## First Official Visit Message

The District Deputy Grand Master is the "captain" or "quarterback" of the team. Each one of the team members has specific duties to assist lodges if needed. The District Instructor is available to assist each lodge in his district with learning all aspects of the esoteric work at the request of the lodge. The District Communications Officer will assist in the delivery of internal and external communications in his district, increase member and public awareness, and other programs in his district. A – Attract
R – Retain
R – Reinstate
O – "One Aim"
W – "Way of Life"

Grand Master Chapman believes that we, as Masons, are people's impression of Masonry. He feels the best way to attract good men to become members is to live the teachings of our fraternity in our daily lives.

Also stated in our Installation Service are the following sentences:

"May you and your associates long enjoy every satisfaction and delight which disinterested friendship can afford. May kindness and brotherly affection distinguish your conduct as men and as Masons."

Grand Master Chapman would also like all Masons to reflect on the following from the Sam Cantey Revised Masonic Burial Service:

"Let us see to it, and so regulate our lives by the plumbline of justice, ever squaring our actions by the square of virtue, that when the Grand Warden of the Heaven shall call us from our labors, we may be found ready. Grand Master Chapman would like to remind you of the A.R.R.O.W Program:

## A- Attract good quality men to the fraternity.

Good men of quality character can be found in all of our lives. We can find them in our places of Worship, the workplace and in our neighborhoods. We can attract them to our fraternity by living the kind of life that brings credit to our fraternity. In our Installation Ceremony part of the Charge to the Worshipful Master states to the Master to Charge to the brethren of his Lodge to "practice out of the lodge, those duties which they have been taught in it: and by amiable, discreet and virtuous conduct, to convince mankind of the goodness of the Institution; so that when a person is said to be a member of it, the world may know that he is one to whom the burdened heart may pour out its sorrows, to whom distress may prefer its suit; whose hand is guided by justice and whose heart is expanded by benevolence."

R- Retain the members we have. Make the meetings interesting and all Lodge functions inclusive to all so that "you and your associates long enjoy every satisfaction and delight which disinterested friendship can afford." In short, make your Lodge and Lodge functions a place where those who attend want to be there because that's where their friends are.

R- Reinstate those to membership who express interest in reinstating if they are worthy and qualified to be reinstated. Conduct in ourselves in the paragraphs above (A and First R) may encourage reinstatements.

O- One Aim, which is so eloquently stated in our Installation Ceremony "to try to please each other and unite in the grand design of being happy and communicating happiness."

W- Way of Life. Freemasonry is many things but if we live by its teachings, it is A Way of Life. The Grand Master highly recommends Freemasonry to be a way of life to all the Masons of Texas.

Grand Master Chapman has said many times that he prefers quality members over a quantity of members, but he would never complain about a larger quantity of quality members. Masonry is important and the Grand Master believes that we are all someone's impression of Masonry and we should all strive to live the kind of lives to bring credit to our beloved fraternity.

Some of the Grand Master's favorite quotes are from Theodore Roosevelt and the Grand Master believes that they can be applied to Masonry. Here are a couple of these Roosevelt quotes:

"Do what you can, with what you have, where you are." The Grand Master believes we can apply this quote to our fraternity by saying do what you can, with wat you have, where you are for Masonry. "Far and away the best prize that life has to offer is the chance to work hard at work worth doing."

Grand Master Chapman believes we can apply this quote to Masonry also because he believes the work of our fraternity is work worth doing.

The Grand Master would like for us to reflect on these quotes and for each of us to do our part for the fraternity.

Grand Master Chapman would also like for us to remember to support our youth. He believes that every young person is our Masonic youth. Remember, the opportunity to support the young people will always be present through scholarships, the Honesty and Integrity Program and through our Masonic Youth Groups: the Order of DeMolay for young men and the International Order of Rainbow Girls for young ladies. The Order of DeMolay is for young men between the ages of 12 and 21. The International Order of Rainbow for Girls is for young ladies between the ages of 11 and 20. Young people are the future of our world and the future of our Fraternity, and the Grand Master therefore feels that every young person is our Masonic Youth. Young people are our greatest resource for our fraternity and the world at large.

