The USAID's Economic Recovery and Development Activity (USAID-ERDA) implemented by a consortium led by Associates in Development (AiD) Pvt Ltd is seeking applications from eligible female entrepreneurs for inkind grant support to strengthen their existing personal care enterprises (beauty parlors) in Peshawar, Mardan, Swat, Dera Ismail Khan and Kurram. Through this intervention, USAID-ERDA aims to enhance the sustainability of women-owned enterprises, facilitate business expansion, increase income, and create new job opportunities for women in the selected areas.

Issuance of this RFA does not constitute an award commitment on the part of USAID-ERDA nor does it commit USAID-ERDA to pay for the costs incurred in the preparation and submission of an application. Further, USAID-ERDA reserves the right to reject any or all applications received. In addition, final award of the grant(s) to the successful applicants shall be made upon approval of USAID.

SECTION I. PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

a) Introduction

The USAID-ERDA is implemented by a consortium led by Associates in Development (AiD) Pvt Ltd in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and its Newly Merged Districts (NMDs). The USAID-ERDA aims to "increase economic opportunities by strengthening and modernizing the agriculture sector and promoting the micro, small & medium enterprises (MSMEs) in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and its NMDs". These initiatives are expected to contribute to broad-based economic growth in the province and create income generating and employment opportunities. These will be achieved through the following three sub-objectives.

- Sub-Objective -I: Agriculture sector capacity enhanced and modernized through strengthening of agriculture production resources.
- Sub-Objective -2: Micro, small & medium businesses promoted by strengthening MSMEs in both farm and non-farm sectors.
- Sub-Objective -3: Improved business enabling environment through policy reforms and Technical Assistance to Govt. of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa.

b) Rationale

The women owned personal care enterprises (beauty parlors and spas) have emerged rapidly across Khyber Pakhtunkhwa since women can start and operate this business in her home. The number of women owned beauty parlors is increasing at a rapid pace because of more awareness and demand for personal care and grooming services. The demand for personal care is still on a constant rise due to rapid urbanization, increasing number of working women, more awareness and exposure about personal care and grooming. However, with increased awareness and exposure, customers require high quality, safe and hygienic personal care services in a more conducive environment which has resulted in tough competition among beauty parlors.

During series of focus group discussions with women entrepreneurs, USAID-ERDA team learnt that the micro and small-scale beauty parlors in growth and expansion stage are unable to compete with already established beauty parlors and provide better quality services. The women entrepreneurs operating these enterprises do not have sufficient financial resources to up-grade their businesses and resultantly they are forced to quite business. Lack of modern and improved parlor equipment & tools, finances resources and training in advanced saloon management are the significant challenges which constraint the sustainability, growth, and expansion of women-owned enterprises in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and NMDs.











USAID-ERDA plans to offer a customized grant package coupled with targeted technical assistance to strengthen potential women-owned beauty parlors in selected districts of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. This assistance package will help women entrepreneurs in sustaining their enterprises, expand operations, reach to increased market segments and create more jobs opportunities for women in their respective areas. USAID-ERDA support will also play a catalyst role in demonstrating enterprises which will be replicated by other potential young women entrepreneurs across Khyber Pakhtunkhwa thus fostering increased economic opportunities in the region.

c) Objectives

The objectives of the intervention are as follows:

- Promote improved and better-quality personal care enterprises (beauty parlors) in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa which may be replicated by other potential women entrepreneurs.
- Increase in the annual sales revenue of participating women entrepreneurs in selected districts of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa.
- Develop capacities of women entrepreneurs to offer quality personal care services, compete with other established beauty parlors and increase business efficiency.
- Create new employment opportunities for women by expanding their operations and production capacity of participating entrepreneurs over the next year.

d) Proposed Intervention

USAID-ERDA aims to strengthen existing women owned personal care (beauty parlors) enterprises in selected districts of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa through in-kind grant support and technical training. In-kind grant will be provided to selected number of eligible women entrepreneurs for business up-gradation. The women entrepreneurs selected for in-kind grant support will be provided managerial and technical trainings in advanced saloon management and digital media marketing. The selected women entrepreneurs will also be provided exposure of well-established similar nature enterprises to increase their learning. The in-kind grant package will include the following items, machinery, and equipment. USAID-ERDA may include or exclude additional items during final grant award depending on availability of certain items,

SECTION II. AWARD INFORMATION

a) Type, Number & Amount of Award

Through this RFA, USAID-ERDA intends to provide in-kind grant support and technical assistance to 50 eligible women entrepreneurs for strengthening their existing beauty parlors. USAID-ERDA will procure the required items as outlined in each approved business model directly and will be provided to each grantee under a grant agreement. USAID-ERDA will undertake all such procurements in accordance with USAID and U.S. Government regulations governing grants and under USAID-ERDA grant manual.

