And There Shall Be - FAMINES

Many centuries ago the greatest prophet who ever lived, Jesus Christ, the Son of God, described in great detail the most critical period in all of man's existence. He was referring to events immediately preceding the end, or consummation of this present era of human history. His answer came in response to His disciples question, "Tell us, when shall these things be? and what shall be the sign of thy coming and of the end of the world," or as another version translates it, "The end of the age." Matthew 24:3.

Jesus spoke of several major events that would signal the beginning of this troubled period. After He mentioned false prophets and wars, came a third significant indication, "... and there shall be famines ..." Matthew 24:7.

The Black Horse of the Apocalypse: In Revelation 6:1-8 we read of John's vision of the four horsemen. Each of these is a symbol of the judgments that will be inflicted upon rebellious humanity in the not-too-distant future! This message is one of the most frightening in all of the Bible. Christians need to be informed and prepared for what lies ahead.

Past Famines: Historical famines are, by definition, "cyclical famines," meaning that they are caused by unusual weather conditions, plagues, animal or insect infestation or a similar interruption of normal cycles. These cyclical famines are far different from the "structural famines", which the bulk of mankind is experiencing today.

Even righteous Abraham suffered temporarily from such cyclical famines (Gen. 12:10). When Canaan's rains failed, he went to Egypt for food. In the days of his great-grandson, Joseph, the rains and rivers everywhere failed for seven years, "... and the famine was over all the face of the earth." (Gen. 41:56).

The historical books of the Bible speak frequently of "a famine in the days of David", "a sore famine in Samaria", or a "great famine was throughout the land". (II Sam. 21:1; I Kings 18:2; Luke 4:25). One very graphic incident is described in II Kings 6:25-29: "There was a great

famine in Samaria: and, behold, they besieged it, until an ass's head was sold for fourscore pieces of silver (about \$50), and the fourth part of a cab (a pint) of dove's dung for five pieces of silver (about \$3)."

Famines in the Dark Ages: Between A.D. 1050 and 1350, severe famines struck all known lands, becoming especially severe in Egypt around A.D. 1065 and 1200, England around A.D. 1314, and all of Europe during the "Black Death" of the 1350's.

Around 1065, the combined ravages of war and drought caused a famine in Egypt which must have rivaled in severity the seven-year famine under Joseph, approximately 2800 years previous. During the famine of 1065, a single cake of bread sold for about \$40 (modern equivalent), eggs, \$30 a dozen, and a bushel of grain for more than \$50.

The desperate Egyptians even resorted to cannibalism. Butchers of men actually "fished" for their victims. Shrieking victims were "hooked" and cooked, then sold on the open market.

In England under Edward II, a great famine struck in 1314. Food was so scarce that even the king had a hard time securing food for his table. Men ate dogs, horses, cats, and human babies as well. Thieves and cannibals were arrested, but when a new criminal was thrown into jail, he was quickly seized upon by the starving inmates and literally torn to pieces for food.

Famines since 1845: In 1845, the entire potato crop in Ireland rotted from an unexpected blight. Ireland was as dependent on potatoes as many Asian nations are now dependent on rice as a main staple of life. The hunger was so severe that the death toll in Ireland was between 200,000 and 300,000. A great number emigrated to England and America, thousands died on board the emigrant ships. Ireland, a great nation of 8.3 million people in 1845, lost 2 million people to death and emigration in just five years. Even today Ireland has but one half of her peak population of 1845.

China is another land in which periodic famines strike unexpectedly, with severe famines in 1906 and 1911. Russia has also suffered much from famines in recent history. The warcaused famine in Leningrad killed more people by starvation than the United States has lost in all its wars.

Ominous Weather Patterns: There's been a change in the weather — and from all indications it may hinder man's efforts to feed earth's hungry billions. Over the last few decades, climatologists have noticed a marked cooling trend emerging from their masses of meteorological data. Temperatures peaked around 1945 and have been dropping ever since.

