So, you must decide what the focus of your exhibition will be: possible options include: Turing's work at Bletchley Park; his work after the war; his trial, conviction and death; the rehabilitation of his memory and the Royal Pardon, or you could cover his life and work but emphasise specific aspects. You will need to explain why you have chosen a particular focus.
