If no other suggestions from school you could try anything from my Instagram, Facebook or Website or one of the following:

Maths:

- Baking; encourage discussion on weight, cup measures etc.
- Water play with baking equipment; encourage discussion on cup measures etc.
- Legos or blocks; encourage discussion about numbers on the bricks, in a tower, groups of etc.