Some scientists now suspect that the earth may be on the way back to a "mini ice age" like the one that lasted from the late Middle Ages until the beginning of this century. The signs of this advancing global cold front are widespread. In 1972 and 1975, cooler weather was the major culprit behind the Soviet Union's devastating crop failures. Growing pack ice around Iceland has made life more difficult for local fishermen. England has lost nine days from her growing season since the early 1950's. And during the winter of 1971-1972, scientists noted a 12% increase in the size of the Arctic

This cooling of the earth's climate has also prevented moisture-laden equatorial air from reaching the badly parched African Sub-Sahara region. The extended drought that followed was responsible for the massive famines which began there in the early 1970's, and which still continue.

Following are some quotes from this article: "One out of every eight people on earth is hungry most of the time. In many countries, up to 40% of the population is malnourished. Between 1957 and 1976, developing-world imports of military goods grew from \$5.4 billion to \$9.3 billion (in constant dollars). In the developing world, there exists one soldier for every 250 people, but just one doctor for each 3,700. Sixteen percent of the world's children are malnourished. Over 600 million people live on incomes of less than \$50 per year. Even under conditions of rapid economic growth, 470 million people Continued on Page 2

It seemed that a combination of run-away inflation of prices, fear, reduced incomes, unemployment and the general instability of our economy made necessary a readjustment of our fiscal policies. I believe, though, that a careful re-appraisal of our present situation and additional prayer effort as well as strong faith in God will make further retrenchment unnecessary.

The work of God must continue to expand and be able to face any new challenge that comes our way. The rededication of the church of Jesus Christ to a yet unfulfilled ministry will help us to hold fast to the unchanging hand of God and make us sufficient for any test

or trial.

Many have written or asked us concerning our local radio broadcast. As you may know, we were on the same station five mornings each week for approximately twenty-eight years. However, we tried to carry on with greatly reduced income for approximately another two years, but with very limited success since the economy was against us and we had lost most of our faithful listening audience. So, the inevitable happened, several months ago after about 30 years of broadcasting over this station and in the face of constantly mounting deficits, we reluctantly gave notice that we must terminate. So that is the whole story. We are now reaching out in other directions to carry out the great commission. We will endeavor to keep informed our many friends who have faithfully stood with us these many years. Do let us continue to hear from you. We will be going forward through the medium of the printed page to carry the Good News to the ends of the earth.

This too is good news. There is a quickening of Gospel tempo throughout the world. If you have your finger on the pulse of revival today, you will rejoice with us. will be living in absolute poverty in the year 2000. More than three-quarters of the world's inadequately nourished people live on the Indian subcontinent, in Southeast Asia, and in sub-Saharan Africa. More than half the children around the world are afflicted by hunger and malnutrition and the many diseases that result.

Education

Many Americans today are asking the question, "What has happened to our youth?" They are referring, of course, to the great number of American youth who smoke marijuana, take drugs such as heroin and LSD, indulge themselves freely in promiscuous sex, and are actively engaged in the Communist revolution to overthrow the government of the United States and to bring in a Socialistic, anit-Christ slave state. The terms: honesty, hard work, morality, rugged individualism and character mean nothing to many of them. They are disobedient to parents and have no regard for law and order. They show no appreciation whatsoever for this wonderful land of America which they have inherited through the blood, sweat and tears of millions of fine Americans who carved this mighty Empire out of a wilderness, to say nothing of the millions of faithful Americans who fought and gave their very lives to preserve the freedom of this great Republic.

Now, what has caused youth to take this attitude? How has this unfortunate condition come about? Because the curricula of the educational system is no longer based upon the knowledge and wisdom of the Bible which is the Word of God. Abraham Lincoln said, "The philosophy of the classroom today is the philosophy of government tomorrow." George Washington said, "True religion affords government its surest support. The future of this nation depends upon the Christian training of the youth. It is impossible to govern without the Bible." America heeded George Washington's words of wisdom for about 150 years, and then swapped the successful Bible-based educational curricula for the modern insanity known as the John Dewey inspired so-called "Progressive Education"

Now, what was Dewey's philosophy and what is this so-called "Progressive Education"? Dewey was an agnostic, a materialist, and a socialist who taught that there are no absolutes. Dewey held that all truth is relative, and that standards are constantly changing as philosophers question their validity. In other words, he believed in situation ethics. Dewey taught that the acquisition of knowledge and information is actually quite unimportant. He said, "Not knowledge or information, but rather self-realization is the goal."

