

Virginia Assembly Meeting Minutes, February 14, 2023

This meeting was held on Zoom. Attendance will be taken on the Google Drive spreadsheet. We are now using Google Drive to store Assembly documents.

Tamara Fenichel, Co-Coordinator of The Virginia Assembly, led the meeting.

- The meeting was called to order at 7:05 p EST.
- We held a moment of silence.
- Tamara read the Bevin's Declaration.

"Anyone here acting as an undisclosed federal agent or provocateur, anyone seeking to collect information for Third Parties, anyone working for some other agenda such as entrapment or solicitation or redirection of our group, and anyone who is not a declared and recorded American state national or state citizen, or is not in the process of completing their declaration is now ordered to declare themselves, or voluntarily leave the call." NOTE: This call out for declaration protects us from foreign interference and spying at the Federal, State, and Local levels.

Announcements

Kevin will try and access his local newspaper and the Washington Post to see if they will publish it. First, it will need to be edited because it was written specifically for Appomattox County. Randy still intends to hold the public library meeting on March 18. If the article is put forth as a public notice, they must publish it. If we have all the legal citations, it will put pressure on them to run the article without editing. We could also publish it as an advertisement but there will be a cost. Two people offered to assist pay for the ad. Someone will attempt to publish the article in Fredericksburg. The Declaration of Political Status has been improved and updated. It now lists references and has evidence to back up our claims. This is the document we send to the Secretary of State, and we intend to send it to our Trustees. It is recommended that you complete this and record it because it will serve you better than the former one. It will help you if you are serving notice.

5. Lorrayne: transfer of banking from herself to new Treasurer, Tamara. Tamara's name is being added to the account and Lorrayne is willing to stay on the account as a back-up Treasurer in case of emergency.

(Any mistakes in this paragraph belong to Scott Severt). Scott suggested that new members be informed of the different theories of how to counteract the corporate government. For example, Anna Von Reitz relies on promoting the 4 pillars and standing up our land and soil government again, she also explains how one can obtain a debit card to offset invoices against our bonds; Richard Warren's approach is to remove yourself from the corporate realm but to work within their courts (at times) and to use their laws to hold judges, public officials, attorneys, LEO's etc. accountable. He also promotes the use of offsets and MOA's (money on account). Paul Stramer uses the method of keeping one foot in the corporate world and one foot in the sovereign world. I am less familiar with his methods. It is important that we understand every approach, its advantages and

disadvantages so that we know best where and how to plug ourselves in and to know which approach suits each person best, or does the best approach depend on the specific situation?
