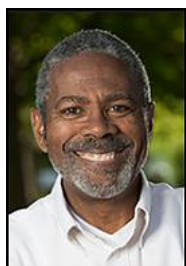

Dr. Edward Bynum is a psychologist practicing in Amherst, MA. Dr. Bynum specializes in the treatment of health mental problems and helps people to cope with their mental illnesses. As a psychologist, Dr. Bynum evaluates and treats patients through a variety of methods, most typically being psychotherapy or talk therapy. Patients usually visit Dr. Bynum because they have been experiencing depression, anxiety, stress, or anger for a significant period and are seeking help. Psychologists may perform a variety of exams and assessments to diagnose a mental condition.



T. Owens Moore, Ph.D. is trained as a Physiological Psychologist. He is a graduate of Lincoln University in PA, and he has an M.S. and a Ph.D. from Howard University. For more than twenty years, he has served as a college professor, a biomedical researcher, and an African-centered scholar/activist. He is a distinguished educator who appreciates interdisciplinary studies. He has served as an Assistant Professor at Morehouse College in Atlanta GA and an Associate Professor and Chairperson of the Department of Psychology at Clark Atlanta University, and Professor and Chair of the Department of Psychology at Fayetteville State University in North Carolina. His specialty courses are both in the field of Neuroscience and African-Centered Psychology.



Linda James Myers, PhD, is a well versed African American psychologist, having received her Master of Science in school psychology from Kansas Teachers State Teachers College (Emporia State University), and her PhD in clinical psychology from Ohio State university. She is known for her critique of traditional western psychological frameworks and her research on African centered psychology. She is currently a professor in Ohio State University's Department of African American and African Studies. She is known around the world for her theory of optimal psychology, which she has held lectures on in Jamaica, Ghana, and Britain. She is a former president of the Association of Black Psychologists.
