## Eton Wick Waterways Group

Over the last month and especially from mid-February, the waterways around Eton Wick were subject to releases of untreated/partially treated sewage, which were registered on the Thames Water EDM. (Thames Water report known incidents using the EDM map, which can be found here: <https://www.thameswater.co.uk/edm-map>)

This does not mean that the pollution is acceptable, merely that they have reached storage capacity and are releasing partially treated effluent into the river.

Residents of Eton Wick and members of our group have submitted several reports to the Environment Agency (EA) of pollution including a foul smell, dead fish sightings and high levels of suspended grey matter in all of our waterways that are fed by the Slough Water Treatment facility. The more reports that are submitted the more likely it is that a response will follow, so please keep reporting to <https://www.gov.uk/report-environmental-problem>. Photographs and locations are essential.

Reporting to Thames Water (<https://www.thameswater.co.uk/help/water-and-waste-help/pollution>) while still worthwhile in our experience, rarely results in a clean-up operation unless enforced by the environment agency. (Catch 22)

Now that the water has become clearer, we are seeing evidence of a thick layer of sewage fungus/sediment clinging to the bed, plants and banks of all the streams. This should be reported with photographs to the EA as it represents long term damage that affects not only our residents, but also the wildlife within the river. Wildfowl as well as fish are being affected as they depend on eating the plants and invertebrates that are now covered in a toxic sludge. Residents should not enter or allow their animals to enter the streams until this has cleared, which could take months.

The Waterways Group have demanded a visit by an Environment agency specialist to assess the damage caused to the river because these are all main rivers and as such should be protected by the Environment agency and fisheries.




