Money is going to be tight: focus on food and other essentials

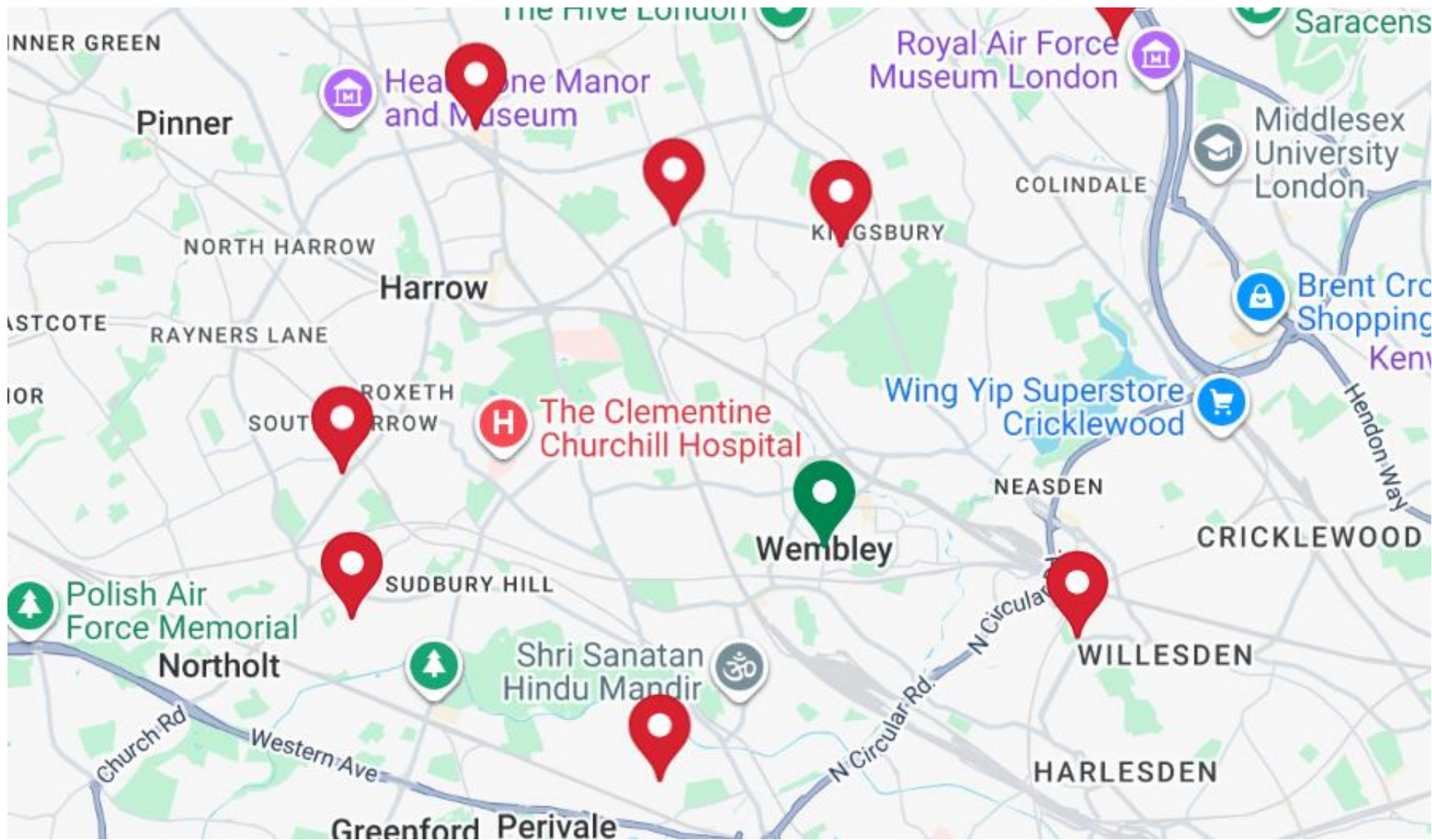


Get emergency food

If you need help, a food bank can provide an emergency food parcel containing at least three days of meals.

