Hi Nelson,

It was great to hear from you today. Per your request, I'm forwarding the 100% design showing the proposed staging lot for the project. It's 9.8 acres. We have taken a much smaller area than we originally proposed. I also included another map that shows the temporary access ramp to the staging lot which will be used by the contractor for access. The drawing shows 1-24" diameter PVC pipe but the plan that Raymond Lagorio is more defined as to what he needs to have installed. Since the corp will not start construction till July or August of next year, Raymond informed me that its best for him to install the culverts needed making sure that the irrigation from syphons and ditches is not interrupted. We also attached a new exhibit for the removal of trees and relocation of the 10 elderberry shrubs. We look forward to working with you Nelson and working with Mark. We need the following:

- 1. A letter indicating that the original mitigation area proposed by the corp along Tenmile slough and staging lot will not work due to impacts on syphons and irrigation ditches. We appreciate your expedited delivery of this letter.
- 2. Signed ROE (attached) for the tree removal and elderberry relocation. It's critical that we receive the signed ROE since we must do the Elderberry relocation this November and remove the trees prior to February 15, 2023. Can we receive the signed ROE this week?
- 3. We need the piping drawing and cost estimate for installation for the culverts to be installed at the staging lot area. We have agreed with Raymond Lagorio that once we receive the drawing and cost estimate, we will in turn submit the payment to you to pay Raymond and allow him to get the needed 24" diameter PVC culverts installed now. This will assure that no interruption occurs to watering and irrigation during construction.

We will be sending some comps on the mitigation area west of the project which we have sent you exhibits on last week.

RIGHT OF ENTRY

The undersigned "PERMITTOR" hereby grants permission to the State of California Department of Water Resources on behalf of the Sacramento and San Joaquin Drainage District (SSJDD), acting by and through the Central Valley Flood Protection Board, its employees, agents, and contractors, collectively hereinafter referred to as "PERMITTEE," to enter upon PERMITTOR's land in the County of <u>San Joaquin</u>, described as that portion of Assessor's Parcel No.(s) 071-150-060, and 071-150-070 marked on the attached map, for the purposes of access, a haul route, vegetation clearing, vegetation transplanting and incidental uses thereto subject to the following conditions:

- This permission is not a waiver in any way of the right to just compensation for such land or of any remedy authorized 1. by law to secure payment thereof, or of any right to relocation assistance.
- PERMITTEE will, without unnecessary delay, negotiate with the undersigned PERMITTOR and any other person, 2. having any right, title, or interest in said property, to agree upon terms of compensation, and if agreement cannot be reached, PERMITTEE will promptly commence eminent domain proceedings to have such compensation determined. Where a condemnation action is commenced, this permission shall extend until final determination of said action.
- PERMITTOR hereby agrees to grant a permanent easement to SSJDD sufficient for the access, operation, 3. maintenance, repair, rehabilitation, reconstruction, and replacement of said flood control works, appurtenances, and incidents thereto. Said easement shall be within the area(s) identified in this Right of Entry.
- The effective date of "possession" shall be the date signed as "accepted" by PERMITTEE, as written below. 4.
- PERMITTEE will pay interest at the rate of the State Surplus Money Investment Fund to accrue from the date of 5. possession to the date a warrant is issued by PERMITTEE. Such interest shall be computed on the amount of payment for the real property area set forth on the attached description or outlined on the attached map, and damages thereto, irrespective of settlements or payments made for other adjoining lands.
- PERMITTEE agrees to indemnify and hold harmless PERMITTOR and to either repair or pay for any damage caused 6. by reason of the use authorized by this Right of Entry.
- PERMITTEE reserves the right to terminate this Right of Entry via written notification upon PERMITTEE's 7. determination that no permanent rights are necessary over the property, that the property is not required for the project, that the project is cancelled, or for any other reason whatsoever. If PERMITTEE determines that only temporary rights are required for the construction of the Project, PERMITTOR acknowledges that no permanent rights will be acquired and that PERMITTOR will only be entitled to reimbursement for any damages incurred and just compensation for the use of PERMITTOR's property.









We also realize the importance of have 100% access to the syphon at all times. It's to our understanding that the corps original proposal to have some of the rice farms taken and be over the existing SSFM is not a good viable option. Having a mitigation site in one location is much better than having several ones throughout. There is more economics of scale in doing it this way. We appreciate your feedback on this.

Dear Senator Stern:

On behalf of Reclamation District 2119, we write in strong support of SB 1065 (Eggman). This bill will help keep our waterways clean, safe, and address the harm that commercial abandoned and derelict vessels (CADV) cause by creating a statewide program to fund the inventory, removal, and destruction of these vessels as well as a Coordinating Council to provide program oversight and coordination of removal efforts.

Unlike recreational vessels, such as ski, fishing and house boats, a statewide program does not exist to fund the removal and destruction of CADVs. State and local agencies have to rely on cooperation by vessel owners, lengthy legal approaches such as trespass and nuisance abatement actions, and limited federal actions.

The limitations and disjointed federal, state and local authorities and responsibilities coupled with no ongoing funding is a significant impediment to addressing this problem. SB 1065 addresses this issue by creating a statewide program and Coordinating Council of federal, state and local agencies that will identify, prioritize and fund the actual removal of CADVs from California's waterways.

Without a program and ongoing funding, CADVs will continue to cause environmental harm and damage to California's water quality, habitat, and ecosystems.

For these reasons, Reclamation District 2119 requests your support for SB 1065 when it comes before you in the Senate Natural Resources Committee. Thank you for your consideration.
