POSITION OBJECTIVES

 Provide services as part of a team to young people (ages 11-25 years old) with substance use problems and/or mental illnesses and/or maladaptive coping skills and/or dysfunctional home life; service provision will focus on working with participants to aid in and enhance their recovery

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

- Provide individualized, ongoing guidance, coaching and support
- Assist the person served in increasing social support networks of relatives, friends and/or significant others
- Build network of and utilize community support and resources to ensure participants are connected with appropriate services for their needs
- Offer encouragement in times of crisis
- Attend staff meetings, continuing education trainings and individual and group supervision
- Observe all rules of confidentiality relating to participant information and services, both internally and when dealing with external agencies and/or individuals

QUALIFICATIONS AND SKILLS

- Valid driver's license (Transportation is provided for all participants and is required by all staff)
- One year of complete abstinence from mind altering chemicals
- Actively working a program of recovery
- Actively working a 12-step program with a sponsor (suggested but not required)
- Basic computer skills
- Ability to work flexible hours and late nights (2-3 nights a week)
- Ability to travel on overnight trips
- Provide a minimum of three references from the recovery community
- Aptitude for group facilitation using motivational interviewing (or willingness to learn) and always remain teachable

- Compassionate
- Effective boundary implementation and maintenance