Grand Master Chapman hopes that all Masons and Lodges are working hard and enjoying the Fraternity. # **GRAND MASTER'S DECISIONS**

### Grand Master's Decision - 2024 - No. 1

QUESTION: Is it permissible for a Lodge to allow an Order of the Eastern Star which is an appendant body of the Most Worshipful Prince Hall Grand Lodge of Texas to use and meet in the Lodge under Art. 225?

ANSWER: Yes. The Order of the Eastern Star is an authorized organization under Art. 225. Additionally, Art. 225e permits lodges chartered by the Most Worshipful Prince Hall Grand Lodge of Texas to use lodge facilities, including anterooms and the lodgeroom, in compliance with Art. 225. Therefore, a lodge may allow a Chapter of the Order of the Eastern Star which is an appendant body of the Most Worshipful Prince

Hall Grand Lodge of Texas to use the lodge facilities, including anterooms and the lodgeroom, under Art. 225.

### Grand Master's Decision - 2024 - No. 2

QUESTION: Can a lodge provide a "lodge apron" with blue borders, the lodge number, or other decoration for members?

ANSWER: No. Art. 274 is quite clear on this matter. The apron for members "shall be made of white lambskin without border or decoration." The only exception allowed is that the lodge may provide aprons "made of white cloth" as opposed to lambskin. In no event are borders, numbers, or other decorations allowed on members aprons.

### Grand Master's Decision - 2024 - No. 3

Question 1: What makes a Master Mason a member of Grand Lodge?

Answer: Article II, Section 1 of the Constitution answers this question. Specifically, subsections (c) and (d).

Question 2: If a Mason did not previously complete a term as a Warden, he is ineligible to be appointed Worshipful Master of a reconstituted lodge.

<u>Answer:</u> Article 32 of the Laws of the Grand Lodge of Texas is the only article in our laws that addresses reconstitution of lodges, and in this scenario, it is silent. Article 276 of the Laws of the Grand Lodge of Texas states that any member of a lodge who previously served . . . as Worshipful Master or Warden of a Lodge in this Grand Jurisdiction . . . is eligible to be elected Worshipful Master. The second paragraph of Article 276 goes further to waive the previous service requirements if the "Worshipful Master is appointed by the Grand Master or designated by the Grand Lodge under the above circumstances (Lodge Under Dispensation or under designation by the Grand Lodge in a newly charted lodge)."

Is a reconstituted lodge a lodge under dispensation? No. Title II Chapter I of the Laws of the Grand Lodge outlines what a lodge under dispensation is. Is a reconstituted lodge a newly chartered lodge? Again, no, simply by its very definition – a reconstituted lodge was previously chartered, went dormant for any variety of reasons, and then given its charter back; it is not new. Since the two exceptions to the previous service requirement only apply in their respective instances, and since neither instance is covered by a reconstituted lodge, therefore, no exceptions to previous service exist and previous service is required for appointed Worshipful Masters of a reconstituted lodge.

The statutes are not explicit regarding the length of service a Warden must have to be qualified to be appointed Worshipful Master of a reconstituted lodge. But the law does tease the requirements, and the requirements infer a completed term, not a mere single day or incomplete term, in a Warden's station. As previously referenced in Article 276, the statute says that any member of a lodge who previously served as Worshipful Master or Warden is eligible to serve as Master (emphasis added).

The Charges of a Freemason, found in our laws between the Constitution and the Statutes, are more explicit. Charge IV, Paragraph 2 says in part: "when otherwise qualified, [a brother] may arrive to the honor of being the Warden, and then the Master of the Lodge." Further, in Charge IV, Paragraph 3, states: "No brother can be a . . . Master until he has acted as a Warden." These two charges taken with the past tense of serve in Article 276, tell me that a brother must complete a term as Warden prior to service as Master of a reconstituted lodge. This quotation is cited in Jurisprudence of Freemasonry. In that treatise, Albert Mackey argues: "Every member of a Lodge is eligible to any office in the Lodge, except that of Worshipful Master. Eligibility for this latter office is only to be acquired by having previously held the office of a Warden." Albert G. Mackey, Jurisprudence of Freemasonry 133 (Robert Clegg & Louis Blakemore eds., 3rd ed., 1980) This same requirement for previous, not concurrent service, is repeated in Mackey's The Principles of Masonic Law: "A necessary qualification of the Master of a lodge is, that he must have previously served in the office of a Warden." Albert G. Mackey, The Principles of Masonic Law 73 (2020).

