
SUGGESTED EMERGENCY WILDLAND FIRE EVACUATION ROUTES

PLEASE NOTE:
To the extent possible, the roads represented in this map include all the roads that are referenced in the Plumas County physical address system. This map may not include representation of all the roads with the area. Some forest roads and un-named private driveways may not be included. The insertion of a road in this map should not imply the right of public access. In some cases, the right of private road access is allowable only by the permission of the owner. This is a work in progress and may contain errors and omissions.

Your evacuation route may change according to fire direction and fire behavior.
If in doubt, get out and notify your family or loved ones of your location.
