Our guest speaker for the August meeting was Scott Yost, Associate Professor of Art at Bridgewater College. Scott shared his experiences in developing projects where history and photography meet. Through oral history and current interviews he combines his passion for ecology/land use and photography to create projects that showcase in horizontal exhibits and then also translate into published books.



Scott said that he asks himself these 4 questions to find subject matter that will lead to a project that will evolve over time and have impact. 1. Is it visual? 2. Is it practical? 3. Do I know enough about it? 4. Is it of interest to others?

Some of his projects are: Passing, Still (featuring trains), Shenandoah Valley Apple Orchards and Landscapes, Blacks Run of Harrisonburg, and Teaching Through the Lens.

## Chet Lewendowski to Speak at the September Meeting

SPS member Chet Lewendowski will speak at the September 22nd meeting. His topic will be "How Trip Planning Leads to Better Photos."



While stationed abroad with the Air Force in the 1960s, Chet purchased a 35mm reflex camera so that he could share his travel experiences with his parents and relatives and send family pictures home. His photographic activity waned after returning to the U.S., and what he did shoot was mainly family snapshots. His interest in photography was rekindled a couple of years ago after receiving his first digital camera, a simple point and shoot, from his son and family. He took the camera with him on a visit to







#### Chet Lewandowski

Poland, where he cut his teeth on the concept of landscape and architectural photography. Stung by the digital photography bug, he purchased his first DSLR, a Nikon D-40x, to upgrade his images and enhance his enjoyment. He took that camera on trips to Washington State, Costa Rica, Arizona and Utah, another trip to Poland, two visits to New England, and finally an extended voyage to Thailand and Japan.

By the end of last year, Chet showed that he was really addicted to photography by upgrading his equipment to a Nikon D300 and a couple of better lenses. He continued to hone his skills by shooting various subjects in the extended local area and studying Wildlife Photography under Professor Rob Simpson, participating in courses offered by Leo Schweiger and Joe Alderman, and shooting with friends in the Shenandoah Photo Society. His most recent travel, inspired by a video about Ansel Adams, took him to Yosemite National Park, where he thoroughly enjoyed capturing the sights in that magnificent location.

Chet has produced picture books of the places he has visited and has shown his work at the Lighthouse Restaurant in Berryville and at the Clarke County Fair. He has won several awards at the Fair over the past two years.