Finally, Article 22(d) of our law forbids the Grand Master from granting dispensation authorizing one not eligible under Article 276 to serve as a Master.

Since the statute and charges all infer that a brother must have completed service as a Warden prior to being installed Worshipful Master, the appointment of a Warden who did not fully complete a term as such, is ineligible to be appointed Worshipful Master of a reconstituted lodge.

**Question 3:** Can a Mason be considered a Past Master, and be entitled to all the rights and privileges of a Past Master, if he did not fully complete a term as Warden prior to being appointed Master of a reconstituted lodge?

<u>Answer:</u> If a brother does not initially qualify to be Worshipful Master and does not subsequently complete the requirements to be otherwise elected Warden and/or Worshipful Master, his status is set aside. Grand Master's Decision 2002 No. 4 says: "If the Brother had no prior service to qualify him for installation as Worshipful Master, his status as a Past Master is set aside, and declared null and void." Therefore, any Mason who had not completed a term as Warden prior to installation as Worshipful Master of a reconstituted lodge, especially since 2002, are not considered a Past Master, and his status as such is null and void.

### A supermajority of the Committee on Jurisprudence concurs in this decision, with no objections.

# HISTORICAL OBSERVANCES

I conducted the five major historical observances on the followings dates:

- Alamo Observance: March 9, 2024
- Goliad Observance: March 23, 2024
- San Jacinto Observance: April 21, 2024
- Masonic Oak Observance: May 19, 2024
- Gonzales Observance: October 5, 2024.

At each of these observances, I gave remarks, had an oration by Right Worshipful T. Chance Chapman, Grand Orator, and laid a wreath. During my remarks at each observance, I stated that we were gathered

to remember and pay respect to those who lost their lives during the Texas Revolution. They paved the wave for the Republic of Texas and later the State of Texas. They, much like our Masonic Brothers today, came from all walks of life.

### Alamo Oration

Having been blessed to be born a Texan, like so many here today, we begin to learn about these sacred grounds and the events that took place here almost immediately upon starting our education. From history lessons, to special projects, to research papers, we can all recite the general facts of what happened 188 years ago. This is not solely a Texan pride occurrence though. Students, history buffs, and lovers of freedom all over this state, nation, and world are fascinated by the events of the brave men and women who fought, defended, and died for their hope and belief of a better tomorrow. A better Texas.

Approximately 200 men with 18 serviceable cannons defended these grounds, what the world knows as the Alamo, for 13 days, from February 23 until March 6, from the enemy. I want you to stop and think just for a moment about the length of 13 days. Almost two full weeks of wondering if this battle would end in "victory or death." Almost two full weeks of not knowing what would come from this battle - a new Republic or continued suppression from the tyrannical government they were wanting liberty from. Almost two full weeks of not knowing if each day would be their last day. At dawn of March 6, 1836, those answers came. The fighting only lasted about an hour and a half. The Alamo and its defenders were overtaken.

The world in general, and Texas in particular, are taught to "Remember the Alamo!" This phrase was the battle cry a little over six weeks after the fall of the mission at the Battle of San Jacinto when independence was gained. It may seem a simple phrase to us today. Yet, it brings to mind the importance of the battle that led to independence, the Republic of Texas, and eventually the State of Texas. I implore you to remember a little differently today.

There were approximately 200 men who defended the Alamo. A full account of them does not exist today. Men from Alabama, Arkansas, Connecticut, Georgia, Illinois, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Massachusetts, Mississippi, Missouri, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania,

Rhode Island, South Carolina, Tennessee, Vermont, Virginia, Denmark, England, Germany, Ireland, Mexico, and Scotland came together. 22 states and 6 countries had men who saw a united vision of freedom and liberty. They banded together for mutual improvement, to help each other in their journey through life, and to make the world a better place to live.

