

What is this?


Team 2992 will be presented with a resolution at the state capital. This is a huge honor for our team. This is a student only event. We will meet and travel by bus.

Dress code: Student must wear their Polo and black slacks.


Transportation: Meet at 6:30am and arriving back around 4:30pm.

BOOSTER CLUB


Every year the Booster vote on an Executive Board. Most of the board members have maxed out their term limit and will have seniors. Nominations will open May 15th and close on May 20th.


On **May 22, 2025, at 6pm** a booster meeting at Mandeville Public Works will be held to determine the 2025-2026 Executive Board Members. During this time, there will be a run-off where each person will be given the floor to speak to general membership. New board members will be announced on May 23rd.

The primary goal is to support 2992 and to facilitate the membership support to the team. Per the bylaws, The Booster Club has no rights and/or authority in team and daily operations.

DUTIES OF THE OFFICERS





TREASURER- Write the checks/pay any invoices after documented approval of President of Vice President, and prepare the budget to be presented to the membership by July 1st for the fiscal year. Present Treasurer's report at meetings.

RECORDING SECRETARY- Records minutes of all meetings and distributes them. Records amendments to the bylaws, updates them and distributes them to the membership and faculty sponsor. Sign checks as second signature.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY- Shares record keeping duties with the Treasurer. Reconcile the bank statements. The financial secretary should not be on the signature card and should review the monthly bank statements to ensure they match the Treasurer reports.