Now, that's a good one. That is a most profound statement coming from him — self-realization. If one is not a born again Christian, how can one possibly understand self-realization? And Dewey was an agnostic. Dewey taught that a child should study only those subjects in which he was interested; that one subject was not more important than another subject. Dewey emphasized the "life adjustment" program by which the individual adjusts to the society in which he lives. What if society itself needs adjustment? As Shakespeare's Prince Hamlet would exclaim, "Ah, there's the rub!" Now, that is the goal of education as far as Dewey is concerned. He feels that everyday experiences teach children far more than an organized curriculum which lays stress on the acquisition of knowledge and information.

Liquor And Our Youth

ATLANTA (UPI) — Three out of four college freshmen are regular drinkers and the most effective way to curb the problem is to educate young people about the hazards of alcohol, Georgia Tech's dean of students says.

Dean James Dull told a Senate committee Wednesday that "something good is coming out of all the attention given the anti-cigarette campaign," and a similar effort to make drinking seem less attractive probably would be as effective.

Dull told the Senate select committee on the drinking age that "three out of four" college freshmen — some of them only 17 years old — are regular drinkers. He said Tech does not have many alcoholic students, but that the institute's clinic sees about three students a week who have been injured while drunk.

"The college is getting three out of four students who are already drinking when they come to college," said Dull. "I'm talking about brand, spanking new freshmen — 17 years old, some of them."

Sen. Joe Thompson, D-Smyrna, the committee chairman, plans to introduce a bill next year to raise Georgia's legal drinking age from 19 to 21. Thompson sponsored the bill that raised the age from 18 to 19.

When Georgia lowered its drinking age from 21 to 18 eight years ago, "it was one of the poorer things that happened" to the state's young people, Dull said.

He said there has been a "trickledown effect" with young adults buying booze for their juvenile friend.

"With this kind of "trickle-down effect," what used to be happening at 18, 19 and 20 is now happening at 16, 17 and 18," said Dull.

Dull said raising the drinking age back to 21 "might favor the stumbling block theory — that is, alcohol would become harder to get, the more stumbling blocks you put in the way of purchasing it."

But he said the long-term solution lies in educating the young people about the hazards of drinking.

"The real answer is to do what they did with cigarettes," he said. "We need an educational program to change their thinking about this thing."

He said 60 percent of the freshmen smoked cigarettes in 1960 but the figure fell to 20 percent 10 years later, due to the government's anti-smoking campaign following the 1963 surgeon general's report linking tobacco to lung cancer and other diseases. By 1980, Dull said, the percentage of freshmen who smoked had fallen to 9 percent.

Haven of Hope In Hollywood

Bob walked out of a children's home in St. Louis, Mo. on the day President Reagan was shot. He walked all day. He was on his way to Hollywood to become a star. When he got here, at age 16, he saw the porno theaters, the hookers, the young boys like himself standing on street corners, waiting to be picked up.

"I wasn't going to do that," he said. He wasn't going to do that, until he got

hungry enough.

Cindy, a good-natured redhead, checked out of a "mental health place" near her home outside of Huntsville, Ala. at age 19 and made her way to California. "I wanted to be a star. I think I'm a comedian," she said. Cindy spent the last four years as a prostitute.

Scott was 15 when his parents kicked him out of their house in Louisville, Ohio last June. He went to Texas where he got a job in construction through some friends, "But they were into alcohol and drugs and I was getting high every night," he said. So he came to California, but couldn't find a job. A man who later turned out to be an ex-con picked him up off the street, fed him, bought him clothes, made passes at him, and then threatened his life when he refused to go to Phoenix,

Bonita decided that 19 years in Watertown, S.D. was enough. She and a girlfriend started hitchhiking to Denver. They met some guys, split up "so we could get rides easier," and she never saw her friend again. The boy she was hitchhiking with disappeared one night while she slept and she hitched rides to California on her own. Bonita was lucky. The last man who gave her a ride helped her find Centrum.

It is an organization right in the middle of Hollywood — the dirty, dangerous, drug pushing, sexually abusing, lost-dream Hollywood.

