Worshipful Master, Officers, and My Brother All,

On behalf of Most Worshipful Raborn Reader, it is both a privilege and an honor to speak before you today – not only as a Brother, but one who believes deeply in the power of leadership rooted in Masonic values.

Leadership, to us as Masons, is not measured by titles or accolades. It is measured by the impact we have on others, the light we share, our just and upright actions, and the legacy we leave behind.

Because here, among the working tools of the Craft, surrounded by Brothers who have labored side by side through darkness and light, we are reminded that to lead is not simply to direct—it is to serve in action. And to serve with honor, humility, and purpose is what truly leaves a mark on this world.

Leadership begins with our inner temple and as Masons, we understand that all great leadership begins with the self—with the internal work of refining our rough ashlar. Before we can hope to lead others, we must labor within ourselves - squaring our actions by the square of virtue, leveling our passions and keeping them within due bounds, and walking uprightly before our God and His society.

The 24-inch gauge reminds us to measure our actions by time wisely (in balance), ensuring we give to our God, our neighbor, and ourselves. The common gavel instructs us to chip away at the vices and superfluities of life that detract us from living and defending an honorable life. The plumb, the square, and the level are not just working tools—they are guides for our conduct as men and as leaders.

So first, we should lead by example, not to be followed, but to inspire. Because when we live the teachings of our degrees within our Lodges, in our homes, in our workplace and throughout our communities, society benefits. We become the kind of leaders the world needs most.

We are taught that leadership is service in its highest form. The greatest leaders in the Craft are not those who speak the loudest or wear the brightest jewels. They are the quiet, steadfast Brothers - the ones who

sweep the floors when no one is looking, who call a Brother in sickness, who visits the widow and orphan, who welcomes the new Entered Apprentice with a firm handshake and an open heart.

So, my Brothers, I ask you tonight:

My Brethren All,

Living with integrity while making an impact means aligning your personal values with the tenets and virtues of Freemasonry for the exclusive purpose of creating positive action in the hope of inspiring others to do the same. We should expect to be held accountable for our actions and we should cultivate a culture in which all expect the same. I offer a few ideas on how to approach this on a personal level, professional level, and upon a Masonic level.

1. Define the core values for yourself and your Lodge. Core values guide our culture in actions, operations, and decisions. Ask the question, are they rooted in honesty, respect, accountability? If they are not, shouldn't they be? They should be written down to reflect, contemplate, and discern. How can you utilize them as a personal compass in your daily life? How can your Lodge do the same? Will your selfless actions be recognizable by others?
2. We should lead by example and practice integrity in everyday actions - keep promises, be honest, and take responsibility. Say what you mean and mean what you say. You should inspire others as you model consistency and authenticity. What does a handshake agreement mean to you? What did it mean to your grandfather?
3. Make ethical decisions when faced with tough choices, prioritize integrity over convenience. All we really own is our reputation as defined by others. What do you want to be known for? We should ask: "Would I be proud of this decision in the future?" "Would this embarrass my family?" "How would this be perceived if it made the front page of the newspaper?"
4. We should help others without hidden agendas. Volunteer, mentor (or be mentored), and support causes that align with your values. Do it for the right reason, even if it is not an ideal time for you. Do it without the expectation of receiving a thank you. Give without expecting anything in return.
5. We should stand up for what is right (be just and upright). Speak out against injustice even when it's uncomfortable, and support ethical practices in your community, workplace, and Lodge.
6. Practice self-reflection and regularly assess whether your actions align with your core values. Be honest with yourself, and be open to feedback and willing to grow

Making an impact with integrity in your professional life means being ethical, accountable, and value-driven while striving for self-success and success for others. The greatest form of leadership is that of a servant leader.

1. Define your professional ethics and identify the values that guide your work (e.g., honesty, fairness, transparency). Ensure your actions align with these principles, even in difficult situations.

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2. Lead with accountability and be honest with yourself and accept your mistakes or failures. Learn from them and do not repeat them. Be willing to share your mistakes and what you learned from your mistakes with others for their benefit. I have heard it said before, “do as I say, not as I did.” Hold yourself and others to high ethical standards.
 3. Build trust and credibility following through on commitments and be reliable. Be honest in your communication, even when delivering difficult news. People may not like what you say, but they will appreciate and respect that you said it. Of course, how you say it is important too!
 4. Make ethical decisions under pressure. Prioritize long-term, value-added, sustainable gains over short-term “Wins.” The former requires more planning and energy (investment) over the short term, but has much more lasting positive effects. Consider a building without a foundation versus a building founded on sand versus a building founded on rock. Which will be more resilient? If faced with unethical practices or actions, address them directly or escalate them appropriately (up the organization; not downward).
 5. Foster a culture of integrity and encourage open dialogue about ethics in your workplaces and at our Lodges. We should support transparency, fairness, and respect in decision-making.
 6. Use your influence for positive change and advocate for ethical policies and sustainable practices. Mentor others in integrity-driven leadership.

