EX PARTE MOTION FOR SERVICE BY OTHER MEANS

- (ii) Direct in such order that upon completion of service, Defendant must file a response to the Complaint within twenty (20) days.

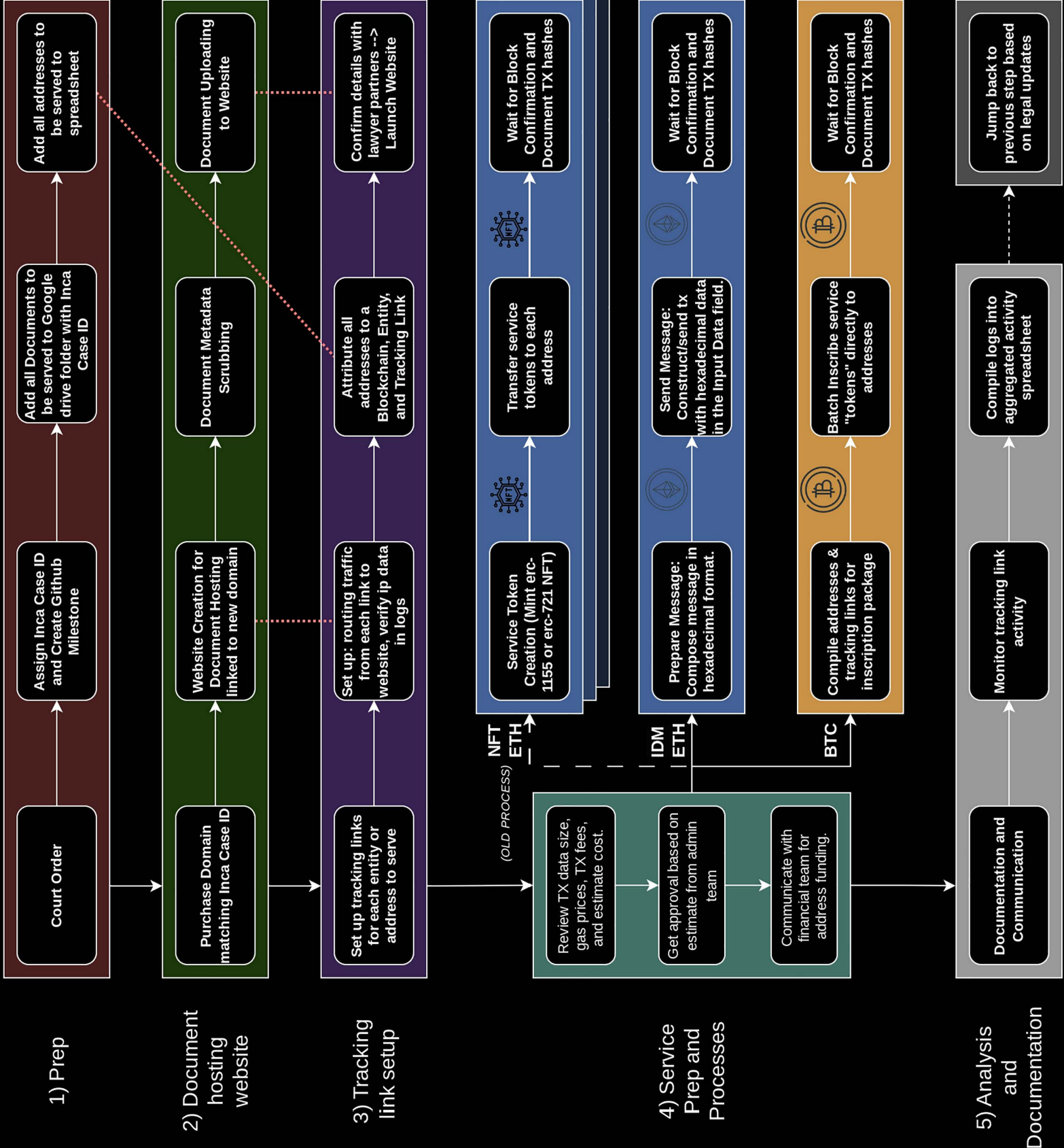
