page, updating the website, and loads more which she quietly gets on with. Next is Alison Hill who is the Treasurer of the three community groups, EWVA, Youth Club and the Waterways, and has also lived in the village since 1999. Finally, but responsible for the most visible event, is Janice Caldwell who organises the Christmas lights in December. EWVA would not work without any of them, so whilst I write the Introduction as Chair (and get the lovely emails sent to me), I am very aware that the three of them run the show.

So, what's happening in May?? Please do come along to the community event on Saturday 11th May at the Village Hall between 1-3pm. There will be loads of different groups showing what they do with information on how you can join and get involved. There will also be a plant sale, outside the Village Hall, run by the Allotment Association. Refreshments will be provided.

I mentioned last month that we would be putting out a community wide survey with several questions so you can give us your thoughts and opinions alongside any suggestions you can make for the village. Please look for the link to the survey in the next newsletter. The link will also be on the EWVA Facebook page. We will hand deliver to all properties in Eton Wick, and additional copies will be available in the Pharmacy. Please do take a couple of minutes to complete it. This is your chance to have your say about what is good, and what is not so good in our community.

Finally, you may have seen on the EWVA Facebook page a request to the community to fund hanging baskets for the village centre. If you have been to Eton High Street recently you will have noticed their beautiful hanging baskets. We would like to have a similar scheme in Eton Wick by adding floral baskets to our village centre to add a bit of colour and to promote a feel-good factor. EWVA have the funding for the brackets needed to secure the baskets and we have a company who will look after the baskets through the summer. What we need are further individuals to sponsor individual hanging baskets. We are aiming for eight lampposts with two hanging baskets on each. We already have got funding for 10 baskets and need a further 6 to get to 16. Window Flowers, (the same company that supplies the beautiful baskets in Eton High Street) supply the baskets at £86 each. This includes the hanging of the basket, watering for the season, and disposal in about October. Once paid for there is nothing for us to do but enjoy them. We will also be replanting the flower towers in the village in the next week or so.

'Thames Water sewage floods my garden as dead fish float by – it's disgusting'

Residents of Eton Wick in Berkshire claim that they regularly see dead fish floating along the stream by their back gardens

Eton Wick has featured in several national news stories about the pollution from storm effluent this winter thanks to participation by several residents, the Eton Wick Waterways Group (EWWG) and Cllr Mark Wilson. These have reached the eyes and ears of Thames Water bosses and the Environment Agency

The Environment Agency have enforced the installation of electric fencing to the banks of the Roundmoor north of the cattle grid to prevent further bank erosion by cattle.

Thames Water will be funding two weed cuts by a contractor along the Roundmoor and Boveney this summer in mid-June and late August/early September.



EWWG volunteers will continue to assist residents with specific waterways issues, plus look after the Colenorton and Common Brooks where they border Eton Wick land this summer. Recent volunteer activity has included litter picking along the Thames working with colleagues from the Windsor River Watch group.

Cllr Mark Wilson will be working with Slough Borough Council to provide some sort of walkway for the Asda Footpath this summer if flooding occurs.

The RBWM Council unanimously agreed a motion presented by Mark, calling upon the Leader of the Council to write to Thames Water, The EA and the Secretary of State for Defra to i) ensure the Roundmoor and Boveney streams are suitably maintained this year, ii) improve the infrastructure so that all sewage is contained within the Treatment works and that the streams can be maintained all year round, and iii) ensure that permits are tightened so only fully treated water is ever released into the streams.

EWWG are planning a bid for government 'waterways restoration' funding that, if successful, will lead to works to reduce flooding and bank erosion of the Roundmoor and Boveney over the following two years. This fund is derived from fines paid by Thames Water for pollution incidents.

We need coordinators for each road in the village or we won't be able to get the scheme fully up and operational. The time commitment is minimal following set up.

To try and further promote the scheme, John will be at the forthcoming Community Participation afternoon at the village hall on Saturday 11th May. John would like to meet as many of you as possible, hear your concerns and discuss your observations on the current state of our collective security or just pick up a window sticker to display on your premises to show that an active NHW is now in our village. John will be joined by Valerie Pike the Chair of Windsor and Ascot NHW whose experience will cover questions you might pose that we have not yet been able to.



The Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead (RBWM) and Achieving for Children (AfC) are proposing changes to the School Transport policy. They state that they want the policy to be fair to all residents and schools in the Borough, whilst ensuring transport assistance is still provided to the most vulnerable students.

They are considering the following changes from September 2024 and would like public views on their proposals to change to the way school transport assistance is provided for young people over 16 years of age with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND).
