The Eton Wick Allotment Association is pleased to stage the annual Village Show again this year. This schedule lists the rules and exhibit classes, please keep it for reference. Entrance to view the exhibition is free and it is hoped the whole community will join in the event.

Remember it's just a bit of fun and open to all. Don't be put off thinking "Mine aren't good enough". If you grew it and you're going to eat it, then it's good enough for the show!

PLEASE NOTE: All classes are open to all Eton Wick, Eton and Dorney residents to exhibit garden or allotment produce and/or flowers, plus home-made culinary or art & craft items.

Timetable:

Exhibit registration between 9.30am and 11.45am

Exhibitors will be excluded at 11.45am

Exhibitors to pay one-off £1 registration fee - junior exhibitors exempt

Judging starts at 12.15pm

2.30pm - 4pm Free entrance to view exhibits & award the winners

Light refreshments will be available during the show

Exhibits can only be removed from the Hall following the presentations

Show Rules

1. All classes are open to Eton Wick Allotment Holders and all Eton
2. Wick, Eton and Dorney residents.
3. Junior entries (Classes J1 - J3 inclusive) are open to the children or grandchildren of Eton, Dorney and Eton Wick residents & Eton Wick School pupils only.
4. Exhibits must be staged before 11.45am. SORRY NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED!
5. No one may enter more than one exhibit in any one class.
6. Only one exhibitor's name per exhibit card (not couples or teams).
7. NO EXHIBIT MUST BE REMOVED UNTIL COMPLETION OF THE PRESENTATIONS. Any exhibits not collected will be disposed of.
8. The judges may withhold prizes if the specimens are not worthy, and in all cases their decision will be final. Should entries in any class not total three the judges will be at liberty to withhold any prize.
9. Objections must be lodged with the Show Manager before the presentation of the awards.
10. The show organisers will take ordinary care of exhibits but will not be responsible for loss or damage.
11. For any disputes arising, the Show Manager's decision is final.

The RHS Showing Standards will apply.

Number of items per Class as per schedule below:

Vegetables - (Personally Grown Only)

Class

1. Beans, Runner, 6pods)
2. Bean, Runner, 1, Longest) Display with up to ½" of stalk (13mm)
3. Beans, Dwarf, 6pods)
4. Beetroot, any variety, 3 - tops cut to 3" (7.5cm) and tied individually
5. Carrots, 1 bunch, 3 of one variety - tops cut to approx 1" (2.5cm)
6. Onions, 3, up to 3" (7.5cm)
7. Onions, 3, over 3" (7.5cm)
8. Potatoes, 4 of one variety
9. Shallots, pickling size - 6 separate (less than 1") (2.5cm)

10. Shallots, exhibition, 6
11. Tomatoes, 6 - with calyx intact
12. Tomatoes, 6 cherry - with calyx intact
13. Cucumber, 1 of any variety
14. Marrow (pair)
15. Courgettes, 3
16. Peppers, 3
17. Lettuce, 1, any variety displayed in clean flowerpot. (Could include small jar in flowerpot for lettuce roots).
18. Cabbage, 1, any variety
19. Squash, 1, any variety
20. Leeks, 3 - with trimmed tops
21. Parsnips, 3 - tops cut to approximately 3" (7.5cm)
22. Swede, 1, any variety - with tops cut to at least 3" (7.5cm)
23. 1 Vegetable not already specified
24. 1 Ugly veg !! i.e. misshaped; rude or funny

Fruit - (Personally Grown only)

Class

25. Raspberries, 12 fruit with Calyx
26. Soft Fruit, 12 of a kind (other than Raspberries)
27. Apples - Eaters, 3
28. Apples - Cookers, 3
29. Pears, 3
30. Plums, 3
31. Collection of at least 3 kinds of fruit in container less than 12" (30cm) overall

Garden Produce/Flowers - (Personally Grown only)

Class

32. Culinary Herbs, at least 4 varieties in any container / jug or vase
33. Dahlias - 5 blooms in one vase/container.
34. Roses 3 stems - any variety
35. Assorted - 5 blooms any variety, can be mixed
36. Miniature fresh floral arrangement up to 12.5cm (approx 5") overall
37. Arrangement of fresh garden material in any container - up to 51cm wide (approx 20) (flowers or foliage must be personally grown).
38. Houseplant ~ not previously entered

Please ensure your flower arrangements are kept to the given measurements, otherwise this will lose you points

Home Made Culinary Items

39. Jar of Raspberry Jam
40. Jar of Strawberry Jam
41. Jar of any variety other than above i.e. Summer Berries, Plum etc.
42. Jar of Jelly - any variety i.e. Bramble
43. Jar of Chutney
44. Jar of Pickles
45. Light Fruit Cake - un iced - to your own recipe; size and shape
46. Victoria Sponge 8" (20cm) un iced/sandwiched together with jam only (8oz mixture only)

47. 4 cup cakes - decorated

48. 4 Flapjack Fingers

Please note class 39 - 44 requirements: 1lb jars (approx. 454 grams) clearly labelled and with clean lids and/or fabric tops and, where applicable, wax discs.

Arts and Crafts - 1 entry per class

49. Knitted or Crochet items**

50. Needlework/Sewing/Embroidery**

51. Crafts - Wood Turning / Carving / Pottery etc.**

52. Models - any materials**

53. Painting (Oils, water colours)**

54. Drawing/Sketching (pencil, charcoal, crayon etc.)**

55. Photography - Maximum size A4 - without frames or mounts**

Junior Exhibits - Age 16 and under

J1. A vegetable animal

J2. Hobby /Handicraft - i.e. needlework, knitting, metalwork, woodwork, Lego, models etc.**

J3. Design a birthday card - A4 size card/paper folded in half**

Please ensure your exhibits are kept to the given measurements, otherwise you will lose points
