

45-50 kHz

Wingspan: 24-27.5 cm
a.k.a "The Water Bat", as it hunts close to
the surface of water.

Noctule Bat
Nyctalus noctula

20 kHz

Wingspan: 32-40 cm

Largest species of bat by wingspan.
Roosts almost exclusively in tree holes.
Hawks over fields, diving steeply for prey.

Serotine Bat
Eptesicus serotinus

32 kHz

Wingspan: 32-38 cm

Largest species of bat by body length (8cm).
Roosts almost exclusively in buildings.