Among these men were James Bonham, James Bowie, David Crockett, Almaron Dickenson, and William Barret Travis. These names are legendary among Texas. Towns, streets, counties, schools, hotels, knives, awards, and festivities bear their names across not just our beloved state, but our country. Each has been verified to be a Freemason. It is possible that some of the remaining defenders were also Masons, but they have not been verified at this time. Freemasonry teaches men to improve themselves through the study of allegories and symbols. One of those symbols is the trowel. In operative masonry, the trowel spreads cement or another binding agent to unite building materials into one unit. Freemasons use the trowel to remind us to spread the cement of Brotherly Love and Affection. To unite into one band of friends and brothers, among whom no contention should ever exist.

Our brothers at the Alamo united into one band. They, with the other defenders, implemented the trowel that they were taught to use in their Masonic work. It was imperative that those Texians be united as they were outnumbered almost six to one. They knew that divided, there was no success. United, and they had hope. Hope for success. Hope for liberty. Hope for Texas.

The Alamo's original design was a mission, not a fortress. Founded in the 1700s, the church was built to convert Native Americans to Christianity. One can safely assume that the Holy Bible was often a fixture on these grounds. In our great fraternity, the Volume of Sacred Law is a main fixture as well. It is always open and frequently turned to by Masons. It confirms our faith, strengthens our hope, encourages our charity, and directs us to that Temple above where all is harmony, love, and peace.

To my right, there is a plaque honoring our fallen brothers. Another is beside it that is dedicated to the chartering of Alamo Lodge No. 44 which was founded on this site. That lodge still remains active today and preserves our fraternity's noble tenets of our profession - Brotherly Love, Relief, and Truth. Brotherly Love- to regard the whole human species as one family. Relief- to relieve the distress, to soothe the unhappy, to sympathize with their misfortunes, to compassionate their miseries, and to restore peace to their troubled minds. Truth- sincerity and plain-dealing distinguish us, and the heart and tongue join in promoting each other's welfare, and rejoicing in each other's prosperity. As anyone can see, these Masonic tenets resonate in those defenders as loud as the cannons that boomed here 188 years ago.

Remember the values of these men. Remember their sacrifice and what it meant to their families and loved ones. Remember to live in honor of those that gave it all for us to be here today. Remember to use the trowel and strengthen yourself and all those around you. Remember the Alamo!

### Goliad Oration

March 27, 1836. A date that changed the trajectory of Texas. On that day, an estimated 445 Texians were executed. They did not die in a battle. They did not die while fighting. They had raised the white flag following the Battles of Refugio and Coleto, both won by Santa Anna's Army, and expected to be treated as prisoners of war and with respect. Both of these losses were setbacks in the Texas Revolution. With the Alamo having fallen on March 6, within the two weeks that followed, Texas forces suffered losses at Refugio on March 15 and Coleto on March 20. The Texians were then taken to these hallowed grounds in close proximity to where we stand at this moment. Expecting to be set free, their brutal death was instead the outcome. Consider this for a moment. Where we stand is not a battlefield, not a museum, not an insignificant piece of history. Instead, it has been a graveyard due to the massacre that had taken place that day.

Just two weeks ago, the Grand Lodge of Texas marched in Grand Procession to the Shrine of Texas to "Remember the Alamo" and the Masons who paid the

ultimate sacrifice. Today, we somberly gather to pay respect to our Brother, Colonel James Walker Fannin, Jr., and others who perished on that fateful day almost 188 years ago to the day.

Having grown up on a street named for Colonel Fannin, as a teenager, I began to take a special interest in him while in school. I researched him, his life, his military experiences, and his ties to our Masonic fraternity. In summary, he was an honorable man, soldier, and Brother who applied our Masonic teachings to his daily life.

