



1980s – The World Changes to The "Knowledge Economy"




Digital Era - Focus Shift: Knowledge vs. Manufacturing

Local Philanthropy Not Equipped



Individuals and Organizations Unable to Maintain Traditional Impact Levels

\$100,000 endowed = \$5,000 Scholarship

Then: Full Ride, 4-Year

Now: a fraction of one semester






Individual Student Readiness for Four-Year-College

Goals, Capabilities, Motivation, Costs Vs. Financial Resources

Mismatch Between College Degree and Job Market

Outdated belief that success is automatic if I get a degree

Career path goal that will not support loan repayment

Career path goal in jeopardy of disruption or obsolescence

Limited Resources in a Multi-Student Family

Complexity of loan decisions multiply if multiple children

Limited Ability to Adjust Course Part-Way Through

Affordable education also meant flexibility to adjust Today's reality has little room for major redirection.

This is not a student <u>debt</u> crisis, it is a <u>student plan crisis</u>




