
Notes From the Green and Gold

- For the first time since the 1950s there were two principals that served in a decade.

- In 1994 the football team was crowned State Champions when they tied Sahuaro of Tucson in the final game. Leading the Panthers were Tavon Cooper, Jeff Johnson, Kenny Mitchell, and Mike Kalin.
- During the 1993-94 school year the Peoria Parent Booster Club had 283 members. Their largest membership ever.
- During the 1995-96 school year the girls' soccer team won the regional championship under coach Greenberg. Darice Castro and Cassandra Nelson were key members of the team.
- Mrs. Vinck in 1992 was given an award for her excellence in English and was able to take a trip to visit England as her reward.
- School Team was started in the 1990s to counsel students, tutor and help younger students adjust to high school life. It was a very successful program.

- In 1993 the Peoria Football team went 10-0 during the regular season. It was probably one of the most talented Peoria teams ever. They lost, however, in the semifinals when quarterback Nathan Sanders broke his collar bone.
- In 1992 the Peoria student body created one of the best things ever when they created
 the Buddy System for special needs students. Peoria is a very welcoming school, and the
 school had a very large population of special needs students. This was set up to help
 them with school and promote their self-esteem. It was a great program and very
 successful.
- The 1993 Golf Team had their most successful season ever when they won the Region Championship and were 5th in the State. The team was led by Jamie Harrell and Chad Webb.

- The Girls' Basketball Team won the region championship und Coach Bill Gollihare. The team was led by Angela Reyes, Kalani Hui Hui, and Latavia Kelly.
- In 1990 the Varsity Football team led by Aaron Franklin lost in the finals of the State Championship to Sabino 33-28.
- Peoria has always distinguished itself in wrestling. In the 1980s they had two four-time State Champions and defeated the powerhouse Sunnyside Blue Devils twice in the Peoria Invitation. However, this was all topped by the four state championships in 1996,97,98 and 99. The Panthers under Coach Sammy Chagolla won the four state championships and were as dominant a program as ever in the state of Arizona.