We, as Freemasons, are taught to use the working tools of operative masonry to improve ourselves. One of those, the Level, was used by Colonel Fannin during the most difficult and challenging point in his career and life. We are taught that the level represents equality. In our installation service, it is explained that "the level demonstrates that we are descended from the same stock, partake of the same nature, and share the same hope; and though distinctions among men are necessary to preserve subordination, yet no eminence of station should make us forget that we are brethren; for he who is placed on the lowest spoke of fortunes' wheel, may be entitled to our regard; because a time will come, and the wisest knows not how soon, when all distinction, but that of goodness, shall cease; and Death, the grand leveler of human greatness, reduce us to the same state."

James Fannin rallied over 300 men on February 25 to begin a relief march to the Alamo after his Masonic brothers, specifically William Barrett Travis, appealed to him for assistance. The march was delayed, and Goliad became their camp until March 19 when Sam Houston ordered an evacuation. They had barely crossed the San Antonio River when they themselves seemed to be at the lowest spoke of fortunes' wheel. The Mexican Army advanced. A retreat to Victoria slowly began. Wagons broke down. They had little food, oxen lost, and some men were barefoot on winter's ground. They made camp within sight of Goliad. The next morning, knowing that they were outnumbered, they surrendered. They, and others from the surrounding areas, were marched back to Goliad as prisoners.

On Palm Sunday, March 27, they were either shot, clubbed, or stabbed to death. The Grand Leveler of Human Greatness came for the souls of these brave men. Over 400 were killed. James Fannin, as their commander, was the last to be executed. He had three requests: his belongings returned to his family, to be shot in his heart, and to receive a Christian burial. None of these happened. His belongings were pillaged. He was shot in the face, and he was rolled into a ditch until his body was eventually burned. While this is a heartbreaking memory in Texas, we know that less than a month later, victory for Texas was on the way northeast of Goliad in San Jacinto. This massacre, along with the actions at the Alamo, lit a flame, a beacon to guide the Texian army through the darkness of revolution that would lead to the glorious future of Texas ahead.

During our tribute at the Alamo, we remembered those Texas heroes and our teachings of the Trowel; the tool that unites us into one band of friends and brothers. The Trowel and Level go hand in hand. In operative masonry, the level must be used to perfect the horizontal lines and angles before the trowel spreads the cement to bind the materials together. In Freemasonry, the level guides us to the understanding that no matter our ranks, no matter our fortunes, no matter our experiences; we are all from one stock, share one hope, and are made into a perfect angle like in operative masonry. The trowel, spreading the cement of Brotherly Love and Affection, unites us in those perfect horizontal angles from the use of the level just as our Texas forefathers were united in their hopes for freedom.

Only 14 years after the massacre, Goliad Lodge No. 94 was chartered in 1852. The lodge still meets today in the same building it erected in 1854 with stones from the Presidio La Bahia, the very place we stand today. The Masons today, just as the Masons in 1854 and Brother James Fannin in 1836, apply the teachings of both the Level and the Trowel. It is our duty to continue to do so as we honor the men who died for us to be here today. May we always remember the events that happened here. May we always, "Remember Goliad!"

San Jacinto Oration

6 months, 2 weeks, and 5 days. October 2, 1835 until April 21, 1836. The "Lexington of Texas" is a common nickname for Gonzales, the place where the War for Texas Independence began and a cry of "come and take it" was in the air in October. Through setbacks, losses, and a massacre, the Texian forces seemed to be at the brink of failure in some eyes. That was until on the exact date, 188 years ago, General Sam Houston shocked the Mexican General, Santa Anna, caught him off guard, and won independence after only 18 minutes of attack. Texas had won her freedom.

We stand here today, as proud Texans, on the very grounds where liberty and justice prevailed. Approximately 700 Texians died in the war. Most of these were at the Alamo and Goliad. As Freemasons, we honored these heroes last month with a remembrance at both the Alamo on March 9 and Goliad on March 23. This is the very thing our forefathers desired. While the battle raged on 188 years ago, those brave men yelled, "Remember the Alamo! Remember Goliad!" It was a constant chant while they avenged their fallen brothers. Today, we remember those two occurrences in addition to the one that happened here.

