

In 1525 Martin Luther and Katie von Bora married. Why does it matter that a former monk married a former nun? They married because of massive theological shifts in the Protestant Reformation. This first of three sessions sets the stage for reflections on gender, companionship, and sexuality through ongoing faith reformation.

Even before his own marriage in 1525, Martin Luther used marriage as a metaphor for the relationship between Christ and the believer. The Rev. #### **Theme**

Sexuality, pleasure, and bodily autonomy are sacred gifts from God. Rooted in Lutheran theology, the Rev. Dr. Elaine Neuenfeldt (she/her) will talk about the body as a site of divine encounter and human dignity, which calls for ethical responsibility, honoring consent, and the agency to make decisions about one's body. Faith communities are invited to embrace love in all its diversity, resist shame, and foster justice, freedom, and joy as holy expressions of grace.

Dr. Salinas-Lazarski (she/her) will be discussing Martin Luther's redefinition of chastity through his work "On Monastic Vows" and reflection on his life. In analyzing these particular pieces of Luther's works and life, his theology allows for the affirmation of sexuality and interrogation of chastity in conversation with conscience.


