How to Make a Quilt Sleeve

Quilt Shows usually require quilts to have a sleeve for hanging attached to the back of the quilt. A standard measurement is approximately 4 inches wide and a little less than the width of your quilt.

- A well positioned sleeve will allow your quilt to show the best advantage..
- A gap of about 1 inch between the edge of your quilt and the sleeve sleeve to work properly.
- Table runners, place mats etc often require a sleeve across the narrow width.

There are many tutorials online telling you how to make a sleeve or you may have your favourite method. Below is just one way to make and attach a sleeve.

finish short edges so - Measure Clean B they wont fray. eg turn over width of quilt and top stitch, serge, zig-zag. and deduct 1 inch. Cut fabric 1/2" hems on for sleeve 5" Turn jup both long edges wide by above ength about 1/2" form top of quilt I" from side edge E. Bottem edge 33/4 Position of Sleeve top below top edge of sleeve. Allows room edge F. Hand Sew sleeve in place