In order to get help from a food bank you'll need to be referred for a food voucher. The voucher is then exchanged at the food bank for a food parcel.

You can get a food voucher from a number of local community organisations, who can ensure you get the right support.

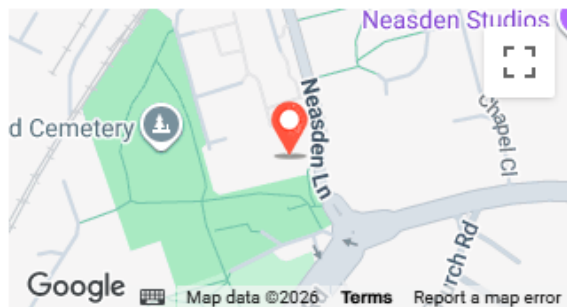

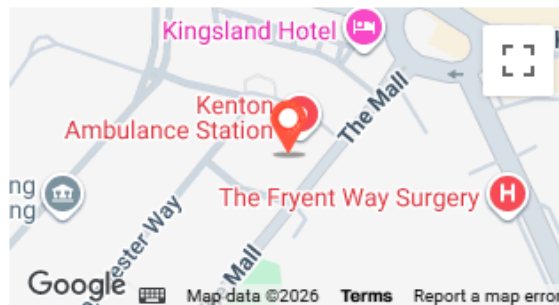

Get Help

Foodbank vouchers

The most important step is to get a foodbank voucher.

In order to provide the most appropriate help we work with local agencies. They will be able to provide you with support to help address the crisis and if needed, they'll issue you with a food bank referral voucher (an e-voucher referral code) so you can get an emergency food parcel from your local foodbank. Agencies we work with include Citizens Advice, Brent Hubs, housing support officers, family wellbeing centres, health visitors, social prescribers, social services, probation officers, as well as local charities and support organisations.

If you cannot afford to buy food you can **visit your normal support service** to request a food bank voucher. They will discuss your circumstances with you, and if appropriate will issue you an electronic voucher code to bring to the foodbank to exchange for an emergency food parcel.

If you have not been referred to Brent Foodbank before, you can visit **Brent Hubs** who are based at libraries across Brent. Their advisors can provide support with benefits, housing, debt etc, as well as issue you a food bank voucher code if appropriate.

