



In 2008, through a partnership between the CDVSA and the Alaska Network on Domestic Violence & Sexual Assault, the "Real Alaska Men Choose Respect" campaign was born in an effort to engage men in the work of ending domestic violence, sexual assault, and child abuse. As part of that campaign, former, Governor Sean Parnell was asked to film a

public service announcement, along with other Alaskans, to help raise awareness.

In December of 2009, Gov. Parnell pledged that Alaska would take every step necessary to stop the epidemic of domestic violence, sexual assault, and child sexual abuse in Alaska, and began his statewide "Choose Respect Initiative."

Since then, we have witnessed more and more Alaskans finding the courage to speak, and the strength to act. Alaska started with 18 partner communities. By March of 2014, more than 170 Alaskan communities participated in Choose Respect marches, rallies, and community events.

Together, we are sending messages of hope and healing to the many who have suffered from crimes of violence and helping to engage communities in effective strategies to prevent violence in the future. We invite you to join us in continuing efforts to support and spread awareness for the Choose Respect Initiative.

SEXUAL ASSAULT AWARENESS MONTH



April is Sexual Assault Awareness Month (SAAM), a time to raise awareness about sexual violence and take action to prevent it. Sexual assault affects individuals of all genders, ages, and backgrounds, and preventing it requires a community-wide effort.

Sexual assault refers to any unwanted sexual contact or behavior without consent. It includes harassment, coercion, and physical acts of violence. By fostering a culture of respect and support, we can help prevent these harmful acts and create a safer environment for all.

HOW WE CAN PREVENT SEXUAL ASSAULT AS A COMMUNITY

Educate Ourselves and Others

 Learn about consent, healthy relationships, and bystander intervention.

• Speak Up and Support Survivors

- Believe and support survivors without judgment.
- Share resources and encourage reporting when survivors feel safe to do so.

• Promote Safe Spaces

- Establish zero-tolerance policies for harassment and violence in schools, workplaces, and public areas.
- Encourage open conversations about boundaries and respect.

Practice and Teach Consent

- Ensure consent is always enthusiastic, informed, and given freely.
- Teach children and young adults the importance of personal boundaries and respecting others.

• Engage in Bystander Intervention

- Speak out when witnessing inappropriate behavior.
- Distract, delegate, or directly intervene to prevent potential harm.

• Support Local Organizations

Volunteer with or donate to organizations that provide support to survivors.

2025 MARKS OUR 40 YEAR ANNIVERSARY



The "Lee Shore" shelter in Kenai, Alaska, was founded through the efforts of Giselle Roberts, Sharon Jean, and Pat Miles to provide a safe haven for victims of domestic violence. With the Women's Resource Center's (WRCC) backing, the Shelter Steering Committee, composed of community volunteers, raised funds and coordinated construction despite initial skepticism. The City of Kenai leased a 4.5-acre site, lending credibility to the project. Fundraising events raised significant funds, while local businesses and volunteers donated labor, materials, and expertise. Designed by architect Carmen Gintoli, the shelter was built to house up to 20 women and children for temporary stays. WRCC staff and volunteers played a crucial role in advancing construction, and in 1984, the shelter was named "Lee Shore" to symbolize a safe harbor. The project's success showcased the community's dedication to supporting domestic violence survivors.

40 years later, The LeeShore Center in Kenai, Alaska, continues its mission to promote healthy families and a violence-free community while providing a safe haven for victims of domestic violence and sexual assault. The center offers a 34-bed emergency shelter, recently expanded to accommodate both men and women simultaneously. Services include 24-hour intervention, advocacy, educational support groups, assistance to abused or neglected elders and individuals with disabilities, and a Transitional Living Center for homeless victims seeking a substance-free, violence-free lifestyle. The center also operates a state-approved Batterer's Intervention Program aimed at helping individuals cease violent behaviors. In fiscal year 2023, The LeeShore Center served 104 residents for nearly 5,000 bed nights in the emergency shelter and 40 residents for just over 3,000 bed nights in transitional housing. The center answered 300 crisis calls, made nearly 11,000 safety check calls, provided legal advocacy for almost 1,000 individuals, and reached 3,000 local students through 150 educational presentations.
