Alaskans Choose Respect

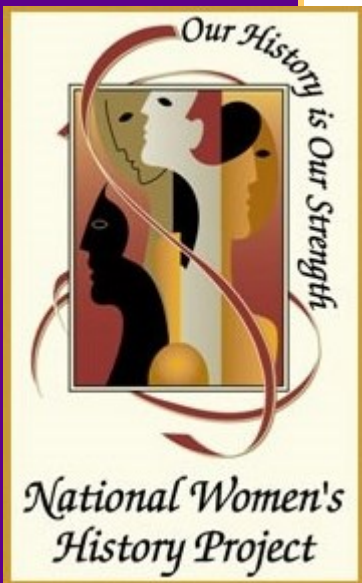

Meet Our Board

Jeannie Young is a new board member. In 2009, Jeannie waved goodbye to her best friend, Sarah Parks, as she headed into the airport after a wonderful vacation in Idaho. A few short hours later, as she waited for her next flight, she received a phone call that took her breath away and broke her heart. Sarah was found dead in her home, she and her unborn daughter victims of domestic violence.

Jeannie felt like she was living in a Lifetime movie. She immediately drove back across the country and found herself in a whirl of police and FBI interviews. The case was picked up by the media and viewed by the nation. Unfortunately, Jeannie and her husband lost more than one friend that day. Sarah's husband Silas was a close friend for many years. He is now serving 40 years in prison. Sarah's unborn child will never get to play with Jeannie's own children.

The entire community lost that day; elementary students lost their teacher, their church community lost a devout and outwardly happy couple, and friends and families lost love. Nothing is without its silver lining though. The positives to come out of this ordeal were that the local university started a deeper push against domestic violence, people on a national level had more awareness of domestic violence, and Jeannie realized she needed to honor Sarah's memory by sharing her story, helping people and working hard to lend a hand when she can.

Jeannie is happy to be serving on the Board and looks forward to a wonderful new year.

Tuesday - Domestic Violence Support Group 1:00 - 3:00 The group is for women who are currently in an abusive relationship or who have experienced domestic violence in the past.

Thursday - Parenting for Women 1:00 - 3:00 An educational support group focusing on child development, logical and non-violent consequences for behavior and how to be a kind, yet firm parent.

Friday - Changing Patterns 1:00 - 3:00 An educational support group for women experiencing negative emotional patterns in their daily lives, which may be due to victimization (domestic violence/sexual assault) or substance abuse.
