


Maple takes you on a journey beyond the doors of her great estate.


In this song two Creatures are representing her thoughts, her mind. Leading up to the song: Knowing All.

They the Creatures, her mind—conclude to move things out of place, (leaving him/her without answer.)




In the song she questions the knowledge of the earth; we see some of the thoughts Maple has—as she questions the world around her.


The two dark-creatures are a make-believe visual of her thoughts, (one thought bouncing an idea off of another, sort of as positive and negative.)














Behind the Night Sky Sheet Music Can I say Jazz Scale?

Knowing All is by far one of my favorite songs, and I hope it is yours too. There is no exact way to play this song, that might sound strange, but I am serious.

Although I did write it down, I only wrote it down for the sake of keeping the idea, keeping the rhythm, and through the idea, through that rhythm I can have a foundation to a song, the song Knowing All.

The reason I say that there is not an exact way to play this song, is because I want you to be able to explore the scale—I used when writhing this song. This song is simple to learn and can be played without consideration, one could play this song, if they wanted too, five to twenty minutes without stopping. Once the rhythm is established the hands do the rest, they kind of takeover, that is if you know this scale.

I was taught this scale by my piano teacher. He briefly showed it to me, most likely thinking I would not have kept it with me, but I did. I quickly showed it to my younger brother, "look I can play Jazz," I said.


Not too long ago I was watching some of his online videos and sure enough it had the same effect on him as it did me, he remembered it; he could play it, and wanted to play it.

The notes in the scale that I was shown by my piano teacher, *very briefly*, is C, E flat, F, G flat, G, B flat and C. These are the notes—*in my opinion*, these are the notes that should go in the right hand. With the left hand or the bass clef, we can use similar notes. Some of my favorites in the Bass Clef, are all those in the C minor cord, the B flat cord A flat cord and G cord, or simply notes C, B flat, A Flat and G.

If you move these notes around, in other words you play them, you might find them fun to play, and you might find that they sound like that of a Jazz tune or a Jazz Scale.

Towards the end of this book, I have included the Notes to this Jazzy Scale in the Let us C lessons—so that you can practice them, I hope you do!


Note:


Brendon Holden Happy to play for you!

Happy is a pleasant song, I practiced Happy or rather—the scale that Happy is written in at an early age. I noticed when playing rhythm and melody that all the black notes went together well, to me they almost sounded like something from the eastern side of the world.

When I was young and first started reading and playing music, I will be honest, I could not play, and I was not motivated by the structure of learning how to play, learning how to play sheet music for instance. I wanted to play, and I wanted to play now.

Just playing the black keys gave me that, playing piano without ever having been taught. If I played just the black keys, I could in a way cheat playing music.

At the time I could not play as most of the adults, so to kind of fake it, I would just play the black keys. I recommend you try it out, come up with your own rhythm for Happy.






The <u>atmosphere</u> to this song is *rich*: tobacco, beauty, oldvictorian-style houses, information fed to large unstructured stones. The older Computers!






Make the stone beat your own, the layout as written—on the sheet music is just the foundation of the beat. Try to emphasize on the stones, even if that means missing a beat in places.



Maple in her gravity must ask the question, "is forsaking ones' own scars human, humankind!"








The very first thing I learned in music was Middle C, and the place middle C resides on an 88-key piano.

Keeping this one item with me has continuously reminded me to see and play music, in my words, "C and play music."

Everyone needs a start, so I offer you one, I offer you to C music for something, and that something is a system not much different than any other system.

My wish for you is you C music as something.




Not everyone does this lesson, but I have, and it has worked for me.

As I began to study music, I found that the black keys can be both a sharp and a flat, sort of like a young adult.


I have put that to work for me by simplifying the black keys as minor, although the true minor is in a scale, for example: The C scale has another C scale, the C minor scale which—includes a few flats. Most call it the C minor scale.

If we take the C scale for what it is, and throw in some black keys, we get a minor scale.

Although most have made a system for how this works, I tell you, C minor—C's black.




This knowledge, (above picture) is a good place to begin to memorize learning how to read music. Start with C and as you familiarize yourself with the placement and structure to the lines in sheet music it can be easier to find your way around.



Notes can be easy to understand if you know "what is what," on the Bass and treble clefs.

It is easy to see that all the notes, (in the above picture,) are arranged on and in between the lines—in the same order that they are laid out on the piano.

Although each note is timed by indicators such as a hollow note or a note with a flag on top, I will not be writing about that; right now I just need to express where they are placed on the lines before we get into timing.




Scales in my opinion make the song—"that song," a song that you might be familiar with, whether it is Jazz, Pop, Rock and Roll, etc. If there is a song, most likely it fits into a scale.

For example, the scale above is C and to me it sounds like a ceremony, maybe like a wedding or a birthday party.

Remember, the C scale includes only the white Keys on the piano.



Cords were taught to me to be played in the left hand or Bass Clef, although the more I familiarize myself with music it is more like a way of learning combinations to be played in either hand.

As I grow in playing cords, I notice—that if I play a single note, and wonder what my next note could be, I know—if I follow the Cord to the note—and Scale the song is played in, I can easily find my next note.

In a way it is like finding the next word—spoken in an unexpected conversation, if I know the language and appropriate words, I can easily find a word to fit in an unexpected conversation.




Scales make a sound; each sound can be a favorite when playing them, it might be kind of like a blood type to love one scale yet rarely use another.


Learning all scales can benefit, I attempt too.

The black keys are as the above picture. Each black key can be either a Flat (b) or a Sharp (#).

If you notice one of these symbols by a note on the clefs on a line you will know to play a Black note instead of the White.




C in is all about a start to music, although you do not have to start here, I did, and now I C music, and I enjoy every day with the ability.



As I mentioned in the statement after the song Knowing all, Can I say Jazz? I am not totally sure if this can be considered a Jazz scale, but I would call it one, it sounds Jazzy enough to me.

The red in the above picture can help you learn these few basic notes, that when played at a good speed can make you feel as a wonderful musician and Jazzy.



This is one of my favorite techniques when playing without knowing, play one color at a time.

All the black can sound well together and inspire one to move onto greater scales, longing to hear more familiar sound.