Just over an hour's drive from this monument, I grew up learning about the events of that day. Several field trips led me here. As a child, I could not completely wrap my head around the significance of this place. The most impressive thing to my young mind was the really tall monument - something that is still extremely impressive today. Standing at just over 561 feet, it is more than 15 feet taller than the Washington Monument in DC. Our monument is the world's tallest war monument. It is also taller than the Statue of Liberty which is only 305 feet, the Bunker Hill Memorial which is only 221 feet, and several other iconic monuments from around the globe. As the saying goes, everything is truly bigger in Texas. But, why? As we are taught in our fraternity, symbols have meanings. The meaning to you may differ from the meaning to me. That is the beauty of it all. Texans are proud of our state. It has a unique history unlike any of the other 49 states in the Union. We should all strive to keep it alive and pass it down to future generations so that we never forget the cost of our freedom.

General Sam Houston, the victor of this Battle, went on to become the President of the Republic of Texas. He also served as the Governor and later a United States Senator. To us, we remember and celebrate that he presided over the first meeting, the organizational meeting, of the Grand Lodge of Texas. He called it to order, and he presided over the election of Brother Anson Jones, the fourth President of the Republic, as our first elected and installed Grand Master.

Our Brothers, the forefathers of Texas, were active Freemasons. As such, they studied the working tools and the teachings from our fraternity. They took these and lived by the precepts they taught. Today, let us give special attention to the plumb. The plumb is an instrument used to raise perpendiculars in operative Masonry, but in Freemasonry, the plumb "admonishes us to walk uprightly in our several stations before God and man." It also teaches the rectitude of conduct. With it, we hold "the scale of justice in equal poise, observe the just medium between intemperance and pleasure, and make our passions and prejudices coincide with the line of our duty."

Surely, the builders of the monument used the plumb in the construction of that stupendous edifice. It is also my belief that our forefathers, both of Texas and the Grand Lodge of Texas, applied the teachings of the plumb to their lives and the construction of the government of both our new country and our fraternity. Without the plumb, our Grand Lodge would not be here today. Without the plumb, Texas would not have been the same. We may not be here today as Texans or even Americans.

Thank God for those 6 months, 2 weeks, and 5 days. I'm sure that it felt like an eternity at the time, but without it, our lives would have been different. Thank God for the patience and perseverance, courage and constancy, and the faith of our Texas and Masonic heroes that what they stood for was right. Those heroes have their names, which total 48, on a plaque that reads: A tribute to the fidelity of pioneer masons under whose outstanding leadership was laid the cornerstone of the Republic of Texas.

On the base of the San Jacinto Monument are eight inscriptions. One of those reads: Measured by its results, San Jacinto was one of the decisive battles of the world. The freedom of Texas from Mexico won here led to annexation and to the Mexican war, resulting in the acquisition by the United States of the states of Texas, New Mexico, Arizona, Nevada, California, Utah, and parts of Colorado, Wyoming, Kansas, and Oklahoma. Almost one-third of the present area of the American nation, nearly a million square miles of territory, changed sovereignty.

When we stop and consider this fact alone, we can see the magnitude of importance from the events that took place on these grounds. If it weren't for that victory, Texas, America, and the world would all look very different today. Our brothers from nearly 200 years ago made a difference, and we should all be grateful to them and their sacrifices.

Our observance today is not strictly a historical remembrance. It is not strictly a Masonic observance. Texas would never have existed without the leadership of dedicated Freemasons. The Grand Lodge of Texas wouldn't be in existence without the political leaders of the time allowing the fraternity to be practiced - a liberty we often take for granted these days. The history of both go hand in hand.

As we conclude today, let us remember the words of General, Governor, Senator, President, and Brother Sam Houston: I leave the result in the hands of a wise God, and rely upon His providence. My country will do justice to those who serve her. The rights for which we fight for will be secure and Texas Free!"

God bless Texas, and God bless the Grand Lodge of Texas!

## Masonic Oak Oration

On this occasion, we paused for a few moments to reflect on two different but connected subjects. Different in the sense that one is an event and the other is a person. Also, one is a specific moment in time at a certain location while the person was not at said event. They are connected by the ties of our fraternity. Today, we commemorate the beginnings of the Grand Lodge of Texas and Masonry in Texas thanks to that auspicious occasion that took place in this beautiful location under the Masonic Oak and also to remember one of our Past Grand Masters, Archibald St. Clair Ruthven.

