Enclosed is information for the 2019 Summer Camp, "Pursue". Inside you will find the camper and worker applications, the list of chaperone duties and responsibilities, the camp poster, & the Life Impact Internship packet.

The early registration price for each camper is \$175.00 with a \$25.00 deposit and registration packet postmarked by May 31<sup>st</sup>. Registrations that are received postmarked between June 1<sup>st</sup> and June 30<sup>th</sup> with a \$25.00 deposit will have a registration price of \$ 200.00. Those campers who do not register by June 30<sup>th</sup> will be able to register at the door with a registration fee of \$220.00. To help ease the impact of this cost on parents and churches but allow churches to take advantage of the early registration price, the \$25.00 deposit will hold the applicants bed while allowing time to fundraise the remaining balance which will be due at the door. The \$25.00 deposit can be transferred to another camper but cannot be refunded.

In order to effectively run Summer Camp 2019, we need dedicated workers who want to be a part of impacting the lives of hundreds of students. Many positions need to be filled this year including: office help, clean-up crews, kitchen crews, Stations for bounce houses & Paintball, and chaperones.

If you have individuals in your churches that are qualified and available during camp, please encourage them to submit a worker's application. During camp, workers will receive meal tickets and lodging for the duration of their service. **Camp worker applications as well as Life Impact Internship applications are due by June 1<sup>st</sup>.** Applications received after this date will be accepted based on camp needs. Please send your applications as early as possible, as this makes planning for camps easier. **Please note, if you are not from a PCG church, the latest we can accept worker applications is one week before camp begins.**

We want you to know that we take the safety of our campers very seriously. We hold our staff and volunteers to a higher standard in order to ensure that safety. To ensure this safety and protect our workers there is a strict rule of two chaperones per cabin. Our worker policy **REQUIRES** that each pastor recommend the applicant and certify that he/she is a qualified individual to serve, as well certifying that individual has attended their church faithfully for at least six months with active tithing report to their church. In addition, each applicant is required to complete a **child abuse program** and complete a **national background check** before submitting a worker's application. (See [protectmyministry.com](http://protectmyministry.com) for background checks) Proof of both background check and Abuse training will be **required** when the worker application is submitted. It is important to remember that background checks are time consuming so start early. **It is required that each church send 1 chaperone for every 10 campers they send for summer camp 2019.** This is a very exciting time for our churches and for the youth department. All the work that is put into camp by the volunteers and the prayers from the district are not done in vain. These campers are worth every ounce of our effort. Please also join us in prayer and fasting for Summer Camps 2019 as we want to see lives impacted and changed forever by the power of the God. If you have questions, please feel free to contact me. # Summer Camp 2019: Preparation is the key!

Planning and preparing your church family for Summer Camp is a huge undertaking! It requires not only your time and energy, but administrative, business, marketing and interpersonal communication skills. As a leader we must pull our team members, students and parents together and develop our own personalized strategy. Most importantly preparing for Summer Camp requires prayer, patience and trust in God.

As you work out your own local plan, you'll find some things work well, while others don't. Your pastor and his ministry team know the people and families of your church best. Don't try to be something you aren't. Do what works best for you. We exist as your DYD to help you along the way, so in doing so, we've prepared the top ten steps to use as a guide in your planning and promoting efforts. (See below)

The amount of effort and time you as a leader invest into promoting, recruiting, and preparing your students and parents for Summer Camp will directly affect their experience and connection to your local church family before, during and long after camp has ended!

Remember as your District Youth Ministries Director, we exist to support and strengthen you and your local ministry team! If at any time you need advice, ideas for creativity, strategy or guidance, we are here for you! Youth Ministry is a daily grind of sweat, tears, and passion. Read Galatians chapter 6 today and remember that you are sowing into the spirit, and therefore not grow weary in well doing for IN DUE SEASON we SHALL REAP if we faint not! It's the season of sowing and we will reap a harvest of souls.

## **1. Pray, pray, pray**

As a child of God, walking in relationship with Him. Prayer is always the first key to success! Psalm 37:5 says, Commit your ways to the Lord trust in him and he will do it.