Making an impact with integrity at the organizational level means embedding ethical principles into the culture, decision-making, and operations of a company or institution (Masonic lodge). So, how can we achieve this?

1. We should establish clear core values by defining and communicating the organization’s ethical principles to ensure leadership exemplifies these values in actions and decisions.
2. We should build a culture of integrity and encourage open discussions about ethics and accountability. Foster psychological safety so that Brothers feel comfortable raising concerns.
3. Implement ethical leadership and core values and train leaders to model integrity. We should hold all levels of the organization accountable for ethical behavior, regardless of position.
4. We should ensure transparency in decision-making and communicate our lodge business practices openly with the members of the lodge. We should avoid misleading information about fundraising and reporting back to the Lodges.
5. We should develop strong ethical policies and enforcement and establish clear policies on conflicts of interest compliance.

A person’s character refers to a system of values, morals and beliefs which shape a person’s behavior. Integrity is an aspect of character in which a person adheres to his principles in difficult situations or when no one is looking. If it is our desire to make a positive impact on our society, we must consider how our character and our integrity influence us personally, and how we can leverage each to benefit our Fraternity and our vocations.

2025 GRAND MASTER’S DECISIONS

Grand Master Decision No. 1

Question: Is the Grand Master required to give permission for regular, non-quarterly Lodges to cancel a stated meeting because of severe adverse weather conditions, or Acts of God?

Answer: The frequency of meetings of Lodges is governed by Art. 228 of Grand Lodge law. A Lodge is only required by law to meet as least once in three months. As long as this requirement is met, the Lodge can cancel a stated meeting without permission from the Grand Master.

Grand Master Decision No. 2

Question: A Lodge has requested permission to hold a called meeting to conduct Lodge business because the Lodge will be undergoing repairs on the date of the normal stated meeting. Is this permitted?

Answer: Art. 234 sets forth the business that must be conducted at a stated meeting of the Lodge. To attempt to conduct such business at a called meeting is not permitted.

Regular Lodges are required to only have one stated meeting each quarter. If a stated meeting is required, it is recommended that the Lodge request dispensation to hold the stated meeting at another Lodge location during the time the Lodge building is closed for repairs.

Grand Master Decision No. 3

Question: Are members of Lodges allowed to perform maintenance on their Lodge buildings on Sundays?

Answer: Yes, with the Worshipful Master's permission. A Lodge may undertake necessary maintenance, repair, or construction on any part of its building, including the Lodge room and anterooms, any day of the week and at any time, as long as such work does not interfere with the regular or called meetings of the Lodge.

This work may be performed by contractors or members volunteering their time and labor. The Worshipful Master is responsible for ensuring that any work completed upholds the dignity, security, and operational integrity of the Lodge building. This interpretation reflects the changing schedules and availability of our Brethren and overturns any prior conflicting decisions.

Grand Master Decision No. 4

Grand Master's Decision 2024 No. 3 addresses three questions concerning the qualifications and status of Worshipful Masters in restored lodges. After careful review of Articles 276 and 277 of Grand Lodge Law, and in light of the Canons of Construction, the resolution of Question 1 is upheld. However, the conclusions on Questions 2 and 3 require revision to ensure alignment with Grand Lodge's statutes.

The interpretation of Article II, Section 1(c) and (d) concerning membership in Grand Lodge Law is consistent with its plain language. This conclusion adheres to the Canons of Construction by respecting the clear intent of the statute. The resolution of Question 1 is upheld. Regarding Question 2, the laws require that a candidate for Worshipful Master must have "served" as a Warden under Article 276. However, this provision does not require full-term service. The term "served" refers to the lawful performance of duties in an office, regardless of duration. Decision 50 1973 Article 276 states that if a warden is elected and installed, he is eligible to be elected as a Worshipful Master. So, if a warden of another lodge is serving in that position, he is eligible to serve as Worshipful Master in a lodge other than the one he is a warden.

This interpretation must also be harmonized with Article 277, which governs succession. Article 277 states that the Senior Warden, or the Junior Warden if the Senior Warden is unavailable, "shall succeed to all the duties" of Worshipful Master. It imposes no additional qualifications, ensuring continuity of leadership. Reading a full-term requirement into Article 276 would render Article 277 ineffective, violating Canons IV and VIII, which mandate that statutes be read harmoniously and that no provision be rendered meaningless. Therefore, a Mason who lawfully succeeds under Article 277 is eligible to serve as Worshipful Master, regardless of his prior service's duration. The resolution of Question 2 is reversed.

