In our time, Christmas has become over commercialized. We are surrounded by voices of people who could only talk about Christmas parties, Christmas cards, Christmas baking, presents and decorations. In this busy time of the year one should not miss the meaning and the message of Christmas.

To some shepherds keeping watch over their flock the angel of the Lord came upon them and said “Fear not; for behold, I bring you good news of great joy, which shall be to all people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, which is Christ the Lord”. That is what Christmas is all about. The purpose of Christmas is not hidden from this world. It was announced to the world in songs and voices. While the message we hear today may not come the same way as it was to the shepherds, the message of Christmas is not hard to find because it is revealed to anyone who is willing to listen.

Rediscovering the purpose of Christmas begins with God calling us to make this season of Advent a very special time because nothing happens unless we are awake, alert and aware of God coming to us in a baby to embrace us in love and give the gift of joy in our hearts

### **Sanctuary Windows Project**

In 2017, it was decided to repair and replace the stained glass and outside windows in the church and a request for donations was made for this project. The response was great and \$50,000.00 was raised. Work began on the lower windows. Southern Glass Works and Friar's Stained Glass Studio were contacted. Southern Glass made the outside windows. The stained glass was removed and taken to Regina for needed repairs. After several weeks the new windows were installed. Southern Glass replaced the old outside windows with new double-paned PVC units. The repaired stained glass was picked up and installed by volunteers. The work done on the outside and on the stained glass is excellent.

In 2018, we started on the large balcony windows. Southern Glass designed new frames for the outside windows and the stained glass was removed and taken to Friar's for repairs. In October, the new units from Southern Glass were installed and the

The total cost was more than the money raised so the board decided to pay for the extra cost from the Memorial Fund. Over run costs were \$11,000.00. The total cost of this project was \$61,000.00 and many hours of volunteer help.

These windows badly needed repair and should now be good for many years to come. Thank you to everyone who helped and supported this project in any way.

Our first project is the Ten Thousand Villages when they come from Saskatoon and bring their treasures collected from many different countries of the world. There are some pretty unique treasures.
