ETON WICK WATERWAYS GROUP UPDATE - APRIL 2025

We are pleased to announce that we have been successful with our bid to the Rural Payments Agency (RPA) to fund the development stage for restoration of the Roundmoor and Boveney streams. The money for this fund comes from fines charged by OFWATT to Thames Water for unlicensed sewage spills in the previous years.

This will be a development project, mostly carried out by specialist contractors Cain Bio-Engineering and an ecology team.

The initial work will involve surveys, which will complement the data already obtained in the 2021-22 report. This in turn will lead to alternative proposals for the improvement to conveyance of both the Roundmoor and Boveney waterways and the impact on streams connected to them. Any designs that are proposed will be shared with the community. The contractor will also work with the environment agency and land agents to ensure that any proposals are acceptable to them. Once agreed upon, the relevant permissions will be sought and paid for from the funds made available from the RPA, and funding will be sought for the full delivery of the project.

At the same time, we have learnt more about the progress of the Slough sewage treatment upgrade, which will start later this year and is due to complete by 2029/30. The plans for this project will be shared with the village by Thames Water at a future community forum. We trust that the Slough treatment works improvement project, once completed, will deliver a significant reduction in pollutants plus increase storage capacity of untreated sewage at times of severe rainfall, with the aim of preventing any further pollution once works are complete.

Meantime we have the assurance of Thames Water that until the completion of their improvements, they will assist us by carrying out two cuts of the overgrown weeds annually. For this season they have agreed to monitor the river levels and weed proliferation during spring and inform us of the dates of their first intended cut of the summer, which will fall after June 15th (spawning season end).

The overall aim of the restoration project is to repair and prepare our streams and their wildlife for a better future, once the Slough Treatment improvement works are completed.

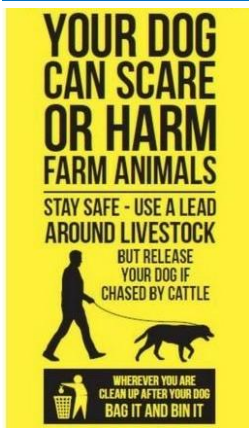