It was begun in 1977 by Kleg Seth, 39, who was himself drawn to Hollywood with the desire of making an impact, a Christian impact, on what he calls "Hollywood's delusion," the image that all your dreams will come true if you can get to this Land of Oz.

"My only claim to fame is that I was casting director for "The Cross and the Switchblade," a Christian film set in New York City," said Seth.

But with the help of major churches and foundations, and juvenile court judges who refer runaways to Centrum, Seth has established three houses just off Hollywood Boulevard where young men and women who find themselves lost, abused, afraid and hungry can find emergency shelter.

Centrum also took over the Lifeline 24-hour emergency phone that had been run for years by the Hollywood Presbyterian Church.

Centrums's safe houses are for males and females under 35. But no one is turned away in an emergency. If Centrum can't help, they find someone who can.

Seth's duties include transporting sick transients to hospitals, getting

bauchery as a way of life, and nihilism as a goal.

If our youth are to be saved, if America is to be saved, the educational system must return to a curricula which is based on the knowledge and wisdom of the Word of God - the Bible. God promises to save us and and heal our land IF we meet His conditions. Now,

runaways to the airport to go home, temporarily hiding young prostitutes from their pimps or battered wives from their husbands.

"They can stay for a few days or a few months," said Seth, "but there's no coming and going. Our purpose is to expose them to a strong Christian environment. We try to shut out the outside world while they're here."

Bonita described her life in the women's house: "We read Christian books, listen to Christian music, watch Christian TV, study the Bible, pray, and clean the house."

Does she thinks she's being brainwashed? "I'm getting my brain cleaned," she said.

"No one joins Centrum, except the staff of 12 who live in the houses and take care of the people," said Seth. "We don't want people to stay here. We endeavor to get them moving, but in a direction where they're not going to go

back and get into trouble.'

"We don't do anything on our own. We always contact the parents," said Don Noonan, 40, ex-convict who runs one of the men's houses. "Young people today are looking for honesty and sincerity," he said. "Truth is in the gospel and they're ready to accept that. They've found out everything else doesn't work. I've been where they are, the penitentiary, drugs. A picture of what Christ can do to change their lives is standing in front of them."

"Some of them, within 24 hours, come to an understanding of what it means to have a relationship with God," said Seth. The steady diet of Bible studies, prayers, Christian songs and movies may be one reason. But Seth says the main reason "is the love and concern they see on the part of the staff. We have rules and discipline and they can see the people here care about them."

Many of those who come to Centrum hear about it on the street, from evangelists, juvenile court attorneys, the police, or the telephone company, which has a list of emergency shelters.

"We need to be more effective in reaching the lost before the pimps, exploiters, pushers or religious deceivers draw more young people through their doors with offers of shelter and food, only to enslave them," said Seth.

Anyone can get into a Centrum house, "if they're in trouble and sincere about wanting to get their life together," he said. "We want to open them up to considering that there is a God who loves them, and that they can have a new life. Many of them have no concept of a loving God; they've never been loved by anyone."

"I was standing at a bus stop and I saw a car go by with a sign on it that said, 'Jesus loves you, no matter what," said Cindy. "I thought, 'Oh sure." But she saw one of the flyers Seth had left on the street, listing the Centrum number. "After I'd been here about a week, I decided I really want to commit my life to what God wants me to do. He's healed a lot of the hurts."

How Close is America's Judgement?

The following news item was run in newspapers across America a few months ago.

Martin Container Service (a garbage removal company) of Wilmington, California, was instructed to remove a 20-foot-long container from the Medical Analytic Laboratory, Inc.

Here is what it contained: Medical waste and hundreds of fetuses, some more than five months developed with expressions on their faces. The fetuses, pathological lab specimens, cancerous growths and confidential records of patients from San Francisco, Sacramento and Missouri were stacked eight feet high in the metal container. According to the San Pedro, California, New-Pilot, patient names were printed on the plastic jars containing the fetuses, which were preserved in formaldehyde.

The large fetuses, weighing more than three pounds, were in one-gallon, ice-cream-type containers. The smaller ones were in jars marked dentures.

What does the Bible have to say about this type of loose morality (legalized abortions) that permeates today's society?

God made a covenant with Abram and promised his descendants the land that the Canaanites possessed (Genesis 15:18-21).