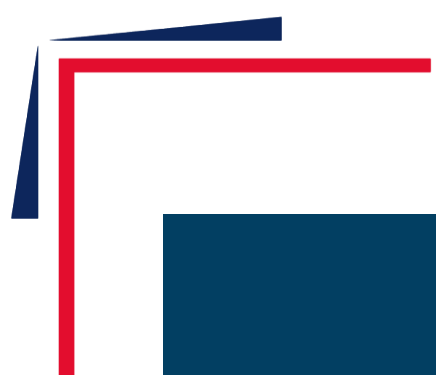

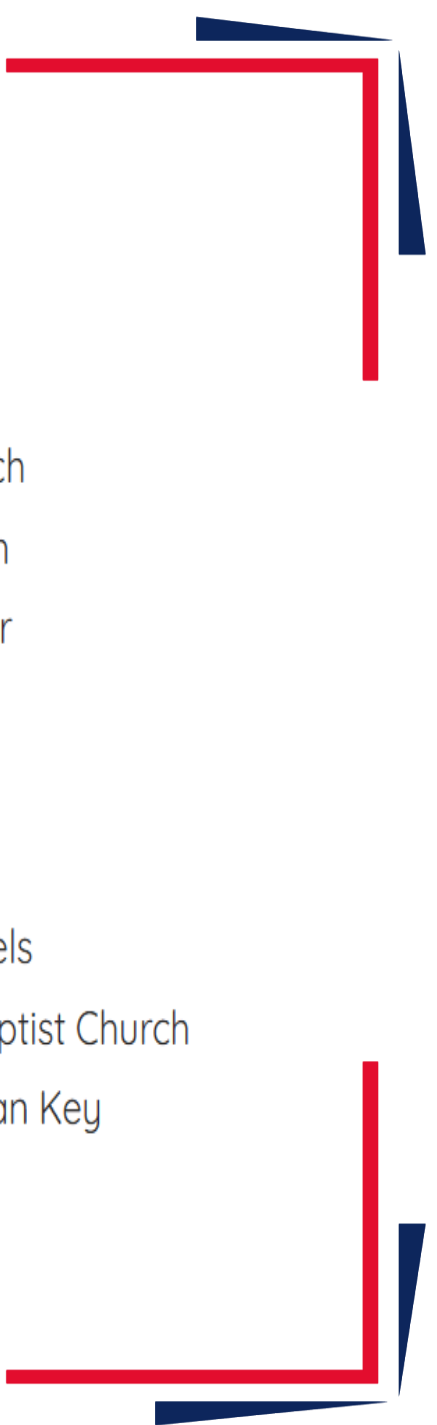

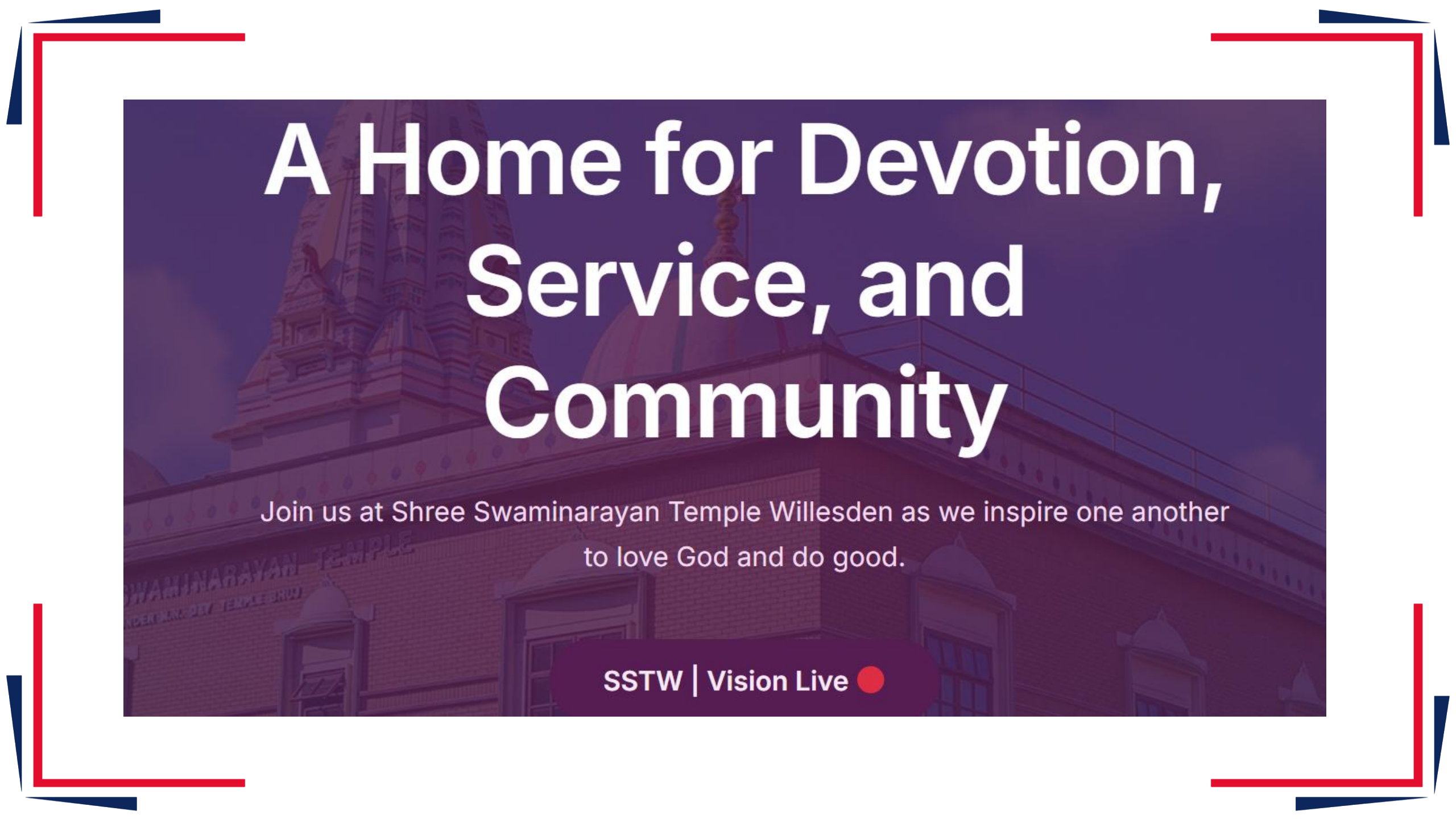

HOW OFTEN CAN I VISIT?

Asylum seekers and new refugees* will be sent a membership pass after their first visit. Members can re-visit on **Mondays** and **Fridays** as required. You need to show your membership pass each time you visit.

Individuals who are referred from the community will be given a specific appointment for their visit.

*new refugees = Individuals who have been granted asylum or humanitarian protection **within the last 12 months.**



BACKPACKS AND SUITCASES

Backpacks and suitcases are always in huge demand. If you need a backpack or suitcase ask us and we can see if one is available. We only give suitcases to people with an eviction notice. If we don't have one try the 'Free Stuff' sites on our [Other Help](#) page.