The maximum award limit for an individual grant is up to PKR. I.00 million (PKR. I,000,000). However, the amount of award funding may vary depending on the availability of certain items, type, nature, and location of the business. These grants will be awarded to individuals fulfilling the eligibility/selection and evaluation criteria as given in the below section.

b) Duration of Award

The grant support and post award implementation follow up will not exceed one year. However, the duration of this intervention may vary depending on the nature and size of the grant. USAID-ERDA reserves the right to extend the duration of award, or the overall intervention based on grantee's performance, the availability of funds, and other unforeseen circumstances, with the approval of USAID. The expected start date of the grant is four months after the issuance date of this RFA.

c) Eligibility Criteria

The eligibility criteria for the proposed grant support and training are as follows,

- The applicant must be a woman and permanent resident of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa with a valid Computerized National Identity Card (CNIC).
- Must have an existing beauty parlor in one of the selected districts (Peshawar, Mardan, Swat, Dera Ismail Khan and Kurram).











- The business must have been operational at a minimum for the last one (01) year. The USAID-ERDA team will conduct a physical verification to confirm the existence and operational status of the business.
- Must have a minimum of 200 sq feet of dedicated and accessible space with basic utilities suitable for business upgrading with the plan for utilizing the additional USAID-ERDA in-kind grant support.
- Applicants who have completed a minimum of 6 months of technical/vocational training or have obtained a diploma in the relevant subject such as beautician, make-up, saloon management etc. will be preferred.
- Applicant should be willing to participate in USAID-ERDA's relevant training and capacity-building programs, exposure visits, etc.

d) Terms and Conditions

The selected applicants must be willing to,

- Sign the required documentation/certification prior to receiving a grant.
- Share data related to production and sales with USAID-ERDA for implementation of monitoring and tracking results of the interventions.
- Allow the usage of photos/videos/testimonials for communications purposes in electronic or print media.
- Provide access to other ERDA's beneficiaries to access their facility for training, exposure, and experience sharing.

In-eligible Applicant (s)

- Any public sector/government owned entity or an entity operated by the Federal or Provincial Governments.
- Any entity affiliated with USAID-ERDA or any of its members of the governing body, directors, officers, or employees.
- Applicants with a business idea which fall in the negative list of businesses notified by the Government of Pakistan and by the USAID.
- Any applicant whose name and/or name of key personnel appear on System for Award Management (SAM) (www.sam.gov).











e) Evaluation Criteria

The applications will be evaluated against the following criteria and the minimum percentage for an application to be shortlisted for in-kind grant & technical assistance support is 70%.

f) Grantee Contribution

The selected applicant/grantee will be required to contribute in-kind or in cash as part of the upgradation, operations, and marketing as part of the proposed grant. The grantee contribution is intended to increase the sustainability of the grant activity by creating a financial stake for the grantee. USAID-ERDA will extend in-kind grant support whereas the grantee will be responsible for all other costs which is not covered in the USAID-ERDA in-kind grant and technical assistance support such as day-to-day business operations, renovation, rentals, packaging, consumables, and cost of items associated with health, hygiene, and waste disposal etc.

Section III. Application Submission Information

A. Instructions to Applicants

- The applicant (s) should thoroughly read and understand the RFA before submission of application.
- USAID-ERDA team will arrange an orientation session for understanding the application process.











- The applicant (s) must use the USAID-ERDA's prescribed form for application.
- Only those applications that meet the eligibility criteria will be accepted for next phase of this award.
- USAID-ERDA reserves the right to select or reject any application in line with the project objectives.

B. Ineligible Expenses

USAID-ERDA grant funds may not be utilized for the following,

- Construction or infrastructure activities of any kind. Note that Per ADS 303.3.30 and the ADS 303
 Mandatory Reference entitled, "USAID Implementation of Construction Activities" dated August 22, 2013,
 construction is not eligible for reimbursement under grants resulting from this solicitation. Construction
 also includes improvements, renovation, alteration, and refurbishment.
- Ceremonies, parties, celebrations, or "representation" expenses.
- Purchases of restricted goods, such as: restricted agricultural commodities, motor vehicles including
 motorcycles, pharmaceuticals, medical equipment, contraceptive products, used equipment; without the
 previous approval of USAID-ERDA, or prohibited goods, prohibited goods under USAID regulations,
 including but not limited to the following, abortion equipment and services, luxury goods, etc.
- Purchases of goods or services restricted or prohibited under the prevailing USAID source/nationality (Cuba, Iran, North Korea, and Syria).
- Any purchase or activity, which has already been made prior to the signing of grant agreement.
- Purchases or activities unnecessary to accomplish grant purposes as determined by the USAID-ERDA.
- Prior obligations of and/or, debts, fines, and penalties imposed on the Grantee.
- Creation of any types of endowments/donations etc.
