What happened to these businesses?

- Smitty's moved into Peoria in the 60s. It no longer is there but at the time it was a restaurant, a grocery store, and a place where products were sold at lower prices.
- With growth new supermarkets came into the area and were competition.
- Growth moved north and if you wanted to stay with your customers you had to move where it was more convenient to provide your services.
- Some of the younger members of the family did not want to continue with the family-owned businesses.
- More of the older families in Peoria moved out and some of the old stand customers left the city.