## **2. Plan to be more actively involved as a pastor and youth leader**

The excitement and involvement we display in our actions and words are contagious! If we are actively involved in planning and preparing, then so will our students and parents. I Timothy 4:12, Don't let anyone look down on your youthfulness, but rather in speech, conduct, love, faith and purity, show yourself an example of those who believe.

## **3. Develop, draft your own promotional plan**

To be successful in your recruiting efforts, it's important to have a plan and be wise in your work. Proverbs 24

**4. Prepare your promotional and recruiting materials - "Impact Central Cal Camp Promo 2019" on the Youth website [www.ccalyouth.com](http://www.ccalyouth.com)**, Copy the recruiting materials provided to you. Use the promo graphics and videos uploaded on the web to help you in your promo plan. Do you have a promo plan? Use your marketing skills and ideas to connect and communicate Summer Camp, it's purpose and information, to your families.

## **5. Design and setup a Summer Camp Info/Recruiting Station**

This is a great way to visually implant and communicate Summer Camp into the hearts of your church family. Use banners, posters, props, displays, the possibilities are endless. Be creative!

## **6. Connect with parents, Identify and draft a list of potential campers / families to recruit**

Begin by writing down the names of your core members and their kids, then branch out. Chat with your parents and get them on board to recruit their family members' children, as well as neighbors and friends. Who are they trying to win to the Lord? Work together with your parents and church leaders to connect and share relationship and God's love

with your list. Summer Camp is a great tool to connect with new families!

Phone calls during the weekday and/or lunch meetings right after Sunday service area great ways to sit down and connect with parents. The best way to prepare campers for camp is to make sure the parent is involved and on board with the plan. This is especially important when you are dealing with raising funds and gathering paperwork. Work to be proactive and stay ahead of the game by anticipating the next thing and meeting the needs of your families.

### **7. Discover financial needs and draft a fundraising plan**

Once you've connected with parents, you'll need to discuss financing. Often the "cost" of camp can be the contingent factor as to whether a parent will send their child to Summer Camp. Take advantage of early bird discounts and group discounts and draft a fundraising plan early! You only need \$25 deposit for each camper, balance is due at camp, therefore you can continue to fundraise all the way up to camps.

The most successful fundraisers are a part of a strategic plan with an exact goal in mind. The second factor in making your fundraisers successful is communicating the need and making opportunities available to not just your church family, but your community as well. By offering a variety of giving options to people, you will increase and broaden your base of donors. For more help in fundraising, just ask us! Ideally you should already have your plan drafted and begin to implement when registration opens on March 18, 2019.

### **8. Promote, promote, promote**

Now you have all the pieces to the puzzle it is ready to pull together. Now promote, promote, promote! What medias do you have available? Set a promotional plan in place; when, what, how you will say and communicate Summer Camp and how to register. If you aren't sure on how to promote in a positive and non-obtrusive way, seek out the advice of someone in advertising. You would be surprised how these business skills come in handy when developing and implementing your promo plan.

### **9. Gather and finalize all necessary paperwork and payment**

You've got verbal commitments and a "yes" from parents and students, now it's time to sign that paperwork! If you are taking advantage of pre-registration \*highly encouraged\* then get the entire camp packet and registration forms into the hands of your leaders. Host a "paperwork info session" on a Sunday before or after a service where parents and campers sit down with you as leaders and fill out the paperwork then and there. The earlier you handle this component of the process; the easier final preparations will be for you before you depart for opening day of camp!

### **10. Bring together and educate your leaders, campers and parents**

So, fundraising goals are being met, paperwork is complete, and now it's time to prepare for what information needs to be communicated to parents regarding packing, traveling to camp, and answering any questions along the way. Schedule as many info meetings in advance. Remember to follow up on the phone with parents during the week. Remember that not everyone pays attention to PowerPoint announcements, the bulletins, or even regular announcements during the service. Provide a variety of avenues to communicate important and necessary information to parents since everyone processes and absorbs information differently.