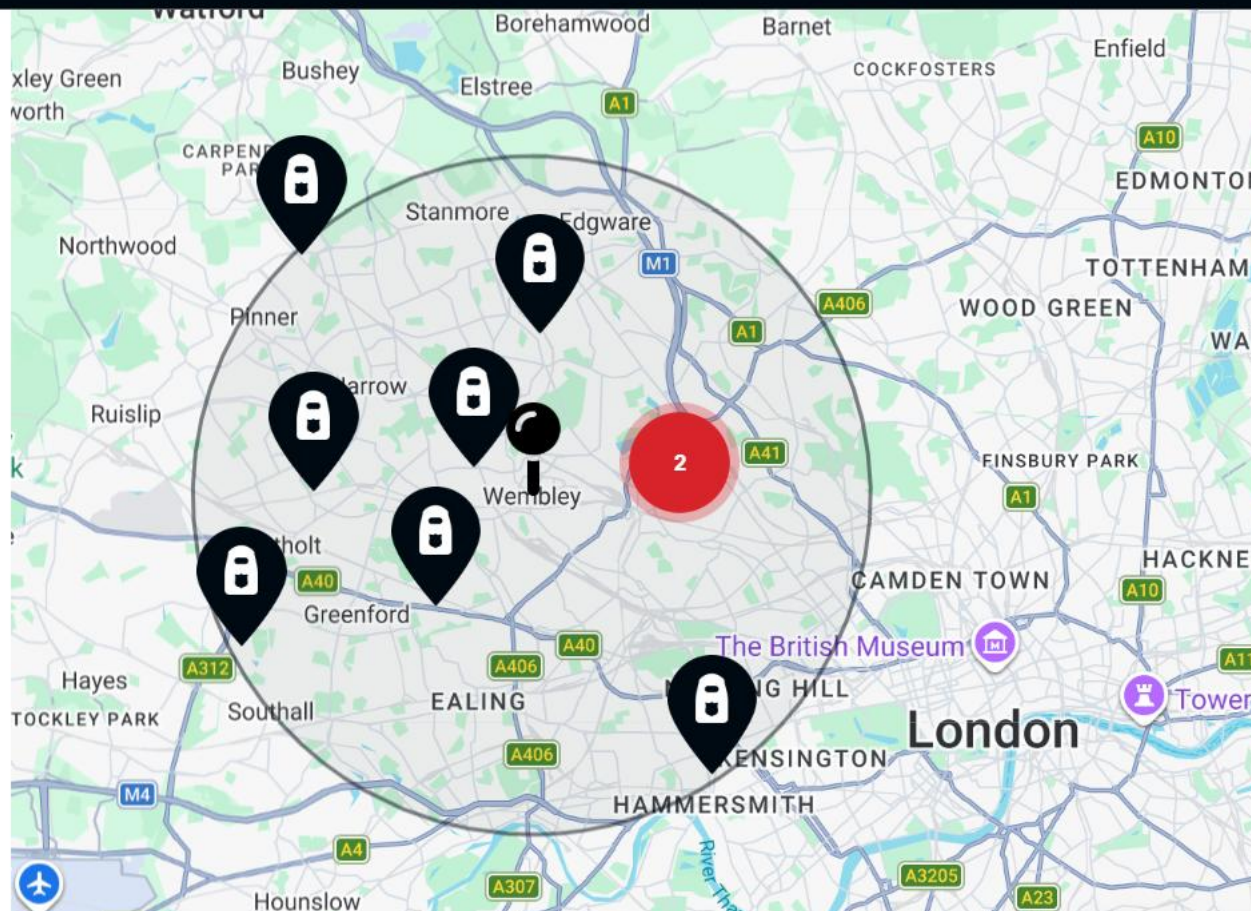

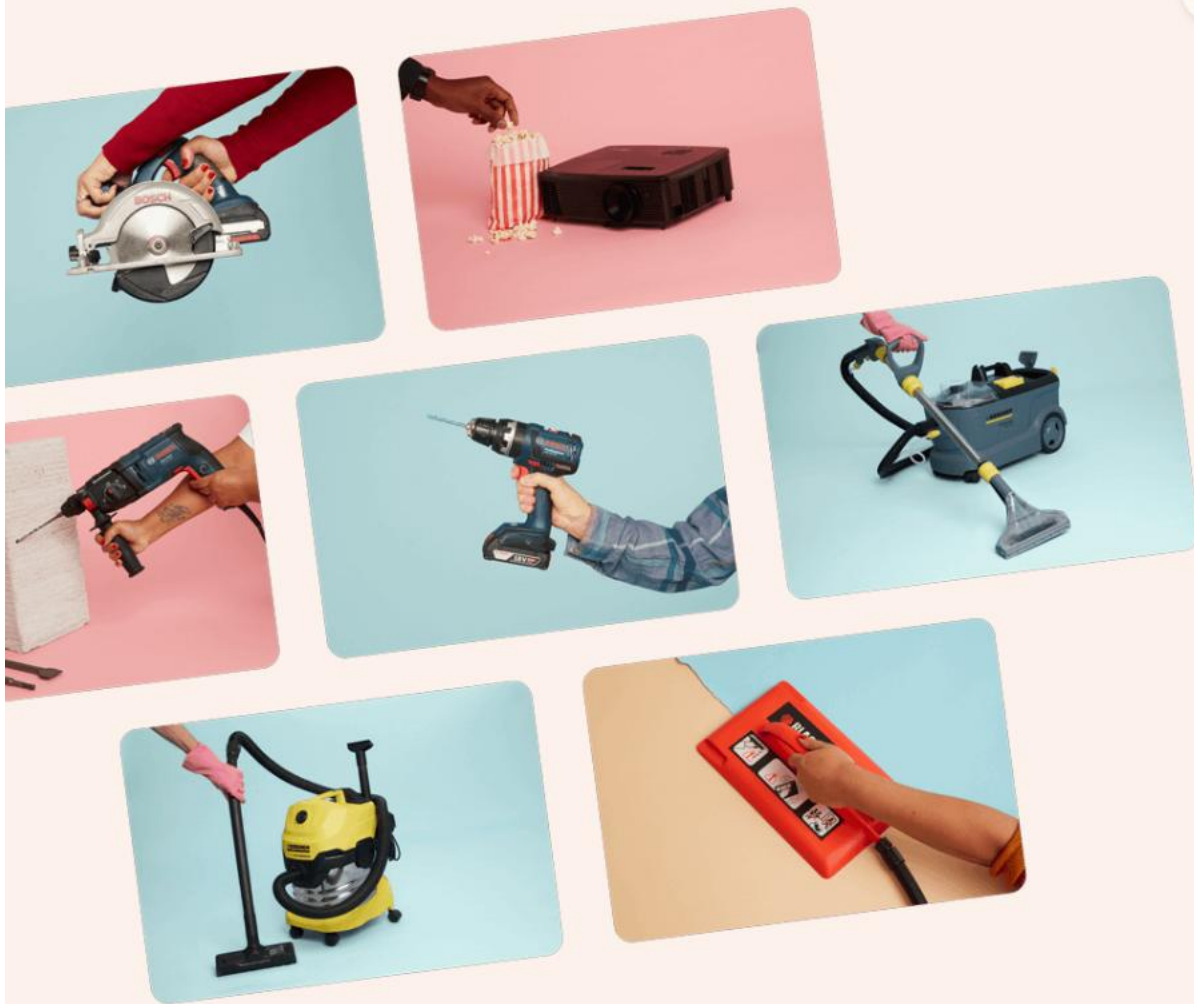

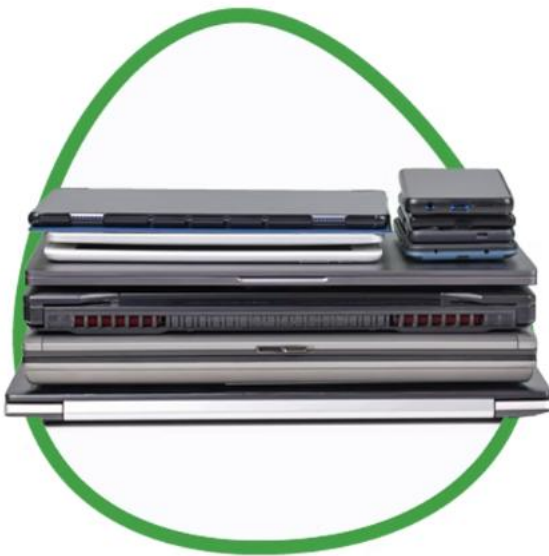

Information for refugees

Once you get permission to stay as a refugee, any help you are receiving from the Home Office will stop after 21 to 28 days from the day you got your refugee status. This means that any help you are getting with housing and money will stop. In some cases, the notice might be even shorter. You should contact Migrant Help if you have been given a very short notice, they might be able to assist with [extending the notice](#).

Once you receive your notice, you will have to leave your current home and find a new place to live on your own. If you have just been granted refugee status, watch [a short video](#) about what to do next and how to find housing. It is available in English, Farsi, and Arabic. How to change the language

Click on the orange 'speak' button, located on every page to open [the ReachDeck toolbar](#) and follow the instructions below.



If using a desktop computer or laptop

Click the translate icon and select a language from the dropdown menu.



If using a mobile phone

Click the cog icon and select a language from the dropdown menu



Listen to the information

You can also listen to the information in 36 of the most commonly spoken global languages. When you select a language from the dropdown you will see a megaphone icon, if it is one that you can also listen to.

- Money is very tight: focus on food, clothes, toiletries, communications – the basics
- Use health centres, religious centres, food banks, clothes banks, charity shops, recycling websites to get things for low cost or free
- Libraries may also allow you to borrow things too
- Focus on free activities like museums and parks and educational programmes
- Use free internet at libraries, civic centres to find out more about what's available to you

