FAITH AND HUMOR ONLINE STUDY GROUP

For four Tuesdays at 7:30 pm in October (2, 9, 16 & 23) the Christian Education Committee is sponsoring an online video series for discussion and reflection. It may sound counterintuitive, but humor and laughter are some of God's greatest gifts. In this course pastor and stand-up comic Susan Sparks offers clever insights into how we can see humor as essential to the spiritual journey. The four presentations are entitled: Faith & Humor; Humor and the Bible; Humor and Healing; and Humor and Empowerment. The sessions will be facilitated by Vic Wiebe and should last 45 minutes to an hour. Also, arrangements are being made for Bonnitta Whitrow, now a member of our congregation and a leader in laughter workshops to engage with us for a brief time at the end of one of the sessions.

It is hoped that the time and length of the sessions would make it attractive for some of the parents of our Sunday School children to attend for their own development and to get to better know others in the congregation.