Why would God take away a land (present-day Israel) from one group of people and give it to another group?

The answer is simple. God took the land from the Canaanites because of their abominable sins (Lev. 18). God was so wroth with these people that He even commanded their destruction (Ex. 23) and swore that never a person of this type character will ever dwell in the future house of the Lord (Zech. 14:21).

Here the inhabitants held their religious festivals. Great numbers of jars containing the remains of children were found under

the debris. The whole area proved to be a cemetery for newborn babies.

Imagine that, civilized Americans partaking of the same sins (legalized abortions) that triggered the Canaanites destruction!

"That which hath been is now; and that which is to be hath already been" (Eccl. 3:15).

Wake up America! God has destroyed nations for your same sins and He will do it again.

Israelis in Lebanon

No surprise. The Bible predicted over 2,500 years prior, that Israel will eventually possess Lebanon.

Israel invaded Lebanon June 6, 1982, with the announced aim of pushing PLO guerrillas 25 miles north of the border to keep their artillery out of range of Israeli civilians in Galilee. The Israeli leadership says their intent is not to occupy any Lebanese territory.

But, Jeremiah 30:3 not only predicts that the Jews will repossess the land of Israel in the last days (as they have in this century), but it also predicts they will possess the same land their fathers (Abraham, Moses, Joshua, David, etc.) possessed. This land includes Lebanon. It was desired by Moses (Duet. 3:25), and assigned to Israel as her northern border (Duet. 1:7, Josh. 11:16-17 and 12:7), although not all of it according to Judges 3:1-3.

At this writing, Israel is holding the southern section. Intense pressure will surely be applied by the nations of the world for a quick Israeli withdrawal. This may or may not occur at this time. However, the Bible is plain. Ultimately, either now or in the near future, Israel must fulfill the Prophetic Word by not only occupying, but reclaiming most of Lebanon. "For verily I say unto you, Till heaven and earth pass, one jot or one tittle shall in no wise pass from the law, till all be fulfilled" (Matthew 5:18).

Suicide Rate Among Jail Inmates

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The suicide rate among the nation's 200,000 jail inmates is 16 times greater than in a city of comparable size, a study commissioned by the Justice Department said today.

Coincidentally, the study was released four days after John W. Hinckley Jr., accused of trying to assassinate President Reagan, failed in a second attempt to take his own life while in prison awaiting trial.

The study, undertaken by the National Center on Institutions and Alternatives, said there were 419 suicides in 1979 in county and local jails. In cities of 200,000 people, the study said, suicides average one about every two weeks.

The study said the profile of the typical jail suicide is a 22-year-old white single male who has been arrested on a Saturday night for drugs or alcohol.

Further, it said, the typical suicide has no significant history of prior arrests, has been placed in isolation for his own protection, and would have hanged himself with bed clothing within three hours after arrest.

Other findings from the report:

- Nearly 75 percent of suicide victims were charged with non-violent crimes. Drug and alcohol charges accounted for more than 30 percent.
- Two out of three inmates were in isolation at the time of their suicide.
- Fewer than 4 percent of the victims were women.
- More than half the suicides were committed within 24 hours of arrest
 27 percent in the first three hours.
- California and New York had the most inmate suicides 43 and 27, respectively.

— No inmate suicides were reported in Arizona and Maine.

WE WERE THERE

I suppose that most of us have at sometime or another indulged in what we considered to be wishful thinking concerning a journey to some far off place in this interesting world of ours. I guess I, too, have been guilty of such; for many times I had thought how nice it would be to visit the lands of the Bible and to walk at least once where Jesus walked and performed so many of His miracles.

I really had no plans for such a trip, but just a few times desired to be there. Then one day there came to "Old Pisgah" in Los Angeles a group from the Mount Zion Fellowship, in Jerusalem. These young people were from a church in Richmond, Virginia, which also had a camp near Ashland, Virginia. Sisters Ruth Heflin and Susan Woodaman and the others encouraged us to come to Israel and visit their work there.

It seemed that God was with us in the acceptance of their kind invitation, for at once the Lord began to provide the means for such a journey. We noted that this year the Jewish Passover celebration came at the same time as the Christian memorial of the death, burial and resurrection of our Lord. We thought how wonderful it would be to celebrate them together in Jerusalem.

