ACTIVE LODGE DESIGNATION

LODGE SPOTLIGHT:

Royse City Masonic Lodge - Honoring Tradition, Creating Legacy



This month, we shine the Lodge Spotlight on Royse City Masonic Lodge, where a simple idea has blossomed into a meaningful tradition that's inspiring candidates and Masons alike.

At the heart of this initiative is Brother Brad D. Hauf, whose goal is clear: make the Masonic journey unforgettable from the very first step. Brother Hauf, a regular contributor on the Masonic Improvement YouTube podcast with Brothers Justin Jones and Dennis Yates, was inspired to enhance the degree experience after hearing fellow Brother Jason Reichenberg describe using wax seals in candidate letters.

Hand-Delivered Invitations with a Personal Touch

What started as an idea soon became a heartfelt project. After a candidate is elected to receive the Entered Apprentice Degree, Brother Hauf creates a formal invitation—printed on special parchment paper, sealed with wax, and personally delivered. The letter specifies the exact time the candidate must arrive: "neither before nor after."

When the candidate arrives, they find the Lodge already at labor. Without interaction, they are ushered into the anteroom and prepared by the Master of Ceremonies and the Senior Deacon, who reads directly from the Monitor. The atmosphere is steeped in mystery and reverence.

"The reactions I'm getting are that they're very nervous about the mystery of it all," says Brother Hauf, "but at the same time, they feel very special to be included in what we're doing." — Mike Mistry P.M.

NON-PAYMENT OF DUES


Over recent decades, we have lost the most Masons each year to deaths, the 2nd most to suspensions for non-payment of dues (NPD), and the 3rd most to Failure to Advance (FTA) from EA to MM. Those are by far the main ways that we lose members. Demits would be a more proper way for MMs to quit, but as there's no real penalty for going NPD instead of demitting, only 3% of our members pay that last year of dues and go out square. Even fewer are suspended for un-masonic conduct, are expelled, or transfer out to State. In practice, ghosting us and being suspended for NPD accounts for nearly 95% of the non-death losses of raised Masons from the Fraternity.

In the big picture, Statewide, over the past 5 decades, we've averaged initiations corresponding to about 2.1% of our membership each year, but we're now losing nearly half of those FTA, yielding over the past 2 decades an average of raising about 1.1% of our membership each year. Unfortunately, 1.1% raised voluntarily in is being countered by 2.1% NPD voluntarily out, for Statewide totals anyway.

Statewide numbers though do not tell the whole picture. Our better half of lodges, numbers-wise, raise and retain more. 342 lodges (48% of the lodges that can do degrees) have initiated more men than they've lost to NPD since COVID, and 216 lodges (30%) have raised more than they've lost to NPD since COVID. Read that again, and take it to heart. That 30% of lodges accounted for less than 11% of our total NPDs, and if you look just at that 30% of lodges instead of the Statewide totals, our numbers look great. Take that into account when thinking of changes and Resolutions. Just as you shouldn't break Masonry because of the ones not doing it, you shouldn't change the pipeline for the ones not using it. It's the 345 lodges (47%) that did not initiate anyone in the last Masonic year, 202 lodges (28%) that haven't done any EA degrees in the last 2 years, and 115 lodges (16%) that have not raised anyone at all since the COVID pause that turn the Statewide totals negative. The top 30% have raised more than twice (2.3x) as many men as they've lost to NPD over the past 5 years, and that is quite positive!


Looking overall again, I said above that our average has been about 2.1% going NPD each year over the past couple of decades; however, it has generally been trending down since the post-National Treasure peak, and following 2022, NPD suspensions were at the lowest in decades at 1.5%. That jumped up to 2.3% following 2023 but has since come back some to 2.0%.

Figure 1 shows the age of those who just went suspended for non-payment of dues. Age isn't as



important an issue here as years in Masonry. The average of Figure 2 (this year's NPDs) is paying 18 years of dues before going suspended NPD; however, the peak of this chart is losing people raised 6 years ago. We lose a lot of people in the 5-15 yr range, but it tends to flatten off past that and just be to life changes.

As typical, less than 2% of those just suspended were lodge officers last year when the 2025 dues were due, and it should also be noted that only 10% had been officers in any of the last 4 years. The other 90% of the NPD suspensions had not filled any office anytime recently.

Finally, a note about dues increases. 70 lodges increased their dues last year, from \$5 to \$250 increases. Those that did, on average, lost 3 members more to NPD than their 3yr average. Increases of less than \$25 showed an average of 2.3 more people lost to NPD (not necessarily just due to the dues increase of course as who would quit over \$25). Increases from \$25 to \$100 averaged 4 more people lost, and increases of more than \$100 in dues averaged 2.7 more people lost. These are averages, and there is some variability between lodges. A few lodges lost more notably more which should tell you that you need to make a dues increase make sense to your members and get their buy-in. Still, overall, the average lodge losing a few people, but only a few, after a dues increase is something I've reported in years past, so this year was pretty much in line with historical norms on this topic.