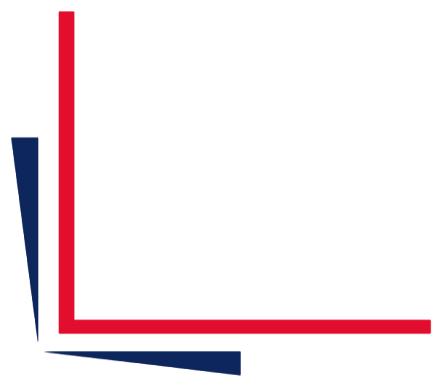


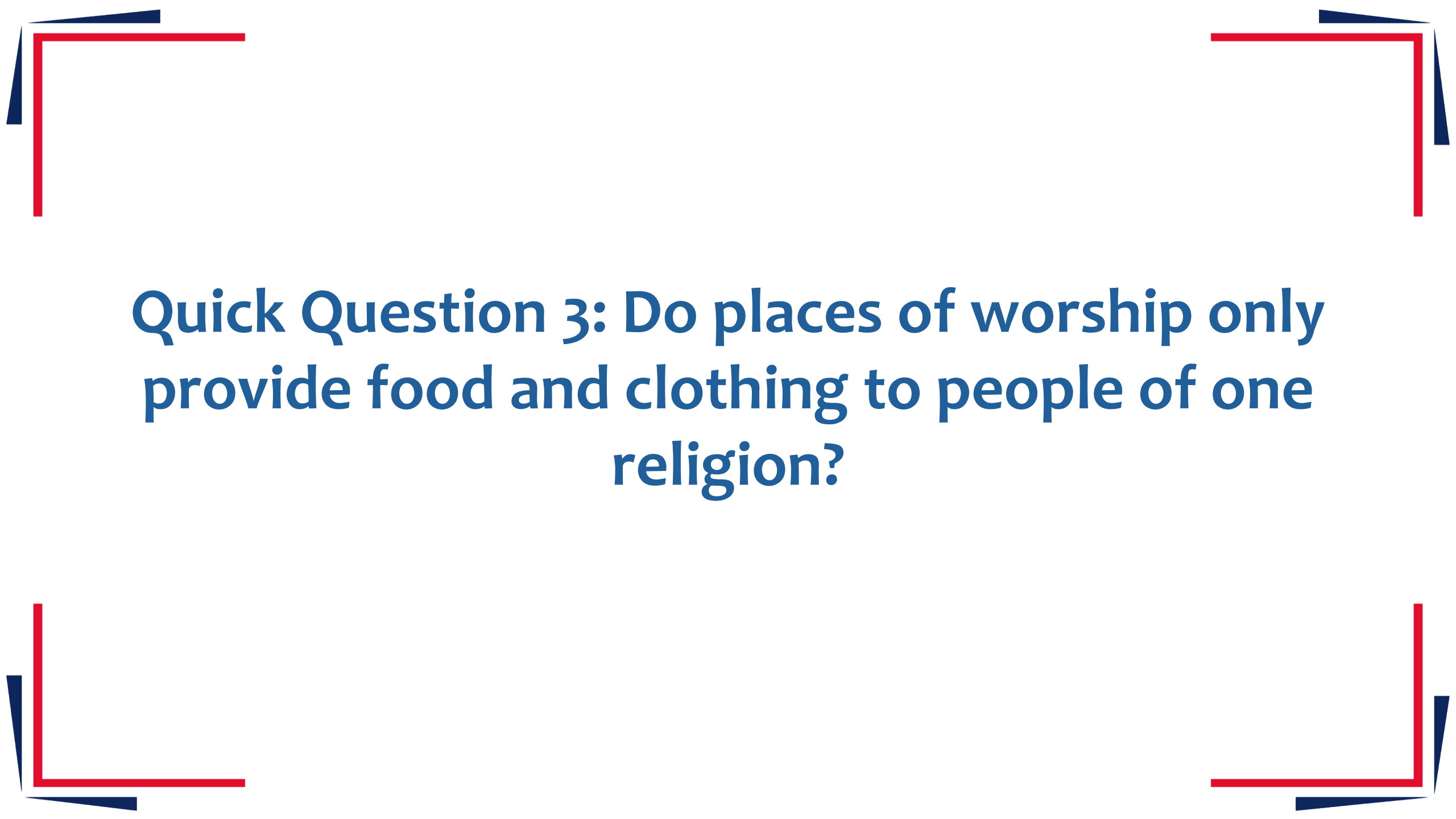
**Quick Question 1: what is the name of places
