Deer, turkey, bear harvests up from last year

espite very odd weather during much of the fall hunting season, deer harvests were up from the 2014-15 season according to newly released data from the Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries.

This will come as no surprise to hunters, who reported a total of 209,197 deer harvested during the 2015-16 season, compared to 192,197 the previous year.

While the 2014-15 season was plagued with a serious outbreak of hemorrhagic disease, which coupled with a bumper mast crop across the state, led to very poor hunting, hunters had it much better this past

"It was a quiet year for HD, and we had an average mast crop," said Matt Knox, deer project leader for the VDGIF.

Still, this year's harvest marked the secondlowest total since 2001, with record harvest numbers occurring during the 2007-2009 seasons.

Harvest numbers have been stabilizing or declining for much of the last

said.

The department's primary deer management effort over the last decade was to increase the female deer kill over much of the state in an effort to reduce and stabilize the deer herd. That appears to be happening.

Archers (not including crossbow hunters) accounted for 15,078 deer (7 percent of the harvest), crossbow hunters 11,719 (6 percent of the harvest), muzzleloader hunters 42,517 (20 percent of the harvest), with the rest coming on youth days and during general firearms season.

The VDGIF website has harvest records dating to 1947 when a mere 4,019 deer were reported harvested. Even by 1980, only 75,208 deer were reported harvested. The real jump in harvest numbers began in the late 80s with an almost continual rise through 2009.

Turkey hunters reported 3,283 birds

harvested during the 2015-2016 fall season. This was up from 2,988 last season. The increase in harvest could certainly be partly attributed to the lower mast crop, causing turkeys to move further for meals, which increases the likelihood of hunter encounters.

Data suggest that the Virginia turkey population is at record levels for modern times. With spring gobbler season right around the corner. turkey hunters have a lotto look forward to again this season.

Things changed a bit for bear hunters this past season. While bear licenses had traditionally been combined with deer and turkey, they were separated for the first time during the 2015-2016 season so those hunting bears had to purchase a separate license.

Some 30,780 resident hunters purchased bear licenses as well as 926 nonresident hunters.

These hunters, along with some exempt from purchasing licenses, recorded 2,331 bears harvested, the second-highest total ever recorded in Virginia.

Bear harvests have exceeded 2,000 bears since 2008, with the highest harvest coming in the 2014 season (2,412 bears).

With excellent hunting opportunities between October and January, it's a good place and time to be a bear hunter," said Jaime Sajecki, bear project leader for the VDGIF.

Sajecki noted that by separating the bear license VDGIF is able to get a better idea of how many hunters are pursuing bear.


