the majority of our grade is comprised of writing assignments and exams. these are 3-4 page papers, but they are the most important parts of the class to actually demonstrate true understanding of the content.

The workload was very minimalistic and I believe that is what caused the lack of engagement from the class. We would have assigned readings for each topic but it was more on individual terms. As any college professor does, she expected that kind of responsibility and proactiveness in her students and sadly that isn't what the class engagement showed. I think once other students started engaging then other would but I think it also had more to do with the knowledge and vocabulary from the reading that these students were choosing to skip and just get the information from her lectures

The workload was extreamly overwhelming. Many of the material on quizes and exams felt like it wasnt talked about in class. Notes where allowed yet there were still questons that had never been brought up in class. Exams would take hours to complete and were too indepth.

I myself struggled with the responsibility of reading which was sometimes made it hard for be to understand class content. I feel that if she made like a reading guide or some sort of note template along with key terms to look out for and then we define on our own-I feel like there just needs to be more of system of accountability when it comes to the assigned readings because those are what she teaches on. She wants everyone to understand the course materials.

Professor Nunes expects for us to attend the lecture and behave respectfully at the lecture. She also expects for us to turn in our assignments on time and complete given that we are given more than enough time to complete these assignments successfully.

show up to class, read the assigned readings, do the weekly activities, and turn things in on time

once again expecting that she was our only lecture, and she's didn't prepare us for the final very well either. She provided all open note everything and now we're being given a multiple choice 100 point section and a short answer 100 point section. We are not allowed to have notes and she didn't prepare us for a closed resource 200 point exam.

There is one note I have that I have noticed more and more in the past two weeks or so. There are some comments made that I find are unintentionally offensive. These comments are about thought process and how a student answers a question. I know that the intensions are to try and help us develop better thought process skills but there are some issues in the way the comments are worded. In class I hear the words "it's not that hard" a lot. While a method of reading and answering a question may not be difficult to some, it can be very difficult to others. I have ADD so the way I understand questions and think about them is a lot different and can be very hard for me. I basically felt shamed by some comments. Challenges can be hard for some people and not for others and I feel like its unfair to expect the same from everyone.

It was expected for us to read the weekly readings, participate in class, make educated guesses as well as show up to lectures. We were pushed to understand material or make guess on the questions asked in class if we didn't know to keep us engaged.

gets very disappointed if students do not participate in discussion. sometimes to cure this she will have us do a quick group discussion (I suggest doing that anytime there is confusion or no participation to ensure all students are understanding the content so they can participate in the future)

The timing of the feed back would be more beneficial if we got the feedback within the same timeline of the topic being lectured about in class.

Many of the quizzes and in-class reflections felt like the material in them was not talked about in class. I would be extremely stressed when doing them and often didn't know the answer. I wrote down all the notes for the class and yet it still wasn't enough.