More than 189 years ago, 5 Master Masons met at this location and changed the trajectory of the Masonic fraternity in Texas. In March of 1835, Anson Jones, John H. Wharton, Asa Brigham, James A. E. Phelps, and Alex Russell met to petition, with J. P Caldwell later included in the request, the Grand Lodge of Louisiana for a dispensation to form a Masonic Lodge in Texas. A dispensation was granted and established Holland Lodge No. 36. John Allen was given the proper paperwork and set off for Texas after the Grand Master of Louisiana, John Holland, signed it on December 27, 1835. However, it did not reach Texas until just before April 21, 1836, during the Battle of San Jacinto. Anson Jones carried the official charter in his saddlebags during the Battle. Shortly thereafter, Anson Jones was elected the first Worshipful Master of Holland Lodge. He would also become the first Grand Master of the Republic of Texas. Our brothers were finally

successful in bringing Masonry officially to Texas. Other attempts, such as Stephen F. Austin and six others petitioning the Grand York Lodge of Mexico in 1828, had failed. The meeting, under our revered live oak tree, was described by Anson Jones as, "the first formal meeting in Texas as connected with the establishment and continuance of masonry in this county." This tree is estimated to be over 400 years old and has survived many challenges. Challenges such as being struck by lightning, twice, numerous hurricanes, floods, and many other obstacles. Through these challenges, it remains strong, well-rooted, and immovable.

Today, we place a stone in memory of one of the forefathers of the Grand Lodge of Texas and in acknowledgement of his service to our fraternity. In 1841, Archibald St. Clair Ruthven was initiated in Holland Lodge No. 1. He quickly rose through the ranks and became Grand Master in 1846 and then served as Grand Secretary from 1848 until 1861. Thanks to his efforts, we have records from that time period that very well may not have happened had he not been the custodian of such an important office. He was also an active York Rite Mason, as many of our early Masonic leaders tended to be. On January 19, 1855, he was appointed as the first Deputy Grand Commander of Grand Encampment, later renamed to the Grand Commandery, of Texas at its organizational meeting in San Antonio. He was then elected as Most Eminent Grand Master, known today as the Right Eminent Grand Chapter of Texas on June 23, 1855. He served as Most Excellent Grand High Priest of the Grand Chapter of Texas in 1857-1858. While he wasn't present at the meeting under the Masonic Oak we celebrate today, he joined the lodge that resulted from it just years after it was organized. He is a direct benefit of that meeting. A Commandery was named after him in honor of his service to our beloved fraternity. Ruthven Commandery No. 2 is still in operation and thriving in 2024 - a true testament to the Texas Hero who it is named after.

As with each of the orations at the historical observances this year, I would like for us to reflect on one of the working tools of Craft Masonry. Today, the tool that we will highlight is the square. One of the more recognized symbols of Masonry, it has several meanings to us. Chiefly, it is the proper emblem of the Master of a Lodge. We are taught that it teaches morality and that we are to square our actions by the Square of Virtue. We are to act upon the square by regulating "our actions by rule and line, and to harmonize our conduct by the principles of morality and virtue." The Master, having this as his emblem of office, should be a constant reminder both to himself and the lodge he presides over of the morality and virtue we are charged with as Masons. It is easy to see how Ruthven, Jones, and the other men from the meeting under the Masonic Oak tree had these teachings as their rule and guide to daily life. If we follow the teachings of the square, we, and our beloved fraternity, will stand like our Masonic Oak- strong, well rooted, and immovable.

Today, let each of us vow to carry on the teachings and traditions that were planted here 189 years ago. Let us be the example of good men and good Masons both for our internal reflection and also the external representation to the general public. Let us use the square in our daily lives, make a commitment to better ourselves, lodges, and communities, and to honor the events that took place on these grounds.