# CENTRAL CAL YOUTH CAMPS RULES AND PROCEDURES

INITIAL

1. Campers **MUST** attend **ALL** scheduled or special called functions. \_\_\_\_\_
2. No one is allowed to leave the camp grounds unless authorized by the camp director. \_\_\_\_\_
3. All cars will remain parked in designated areas until camp is over. Infraction of this rule will result in keys taken by the camp director. \_\_\_\_\_
4. Any camper damaging property will be held responsible and charged for the damages. \_\_\_\_\_
5. Any camper leaving their dorm without permission after "lights out" may be expelled from the camp if deemed necessary. \_\_\_\_\_
6. All camper medication must be checked into the nurse prior to the start of camp. No medication will be kept in the cabin area. \_\_\_\_\_
7. Absolutely no **WEAPONS, SMOKING, ALCOHOL, DRUGS, OR VULGAR LANGUAGE** will be tolerated during camp. \_\_\_\_\_
8. All campers **MUST** have on file in the registration office proper registration and medical release forms. All information will be kept confidential. \_\_\_\_\_
9. Any camper participating in Paintball events must have a signed Paintball Release Form. (Cost is \$5 for 100 balls, includes equipment) \_\_\_\_\_  
    -You can bring your own equipment, but it must be checked in the office & You cannot use your own paintballs.
10. Any Camper participating on the Zipline or other High Risk Activities must have waiver signed. \_\_\_\_\_
11. Dress Code for PCG Central California Youth Camps.
  - a. Shoes **MUST** be worn at all times.
  - b. Sleeveless attire or Tank Tops are allowed but straps must be at least 1-1/2 inches in width.
  - c. Any immodest apparel is not allowed; Your upper torso & stomach areas must be covered.
  - d. Mini-skirts, dresses, or shorts which are more than four (4) inches above the knee **MAY NOT** be worn at any time. \_\_\_\_\_

I am aware that participation in and use of the zip line and other high risk activities involves inherent hazards and risks, such as but not limited to physical exertion, fast movement at great heights, and slipping or striking the zip line elements. Although use of a helmet is required, such use does not negate such risks. # Driving directions to Sequoia Heights Camp Grounds, 45334 Poso Park Dr, Posey, CA 93260 (About a 2.5hr drive from Fresno)

## Going 99 South

1. Take CA-99 S toward Bakersfield/Los Angeles
2. Take Earlimart Exit toward Ducor/Fountain Springs (You will be about an hour to the camp grounds)
3. In Fountain Springs, there is a 3-way fork, go RIGHT, DO NOT go to California Hot Springs. You will pass the Fire Station (which after the turn will be on your left)
4. In about 30-35 minutes of driving the winding road, it will end at Old Stage Road, there will be a 2-way fork, go LEFT. (You will be about 15 minutes from the camp ground)
5. You will drive through Balance Rock, the Posey Post Office, and the go through two cattle guards. After the second cattle guard, there will be a fork. Go LEFT, through Poso Park Community. Please drive slowly and follow posted speed signs.
6. After driving through Poso Park, ½ mile, you will enter the Sequoia Heights Camp Grounds Entrance gate. WELCOME to Central Cal Summer Camps! You will park in the Parking Lot below the main campus and take the Shuttle to the main campus.

## Going 99 North

1. Take CA-155 E/Garces Hwy going East
2. Turn left at Bakersfield-Glennville Rd/CA-155 E
3. Slight left at Jack Ranch Rd  25.4 mi
4. Continue onto Jack Ranch Rd turning into M-3/Old Stage Rd  8.8 mi
5. At the fork with the stop sign, go LEFT, staying on Old Stage Rd, going to Posey  0.7 mi
6. At the second fork, go RIGHT, staying on Old Stage Road  161 ft
7. You will drive through Balance Rock, the Posey Post Office, and pass two cattle guards. After the second cattle guard, there will be a fork. Go LEFT, through Poso Park Community. Please drive slowly and follow posted speed signs.  4.7 mi
8. After driving through Poso Park, ½ mile, you will enter the Sequoia Heights Camp Grounds Entrance gate. WELCOME to Central Cal Summer Camps! You will park in the Parking Lot below the main campus and take the Shuttle to the main campus.  2.5 mi


## TRAVEL HELP


**Travel Trailers:** Take CA-155 out of Delano, the road is much better but takes more time.


