WORSHIP GUIDELINES

Worship will be conducted using the following protocol:

- ↑ The seating capacity has been reduced to a maximum of 50 worshipers.
- ☆ Temperatures will be taken upon entering the building and sign in will be requested.
- ☆ The restrooms will be occupied by one person at a time.
- ⊕ Bulletins and sanitizing supplies can be obtained in the narthex.
- ♣ There will be a vacant row between worshipers to maintain a proper, safe distance.
- ↑ There will be no passing of the peace or personal contact during the service.
- ⊕ Communion will be distributed by means of a sealed individual package containing a wafer and grape juice.
- ♣ Offerings will not be received during the service; an offering plate will be available at the entrance to the sanctuary.
- ☆ There will be no personal greeting at the door before or after worship.
- ♣ All conversation after worship is encouraged to take place outside the building.

We pray that this worship service, though different, will be meaningful and uplifting.
