



Along with the development of her photography came a passionate interest in natural history, the environment, and writing. Soon, to Marie and Milan's surprise, insects were an especially intriguing focus. Honey Bees, The Girls of Summer, Virginia Wildlife May 2004 was her first feature article with photographs. Marie moved on to valuable lessons she learned from a blacklegged tick, and was again published in Virginia Wildlife, inspired by her own experience with Lyme disease. Other feature articles in Virginia Wildlife include Featherweight Fliers (10/2008, on Monarch Butterflies), A Stewardship Legacy: Merrimac Farm Wildlife Management Area (4/2009), Saving Virginia's Bluebirds (5/2009), and Partnership on the James: The Inger and Walter Rice Center for Environmental Life Sciences (6/2009).

Marie's work has also appeared in Zoogoers, a Smithsonian magazine, and Blue Ridge County. She has shown at the prestigious Art at the Mill in Millwood and has had winners in the *Virginia Wildlife* Annual Photography contest. She is in the process of writing a children's book.