It seemed now that the days hurried by and it was no time until provision had been made to care for the Christ Faith Mission, Herald of Hope ministry at "Old Pisgah" here in Los Angeles, and my wife, Sarah, and I and Tom Coleman, one of our faithful workers, were on a Delta Airlines jet on the first leg of our journey to the Holy Land. We stopped for a few days at our Pisgah prayer community near Pikeville, Tennessee, and then an overnight flight from Chattanooga, and Atlanta, Georgia to Frankfort, Germany, where connection was made with an El Al plane to Tel Aviv. From the airport it was about one hours journey by Sherout (an Israeli jitney) to Jerusalem, where at the Mount Zion Fellowship we received a royal wel-

Our friends lost no time in acquainting us with various points of interest in and around Jerusalem. Many times we visited the Mount of Olives which lay across the Kidron Valley to the east, where Tom was given residence and where some of the daytime meetings and Bible studies were held. My wife and I stayed at an apartment next door to the Halcyon House (where most of the daytime prayer and night services were conducted.) On Friday, Saturday and Sunday nights the regular meetings were at St. Peter en Gallicantu (the Church of the Cock Crowing). This Franciscan Cathedral on Mt. Zion was made available to the Fellowship for several years until re-

Jerusalem is so filled with sights of historical interest that time and space in this publication would not permit more than a brief mention of many of them. We visited King David's Tomb, the Upper Room, the Garden Tomb, the Wailing Wall, The Way of the Cross, etc. We passed through various gates of the Old Walled City. In the City of David, a number of important archeological digs are now in progress.

We made two trips from Jerusalem to Bethlehem which gave us a little more time to see the main points of interest, which included the Church of the Nativity. The last time we visited there some kind of a community celebration was in progress, and we were in the downtown plaza when all the church bells began to ring. It certainly was a bedlam of sound, but something I am glad I did not miss. Of course, we visited Herodian- the site of the castle and desert outpost of King Herod. From its great height in the wilderness of Judea he could see the road to Bethlehem as well as the approaches to Jerusalem beyond. It is said that after killing the children of Bethlehem as he endeavored to destroy the baby Jesus, this wicked King Herod became mentally affected, thinking that everyone was trying to kill him. Legend has it that he even murdered his own two sons for fear that they would some day take the kingdom from him.

On this same trip into the wilderness area as we traveled toward the Dead Sea, we stopped at the ruins of a community of the Essenes. This religious group had fled from the Roman legions to escape certain death. In the nearby area many scrolls have been found hidden in caves, which give further insight concerning life in this

troubled period.

As we traveled up the Jordan valley we stopped briefly at the ruins of Jericho, this city which was destroyed by the Lord when Israel first made their entry into the promised land after their escape from Egypt and their wilderness wanderings. Further up the Jordan valley we saw many irrigated fields and collective farms where Israel is now living off the land once more. We continued north to the sea of Galilee, a beautiful place indeed. We came into this area in the last part of the barley harvest and we remembered well the Bible story of Naomi, Ruth and Boaz. In fact, scripture came alive to us every day as we saw new things.

We spent a night in Tiberias at one of the faith homes of the Mount Zion Fellowship. As this home was on the hillside above the Sea of Galilee, we remember that we could look across the sea toward the mountains of Moab and see the Golon Heights area of Israel and the lights of nine different Kibutz' (collective farms) which the Israelis had opened in that desolate mountain region after its take-over by the Israeli army. Our young driver took us to the top of Mt. Tabor (a dangerous drive indeed with narrow road and many switch-backs). Here we prayed in the Church of the Transfiguration on the part of the mountain where it is thought that Jesus prayed with His disciples, and Moses and Elijah came and talked to Him. (Matt. 17:1 and Mark 9:1-8). From these lofty heights we looked out on the valley of Megiddio where the last great battle will soon take place.

We visited Nazareth and the seaport of Caesarea. We stood before the ruins of the temple in Capernaum and remembered the words of Jesus spoken against this city: "Thou art exalted to Heaven, thou shalt be cast down to hell." (Mark 11:23 and Luke 10:15) Today there is not city there, just a fenced-in ruins; a tourist attraction.

