Society, Student Council, Mat Maids, Interact, Diamond Dolls, German Club, Rocket Club, Rodeo Club, Med Start, Model U. N., and Hikers Club. Students had many options and involvement was ingrained in PHS students

- 1975 was the year that Coach Mitokawa stepped down as the head football coach.
- In 1975 Vicki Lyall and Nancy Beck took second in doubles in the State Badminton Championships.
- One of the larger clubs on campus was the Mat Maids. They
 were set up to keep the score at wrestling matches, especially at
 the Peoria Invitational. They were considered the best Mat
 Maids in the entire state by officials.

- The school and student government did their part in helping the needy by providing Christmas boxes for people during Christmas.
