Date for your diaries - Eton Wick Christmas light switch-on will be Saturday 30 November 2024



This ends the second week that the contractors have been clearing weed from the Boveney on behalf of Thames Water. The weed growth has been much denser this year due to the constant sewage releases in the spring, but their work is showing positive results in the Boveney, where river levels are already down by up to 70 centimetres in places. The Boveney is now flowing faster and gradually lowering the flood levels further upstream. However, full results will only become apparent once the weed has been cleared along the entire length of the Boveney and Roundmoor, which will take another 2-3 weeks.

This is of course only a temporary solution to our annual sewage and flooding problem in Eton Wick, which will only be resolved once sewage is no longer released into our waterways. In the meantime, we are keeping up the pressure on the Environment agency to make an exception to the rules on spawning season in future years, because the high level of nutrients from the sewage treatment works causes excessive weed growth, which in turn causes a blockage upstream and the sewage problem is not going to disappear until major improvements have been forced upon the water company by the government.

If the weed could be cleared six weeks sooner, we would not be subject to the sort of flooding that riparian homeowners have experienced this year. Residents should keep up the pressure on the environment agency, local authorities and parliamentary candidates to resolve the flooding issues sooner, instead of waiting for disaster to strike in the future.



If you're voting at a polling station in the General Election on Thursday 4 July, remember you must show an accepted form of photo ID to polling station staff before they can give you your ballot paper. It's the law.

Polling stations will be open 7am to 10pm, and the Sports Hall in Eton Wick just behind the Village Hall is the polling station for this election.

What ID is accepted?

A wide range of photo ID are accepted, including a UK, European Economic Area (EEA) or Commonwealth passport; a UK or EEA driver's licence; and some concessionary travel passes, such as an older person's bus pass or an Oyster 60+ card. The Resident Advantage Card is not an accepted form of ID for voting.

# May and June - Wildlife crime along the Thames Eton and Windsor

Multiple attacks on wildlife along the River Thames, most notably to swans. This is being conducted mostly it seems by youths using catapults, and the injuries inflicted are serious. TVP are aware of the issues and take such criminal activity incredibly seriously. Please call in and report any sightings of individuals carrying catapults or those who are engaged in such behaviour. In addition, the Central Windsor team are conducting regular patrols in those areas where incidents have occurred in Eton and Windsor to disrupt and deter the behaviour.