First hand knowledge of the Bible Lands takes on new significance as we near the time of the end, and the spotlight of Bible prophecy begins to clearly show us the things which are soon to take place. Let us search the scrip-

World's Largest Biblical Library

New York, — The American Bible Society, possessor of the world's largest collection of Bibles and related Biblical documents reports that at the end of 1980 the library contained nearly 39,500 volumes in 1,615 languages. Dr. Ivan Nothdurft, an officer of the Society, said this represented an increase of 24 new languages in the Scripture collection, some with such exotic names as Mixteco and Silacayoapan, Pangutaran and Samo-Kubo. "The new languages indicate that God's Word is being made available to more people everywhere, and that we fully intend to carry out the Biblical mandate to carry the Good News via the medium of Scriptures to the four corners of the earth," said Miss Alice Ball, an ABS general sec-

Recent figures reveal, however, that more than 80 million people representing 2000 languages and dialects still do not have at least one Portion of Scripture available to them in their own languages. Miss Ball noted that the library contains more than 6,600 reference volumes available to scholars for translation work, adding, that the work of translation is now going on in more than 750 countries of the world.

"We are urgently trying to meet a deadline to translate and publish Scriptures for New Readers in all of the major languages by 1985, including a full range of Portions (one complete book of the Bible) and Selections. This will enable the readers to move toward the use of common language translations," she said.

The United Bible Societies, the worldwide fellowship of autonomous Bible Societies of which ABS is a member, is exploring the potential for communicating the Biblical message through nonprint media and developing appropriate Scripture materials. "We want to assist the reader to understand the meaning of the Biblical text by including helps in all Scripture publications, especially introductions in Portions and Selections, while at the same time avoiding notes or comments of a doctrinal nature," she said.

It was noted that nearly 1,000 microfiche items had been added to the reference collection making it easier for scholars to draw upon the extensive ABS archives. Other figures revealed that last year nearly 5,000 visitors passed through the Society's library from 41 states and 51 countries and were able to see the fragments and copies of the Dead Sea Scrolls and facsimile of the Washburn Bible.

The American Bible Society was founded in 1816 by a group of distinguished clergymen, statesmen, busi-

nessmen and educators in New York City. From the outset it was intended as a laymen's organization, and it has remained that to this day. ABS is a servant of all churches, denominations and agencies and is not in itself a church. It provides the Scriptures that churches throughout the world need for their preaching, teaching and witnessing ministries. It does not itself attempt to interpret or teach the Word

Over three billion copies of the Word have been distributed by the American Bible Society since 1816, and that includes Bibles, Testaments, Portions and Selections. In one recent year (1979), ABS was responsible for the distribution of 109 million copies in the United States and 150 million overseas. The Society relies heavily on dedicated voluntary workers in the U.S. and other countries.

'Dr. Elias P. Boudinot — a former President of the Continental Congress, and chief architect of the new venture (when it was first formed) — was elected the Society's first president. One of its early vice presidents, John Quincy Adams, was a former President of the United States. John Jay, the nation's first Chief Justice, was the Society's second president.

Scriptures are both given free and sold. It has always been a belief of the American Bible Society that if the Scriptures are to be fully appreciated, some investment should be made in their purchase based on the need and the ability to pay, no matter how small. And so a small price is asked, a price that is never above what it costs to produce and distribute these Scriptures. No profit is made; on the contrary, large subsidies are required, and the source of these is the contributions of individuals, churches and other institutions. These subsidies are because there are hundreds of millions of people in the world who cannot afford even these modest asking prices. The average wage earner is some 80 different countries earns less than a dollar a day, and that must go to feed hungry mouths, and clothe and shelter the family. It leaves little or nothing, even for something as important as the spiritual "food" of God's Word. Such people are given Scriptures free.

The American Bible Society distributes Scriptures in between 400 and 500 different languages, and also supplies to the Armed Forces. In 1835 the first Scriptures for the blind were made possible. These days, people with impaired vision can also get the Word in large print, on cassettes, tapes and records. Then too, there are Selections designed especially for the sick and other shut-ins, for urban, counseling and other outreach ministries.
