RESIDENTS REDUCING WILDFIRE RISKS

Your FIREWISE grant money combined with TVHOA funds have funded tree service work in East and West Parks, plus selected areas in Tillicum Village. The ongoing work focuses on removal of dead and diseased trees, removal of juniper trees to thin out several natural areas (see below) reducing the threat of tree-to-tree fire, allowing more light into the common areas, and stump grinding to allow the landscapers to promote lawn area growth. In one grove, five water-guzzling juniper trees were removed allowing the sun to promote deciduous sapling growth and providing cover for local birds. Bert Neumaier (Firewise Taskforce Chair), Dan Sempert (TVHOA Commons), and Dirk Benson (TVHOA President) have been walking through the village, meeting with homeowners, and determining the best use of funds to reduce fire fuel and promote cleaner commons.

At West Park, tree removal, limbing up, and debris removal provide greater Firewise safety---and more light.
