Meet Our Board

Mike Dimmick is the new Treasurer for the LeeShore Board, but a long time community member. He writes,

"I am 73 years of age and have lived in Alaska since 1962. My family and I moved from Anchorage to Ninilchik in the spring of 1969. At the time, I was working on drilling rigs for various contractors in the Inlet, onshore the Kenai Peninsula and the Slope. In 1975 we bought Mama's Kitchen, a small take-out restaurant on the highway next to the gas station, and ran that until we moved to Kenai in 1991. I went to work for Amoco Production Co. on their offshore platforms in the Inlet in 1976. I retired from Unocal in 2004. Unocal

bought Amoco's interests here in 1990. I spent 16 years as Production Foreman/ Platform Supervisor for both Amoco and Unocal. At various times I was in charge of Platforms Bruce, Anna, Baker, Dolly Varden, and at the time of my retirement, Granite Point Platform and Granite Point Tank Farm.

While in Ninilchik, I was involved with chartering the Ninilchik Rifle and Pistol Club. I was on the Ninilchik State Fair Board for several years and President for I believe 3 yrs. During this time, we built the large main fair building. I was also a founding member of the Ninilchik Ambulance Association, and drove Ambulance for several years. This Association evolved into the present Ninilchik Emergency Services.

After we moved to Kenai in 1991, my wife Marilyn and I became involved with Habitat for Humanity. I was on the Board since 2000, and had served as President for most of that time. I am currently Chair of Church Council of the Kenai United Methodist Church, and also on the Staff- Parish Committee, and Lay Delegate to the Alaska Missionary Conference.

I am Secretary of Kenai Elks Lodge #2425, and am a Past Exalted Ruler and Past Trustee of the Lodge.

I am also a member of The Alaska Walk to Emmaus Community and a member and past president of the Governing Board of Directors of Alaska WTE.

I am a member of the Board of Directors of Cook Inlet Council on Drug and Alcohol Abuse (CICADA). Also, I am a member of and Secretary / Treasurer of the Board of Directors of KDLL Public Radio.

I was Clearinghouse Coordinator for LOVE In the Name of Christ of the Kenai Peninsula, until Marilyn needed more care at home due to illness. She passed away in July, 2012.

We have 5 daughters, two of which still live on the Peninsula. Of our ten grandchildren, 4 live here as do our 2 great-grandchildren."

• Tuesday - Changing Patterns 1:00 - 3:00 An educational support group for women experiencing negative emotional patterns in their daily lives, which may be due to victimization (domestic violence/sexual assault) or substance abuse.

• Thursday - Parenting for Women 1:00 - 3:00 An educational support group focusing on child development, logical and non-violent consequences for behavior and how to be a kind, yet firm parent.

• Friday - Domestic Violence Support Group 1:00 - 3:00 The group is for women who are currently in an abusive relationship or who have experienced domestic violence in the past.