Overall, it's no surprise that most of those who go suspended for non-payment of dues haven't been active in a while, and it's good to see the Statewide NPDs come back down some from the post-2023 spike and that people aren't quitting lodges in large numbers following reasonable dues increases. But most pleasing to me is to see that the top 30% of our lodges have raised more than twice as many men since COVID than they've lost to non-death reasons. There's a bright future there! – Zachary Haston, PM

MONTHLY LAW READING – AUDIT COMMITTEE

As we move into July and our newly installed Worshipful Masters take to the East, one of the first duties that devolves upon them is to appoint an audit committee to examine the books from the previous masonic year. This needs to be done as soon as possible so that the committee can get to work and return their report to the Lodge. Their report, Minimum Audit Form No. 71, needs to be sent to the Grand Secretary's office no later than September 15th.

These requirements are laid out in Art. 284 Duty to Require Audits: "It shall be the duty of the Worshipful Master as soon after the 24th of June each year as convenient to appoint a committee of three qualified members, a certified public accountant, or a public accountant, whose duty it shall be to audit books and accounts of the Treasurer and Secretary and make prompt report thereof in writing to the Lodge, said report shall be read to the Lodge in open stated communication and be recorded in full in the minutes. The auditors' report shall fully show the total amounts of receipts and disbursements during the past year and any balance remaining on hand. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer and Secretary to make all their books and records available to the Committee or accountant appointed to audit same. A properly completed and signed copy of the Minimum Audit Form No. 71 shall be delivered to the Grand Secretary no later than September 15th each year. If the Lodge by resolution or by its bylaws requires a bond for any officer of the Lodge authorized to handle the Lodge, it shall be the duty of the Worshipful Master to have all officers of the Lodge authorized to handle the Lodge funds covered by such bond." – Jeremy R. Johnson, P.M.

SECRETARY INSTRUCTIONS

The following information is intended primarily for the Secretary but may be meaningful to many of your members.

Lodge Suspense System:

Suspense Dates – Lodge Secretaries should create a suspense system (a reminder system) to alert the Lodge that certain documents are due. This list is offered as a "starter kit' for your consideration:

- a. January The Worshipful Master should appoint a Committee on Members in Arrears (Article 319a).
- **b.** May 31 W. B. and Brandon Carrell Award nominations may be submitted to the Grand Lodge Committee on Public Education for evaluation and recommendation to the Grand Lodge Trustees (Article 14b).
- **c.** Mid-June Look for the Annual Returns Format from GL. (Downloaded from the Grand View System after June 24th. Notify the GS staff if you need the returns mailed as a printout).
- **d.** June 23 Lodge elections must be completed at the last stated meeting prior to midnight of June 23 (Art. 292). Notify us of the new Lodge Officers immediately so they can be printed in the Directory of Constituent Lodges (do not wait for installation). Submission will be available on the Grand View System from May 24 through midnight June 23.
- e. June 23 Endowed Membership checks must be in the Office of the Grand Secretary by June 23 to start earning interest in order to receive returns by the next year (Art. 318a). Changes to the amount of endowments must be voted on at the same meeting as the Lodge elections, and notification to the Grand Lodge must be before June 24th. Endowed Membership applications received at the Grand Lodge on or after June 24 must be for the amount that the Lodge reported.
- f. July 15 Statements of Availability due GS Office. (6a).
- g. July 31 Lodge installations must be performed from June 24 to prior to midnight July 31 (Art. 298).
- **h.** August 15 Annual Returns Report due to Grand Lodge (Art. 493).
- i. August 15 Resolutions due in GS Office (Art. 172).
- j. September 15 Lodge Minimum Audit Report 71 is due to the GS Office NLT September 15 (Art. 284).
- **k.** September 15 Vanguard Applications are due to the DDGM NLT September 15 and to the Grand Secretary NLT September 30 (refer to Vanguard Application Instructions).
- I. October 1 Lodge By-Laws that must be reviewed by the GL Committee on By-Laws due the GS Office NLT October 1 (Art. 219).
- m. Nov 15 Form 990-N, Electronic Notice (e-Postcard), must be filed with the IRS by Lodges that have gross receipts of \$50,000 or less or do not meet the requirements for filing the IRS 990 or IRS 990EZ. (Lodges must file the appropriate Form 990 no later than the 15th day of the fifth month following the close of the organization's fiscal year.)
- **n.** Dec. 28 Proxy Certificates are due the GS Office NLT December 28 (Art. 4). You should always appoint a Proxy (in case of an emergency) but he would not vote if any of the top three officers were available. Remember, each brother can have no more than four votes. Therefore, a sitting Worshipful Master cannot be a proxy for another Lodge.
