### Reign or Rule?

The difference between a Reign and a Rule (Reigning or Ruling) is often unclear. After studying both the Greek and several dictionary references to both Reign and Rule, I offer the following conclusions.

We lived in the United Kingdom (Britain) for several years while I worked on my Doctorate in Systematic Theology. There are no "citizens" in the U.K. They are "subjects." Yet the Sovereign (Monarch, King or Queen) no longer has any significant political power. Her Prime Minister runs the government. Yet we found that the Monarch has tremendous Influence over values, loyalties and customs, especially in England and Wales, considerably less in Scotland and even less in Northern Ireland. Then I understood the difference. The Prime Minister Rules, but the Queen still Reigns. She is the Head of State in the U.K. and in 17 other Commonwealth Countries each of which has their own Prime (First) Minister (ruler). These 17 are called "Commonwealth Realms."

Below is some research from the Greek dictionary and modern English language dictionaries:

#### **REIGN**
