




2004 yearbook included testimonies from FFA members about the impact of FFA on their lives. Here is a testimony from FFA officer Teresa Donovan.




It was during the 2000s, that the Ralph Baskett Family make a substantial donation to the Peoria FFA that would ensure ongoing scholarships for years to come.

Ralph Baskett was an active Peoria FFA member and All-State Basketball player who graduated in 1941. He received a scholarship to play Basketball at the University of Arizona, but after one year joined the Navy Air Corps to fight in World War II. After the war, he returned to Peoria to work on the farm.



Even though he never finished college, he never stopped learning. He took classes on mechanics so he could do his repairs. When welding came along, he took classes on that and then bought himself a machine and continued to do his work. He learned metal lathe and bought one and in the later years even mastered the computer for his needs.

The picture you see is of the family farm. The road on the bottom of the picture is 75th avenue and on the right is Thunderbird. For you youngsters in the audience this is what is now mostly an empty lot, and the KFC-Taco Bell would be at the top of the picture.