The determination on Question 3, regarding Past Master status, similarly fails to align with Article 277. A Mason who lawfully succeeds to the office of Worshipful Master assumes "all the duties" of that office, which inherently include recognition as a Past Master upon completing his term. The argument against

this status improperly relies on Decision 2002 No. 4, which does not apply to Article 277's lawful succession process. Decision 2002 No. 4 addresses separate circumstances and cannot impose additional qualifications not found in Grand Lodge law. Denying Past Master status to a Mason who has served as Worshipful Master under Article 277 creates inequity. The Canons of Construction demand that all statutes work harmoniously, preserving their effectiveness and ensuring fair recognition of service. By completing his duties as Worshipful Master, a Mason fulfills the requirements for Past Master status, regardless of how they ascended to the office. The resolution of Question 3 is reversed.

Grand Master's Decision 2024 No. 3 is upheld as to Question 1 and reversed as to Questions 2 and 3. A Mason who ascends to the office of Worshipful Master under Article 277 without completing a full term as Warden is eligible to serve and entitled to Past Master status upon completing his term. This interpretation respects the plain language of Articles 276 and 277, harmonizes the statutes, and upholds the Canons of Construction.

Grand Master Decision No. 5

Question: Most Worshipful Grand Master, is the skull considered a Masonic symbol within the jurisdiction of the Grand Lodge of Texas, and may it be appropriately used on aprons, collars, and other regalia?

Answer: Yes, the skull is indeed a Masonic symbol and may be appropriately used on aprons, collars, and other regalia. The skull, often referred to as the skull and crossbones, is a traditional emblem in Masonic symbolism. It represents mortality and reminds us of our temporal existence—a profound lesson in the Craft.

Historically, its legitimacy and symbolic value are underscored by its inclusion on the original seal of the Grand Lodge of the Republic of Texas. That seal prominently featured the skull and crossbones, demonstrating its recognized and accepted use in the early official iconography of Texas Masonry. As such, its presence on regalia is not only permitted but rooted in the historical and philosophical foundations of Masonry in this jurisdiction.

Grand Master Decision No. 6

Question: Is Resolution Number 20 (2025) retroactive?

Answer: To implement the one-year statute of limitations reflected in Resolution Number 20 (2025) fairly and lawfully, the one-year period on then pending charges begins on the resolution's effective date. The one-year period on new charges begins the date the Worshipful Master signs the charges. This approach avoids improper retroactive dismissal, ensures procedural fairness, and gives full effect to the resolution within Grand Lodge's legal tradition.

Grand Master Decision No. 7

Question: Can a Grand Master's Decision be retroactively enforced?

Answer: No, a Grand Master's Decision cannot be enforced retroactively. It takes effect only upon publication and applies going forward. Retroactive enforcement would violate the constitutional principles of due notice and fair application that govern Masonic Law in Texas. Actions taken before the decision was published cannot be judged by standards that did not yet exist.

LODGE SUSPENSIONS

Richardson Lodge No. 1214 July 01 to July 31, 2025

On June 24, 2025, I was notified by a Master Mason that Richardson Lodge No. 1214 had violated the Ancient Charges of Freemasonry which are a part of the Laws of the Grand Lodge of Texas. The allegation was that one of the Lodge officers had violated Article 393 (concerning candidate qualifications); Articles 508(2) and 519 relating to fraudulent concealment or misrepresentation in petitioning and initiation procedures and the duties of lodge officers and members regarding due diligence in investigation procedures. It was further alleged that on December 5, 2017, an individual petitioned Richardson Lodge under false pretenses and that this was known to one or more of the Lodge officers.

Accordingly, on July 1, 2025, I suspended the charter of Richardson Lodge No. 1214 pursuant to article 649. I undertook a thorough investigation of these allegations assisted by members of various officers and relevant committee members of the Grand Lodge of Texas which consumed much of the late summer and early fall. As a result of this due diligence, it was made clear that an individual did petition Richardson Lodge under false pretenses. I am convinced that the signers of the individual's petition were deceived by this person and that such deception continued through the investigation and initiatory process. Unfortunately, one of the signers of the petition is deceased and the other brother is aged and has diminished mental capacity. The charter of Richardson Lodge No. 1214 was un-suspended on July 31, 2025, for the installation of officers and the return to regular business.

The individual's membership, who petitioned under false pretenses, in Richardson Lodge No. 1214 was terminated.

Brethren, this incident highlights the necessity of every Lodge exercising due diligence in both receiving and acting on Petitions of the Mysteries. Your members must genuinely know the person who presents to your Lodge. You simply cannot have your members sign someone's petition who seems to be a good citizen and an ideal candidate. You must know their current and past life circumstances and record of that person.

I want to thank the members of Richardson Lodge No. 1214 in their willingness to assist this Grand Lodge in addressing this serious matter. The matter is now concluded.
