












Medication Safety Tips for Seniors



Medication Safety Tips

- 1. Make it easy to see the medication:
 - Wear glasses
- · Use strong lighting
- Use a magnifier
- · Ask for large print labels
- Create a routine for taking medicine at the same time as another daily event, such as meal time or bath time.
- Create a way to remember when doses of medicine have been taken. Ideas include:
 - · Pill minders with spots for four doses per day.
 - Pill timers which beep a sound at medication time.
 - Write dose times on a calendar and make a check mark after each dose is taken.

Questions to Ask Your Doctor About New Medications

What is the name of the medication? What am I taking it for? Are there any side effects? How long do I take this medicine?

Questions to Ask Your Pharmacist About New Medications

Is the medicine taken with food or on an empty stomach? Should certain food, drink or other drugs be avoided? Is an easy-opening cap available? Is a large print label available?

THROUGH THE EYES OF A DRIVER By Mary Allyce

We all remember the Big February Freeze of 2021. It was no joke. Pipes froze. People had no water. The entire power grid of Texas almost went down. Multiple blackouts caused real suffering. Even those of us who actually like colder temperatures, including an occasional snowfall, were not amused.

In Wisconsin where I grew up, people didn't obsess over such matters. In winter it was cold. It snowed. You put on layers of clothing, boots, hats, mittens, and got on with school or work. I don't remember blackouts, losing power, busted water pipes or other indignities. I do remember ice skating, sledding, making angels in the snow, some dandy snowball fights. Kids always remember the fun stuff.

We've had some chillier days here in Bandera over the last few months. For those who complain about temperatures in the 30's, please take a moment to recall the brutally hot spring and summer of '22. We broke records and as I recall, no one was cheering.

I'm back in Texas from a month and a half in South Florida with family for Christmas, New Year's, and a theatrical production in which one of my sons was performing. My other son, his wife, and the young folks were warm and welcoming and more than generous in sharing their home. The performer son threw a fantastic New Year's Eve party and his performance as Nathan Detroit in Guys and Dolls was wonderful.

A couple of "cold fronts" arrived in Florida, however, and reminded me Texans are not the only ones who complain about cold, not so cold, and almost cold weather. You would have thought it was the return of a Canadian Clipper, the weather system that brings truly cold temps, below zero, deep freeze type cold to the upper Midwest.

Florida issues "sweater weather" alerts when temperatures drop below 70o. When it's below 50o they bundle up like Nanook of The North and remind folks to put an

extra blanket on the bed. When we hit the mid and low 40's in South Florida, the locals were openly perturbed and digging out parkas and down jackets.

Some of us call 450 simply, "Good sleeping weather." My dog and I were delighted. He wasn't panting. I wasn't sweating in the usual heat and humidity.

It wasn't long before Florida felt like Florida again with the return of the hot, humid weather Floridians love. At least when we get into hot weather seasons up here in the Texas Hill Country, it's pretty dry and there are no "ocean breezes", or what I call "hot, salty, damp winds".

Speaking of wind, humidity, and heat, they wreck pure havoc on hair. I remember now why I had a wedge haircut for 15 years when I lived in South Florida. Not even Florida "breezes" could penetrate that helmet of hair!

No place is perfect. Weather is capricious. Every one of the eight states (Wisconsin, Indiana, Colorado, New York, California, Arizona, Florida, and Texas) in which I've lived has the same prediction. "If you don't like the weather," they say, "Wait ten minutes and it'll change." Keep in mind, they all think they're unique!

When I'm reminded I'm a "Yankee" (not Texas born) and there's nothing I can do to ever change that, I respond, "You're a Texan by an accident of birth. I chose to live here!" It's true. I looked around at many states, many places and decided the Hill Country was where I wanted to be. It's not perfect, but it's as close as I can get.

Spring is on the way. Enjoy & and try not to complain, whatever Mother Nature throws at us. You know it's going to be too dry, or too wet, too hot or too cold, too windy. . . too something for some of us and no matter what it is, my eight former states are partly right - it will change!

So, hang on to your hats and see you, and those pesky winds of March, next month.