### Gonzales Oration

On October 2, 1835, just over 189 years ago, the first shot was fired that began the Texas Revolution. The Mexican government had demanded the return of a cannon that had been loaned to the local residents of Gonzales for the purpose of defending themselves against those who wished them harm. The political environment in Mexico was uneasy at best and was spreading throughout the country. Due to the unrest, the commander of Mexican troops in Texas requested that the cannon be returned. The request was refused. Troops were sent in but to no avail. The Texians had rallied others to help, and on October 1,

they agreed to initiate a fight. A fight that would change the history of the world. The next day, the second day of October, Gonzales became home to the first shot in the Texas Revolution and would earn the nickname of "the Lexington of Texas."

While this military skirmish had little significance in the overall tactics of the Texas Revolution, it was a clear break from the Mexican government. It signified the beginning of the Revolution to separate and form a new Republic. One of the more significant moments that still rings out today was when the Texians raised a white flag with a cannon painted in black and the words "*Come and Take It*" clearly marked upon it. One could easily point to this moment as the birth of the Texas spirit, the spirit unmatched by any other of the pride of our beloved state, which we all hold in our hearts today. With suffering only a bloody nose from a man bucked off his horse, the Texians declared this battle a victory and pressed forward with the Revolution. As we know, what started here in Gonzales would lead to a successful separation from Mexico in order to form the Republic of Texas and eventually become the State of Texas in the greatest country this world has ever known.

While there is no obvious Masonic influence in the Battle of Gonzales, it is safe to assume, given that so many of our early leaders were Freemasons, that our fraternity played some role in the lives of those in Gonzales. While a lodge wasn't formally organized for another decade, the Masonic principles would still be embraced and practiced. As with each historical observance this year, I would like for us to reflect upon the symbols we use in our fraternity. While we stand here today in the home of the "first shot of the Texas Revolution," let us look back upon symbols from the first degree of Masonry.

The Working Tools of the Entered Apprentice Degree are the Twenty-Four Inch Gauge and Common Gavel. Both of these tools have their own separate importance, but together they embody a profound philosophy that resonates deeply within our lives. As Freemasons, we know that the Common Gavel was used to "break off rough and superfluous parts of stones" by operative Masons and that we use it to "divest our minds and consciences of all the vices and superfluities of life." We chisel away the rough edges of our own character- those flaws and imperfections that hinder our personal growth. Just as the stone is shaped by the gavel, so too are we shaped by our experiences, our choices, and our dedication to selfimprovement. The common gavel urges us to reflect on our actions, to strike away the vices that hold us back, and to forge a better version of ourselves.

Yet, the gavel alone cannot complete the work of the builder. The Twenty-Four Inch Gauge represents time and the importance of measuring our actions. While operative Masons use it "to measure and lay out their work," this symbol to us is to teach us to divide our time into a "portion for the service of God and a distressed worthy brother, a portion for our usual vocations, and a portion for refreshment and sleep." It reminds us to balance our lives—allocating time wisely between our duties to ourselves, our families, our communities, and our spiritual growth. It serves as a guide to prioritize our activities and ensure that we do not become so consumed by the rush of daily life that we neglect what truly matters. The commonality between these two tools lies in their purpose: both are essential in the crafting of a virtuous life. The gavel encourages us to remove unnecessary distractions and imperfections, while the gauge prompts us to measure our time and intentions carefully. Together, they form a harmonious balance of action and reflection. As we go forth, let us carry the lessons of the common gavel and the 24-inch gauge in our hearts. Let us, just as our Texian forefathers, be diligent in our self-improvement, mindful in our time management, and unwavering in our commitment to the principles of Freemasonry. In doing so, we not only elevate ourselves but also uplift those around us, creating a community built on trust, integrity, and purpose.

Today, we remember the "first shot" that was fired 189 years ago. At the same time, we remember the values of those who have come before us. We continue to remember the sacrifices made by those who fought for their rights and freedoms. Their legacy compels us to engage in the ongoing work of building a better community—a community that honors the principles of equity, justice, and compassion. The Battle of Gonzales serves as a powerful reminder of our duty as Masons to advocate for freedom and uphold the values we cherish. Let us carry forth the spirit of those early Texians in our lives and in our lodge, standing firm against injustice and fostering unity among all. May we continue to be vigilant guardians of liberty, embodying the Masonic ideals of truth, integrity, and brotherly love.
