



THROUGH THE EYES OF A DRIVER By Mary Allyce

April is generally not the most exciting month. April 15th is the last day to file federal income taxes which is probably exciting to tax preparers, and like other months, multiple days in April are designated to promote, amuse, and educate. There's World Autism Acceptance Day (April 2nd), World Book and Copyright Day (April 23rd) closely followed by World Intellectual Property Day (April 26th), and who doesn't love to observe National Tom Foolery's Day, otherwise known as April Fool's Day on April 1st? This month's other main claim to fame is the hope of April showers to bring those much anticipated May flowers.

But all of April's noteworthy dates pale this year, at least in the Texas Hill Country, beside the Biggest of Big Days, April 8th. For the one or two people who are not aware of the significance of April 8, 2024, this is the day of the (drum roll, please) Total Solar Eclipse.

The upcoming total eclipse has been hyped, discussed, and planned for a couple of years because the Hill Country has a front row seat for the totality. There's a word none of us knew before the planning, and publicity, and all those t-shirts were printed. Neighboring towns of Kerrville and Fredericksburg have made formal Declarations of Disaster in preparation for the hoards of eclipse watchers predicted to descend on our peacefully bucolic towns. Kerrville has a t-shirt for sale that proclaims, "I Got Mooned In Kerrville", although I'm partial to the one I saw online which more serenely states "Hello Darkness My Old Friend".

So what's the big deal? What makes this eclipse worthy of such commercial and cautionary planning? We had a Ring of Fire Eclipse last October during an Annular Solar Eclipse and this is certainly not the first time there's been a total solar eclipse. The difference is the number of people who will be able to see and experience

this one in the United States. We here in Bandera County are in the much hyped "path of totality" which arcs through a broad swath of the US and spans States from Texas to Maine. The duration of totality in our area — four minutes plus — also sets this event apart from other recent eclipses.

No question none of this escaped the interest of those who stand to profit from a total eclipse visible throughout the country. Local, national, and international attention ramped up interest in the astronomical happening. Information spewed forth, aided and abetted by modern technology, delivering moment by moment reporting of everything from traffic concerns to information about protective eyewear and more details of solar eclipses than anyone needed to know.

Never fear. There will be something for everyone. Music festivals. Parties. Plenty of solar paraphernalia to draw you into shops. I'm betting more than one food establishment will offer solar eclipse themed food. So buy a t-shirt. Wear your protective eye gear. Go out or stay in. One way or another, the brouhaha will be over by early afternoon and we can all go back to whatever passes for normal, everyday life.

Plus, it's still early in the month and we have all of lovely April to enjoy – soft spring breezes, warmer temperatures, the promise of much needed April showers. The aroma of freshly tilled earth fills the spring air, waiting to welcome delicate young plants. If that doesn't do it for you, start planning for National Bucket List Day on April 24th. You can begin by crossing "Surviving A Total Solar Eclipse While In The Path of Totality" off the list

Happy April and see you in May!.



TOTAL SOLAR ECLIPSE 2024!!!

April 8, 2024. The duration of totality will be up to 4 minutes and 27 seconds, almost double that of The Great American Eclipse of August 21, 2017. The 2017 total solar eclipse was witnessed by about 20 million people from Oregon to South Carolina, and the upcoming 2024 Great American Eclipse is sure to be witnessed by many millions more.

Texas will be an amazing destination for the total solar eclipse! Be prepared to see the greatest sight nature offers, a total eclipse of the Sun. Be sure to get inside the path of totality for the full experience.

Simply put, a total eclipse of the Sun is the most beautiful sight you will ever see in the sky. Nothing can prepare you for the amazing sight when the sky suddenly darkens and the Sun's corona shines in the sky. No photograph can capture the stunning beauty of a total solar eclipse, you must see it for yourself. Texas boasts the best weather forecast along the path in April, and has an excellent highway system and abundant accommodations in Dallas, Ft Worth, Austin, and San Antonio. Some cities with long durations of totality include Eagle Pass, Uvalde, Kerrville, Fredericksburg, Llano, Lampasas, Killeen, Waco, Sulphur Springs, and the southeastern suburbs of Dallas.

The total solar eclipse first enters Texas at the international border at 1:27 pm CDT leaves Texas at the Oklahoma and Arkansas borders at 1:49 pm CDT. Through Texas, the speed of the Moon's shadow will accelerate from about 1580 miles per hour to about 1850 miles per hour tates president Andrew Jackson. Houston was chosen commander in chief of the revolutionary army and left the convention early to take charge of the forces gathering at Gonzales. He had control of all troops in the field-militia, volunteers, and regular army enlistees. The convention delegates knew they must declare independence-or submit to Mexican authority. If they chose independence they had to draft a constitution for a new nation, establish a strong provisional government, and prepare to combat the Mexican armies invading Texas.

- F Keep treats frozen until ready to enjoy!




