
ENDOWMENT DISTRIBUTION

I am pleased to announce that your Lodge's Endowment Distribution check will be generated and will be sent to the mailing address listed on Grandview. In the days to come, please be on the lookout for the check. Please note that the return address will be from "Payment Operations" (see picture below).

This year, the distribution amount per mature unit is **\$5.00.** The mature units are those units your lodge owned before June 24, 2024. The June 30, 2025 value per unit is **\$111.04**. Total units are the units your Lodge purchased before June 23, 2025. You will be able to compare these numbers with your Lodge's endowment amounts by generating an endowment report on Grandview. If you have issues accessing this report, please email the Grand Secretary's Office for assistance.

When filling out your Lodge's Form 71, the equation you should use is the total number of endowment units owned at June 23, 2025 times the endowment unit value (total units x \$111.04). Your check amount will be the mature units times the distribution amount per mature unit (mature units x \$5.00).





2025-26 OFFICER OVERVIEW

Brethren, as lodge officer installations are now complete, this month we're going to take a look at the new 2025-26 officers. Please note that all of this data is only what has been entered into Grandview by the Secretaries to date with 91% of the lodges having entered a complete officer roster, 5% with a partial list (missing a Chaplain or something), and 4% of the lodges still have not entered anything at all into Grandview. Still, we can see some things from the 91 or 96% entered.




Senior Steward


First off, a note about the Stewards. In 2023-24, we had 375 Senior Stewards and 280 Junior Stewards installed. Last year, after the Grand Master pointed out Article 264, that jumped to 565 Senior Stewards and 538 Junior Stewards installed. This year, after we changed Art.264 at the Grand Annual Communication, we have 338 Senior Stewards and 279 Junior Stewards installed, a return to near what it was in 2023-24.

Generationally, the age breakdown of the Worshipful Masters this year is virtually identical to last year with just under half (47%) being Baby Boomers and older and just over half (53%) being Gen X or younger. At Senior Warden those ratios become 43%/57%, and by Junior Warden those ratios change to 40% Baby Boomer or older and 60% Gen X or younger. Our average WM age passed from Baby Boomers into Gen X a few years ago and continues in that direction.



In this year's class, the most anyone has previously served as WM is 10 terms (Figure 3), although that is just one person. We have 312 first-time Worshipful Masters this year, a drop from 352 last year. Secretaries have more experience, although we do have 105 first-time Secretaries in this year's class (Figure 4). In terms of tenure, this year's Secretaries again have the most experience in that office with an average of having served 6.6 times previously, followed by the Treasurers who have served an average of 5.8 times previously and the Chaplains who have served an average of 4.8 times previously.



Figures 5-7 show the officer's experience in terms of years in Masonry. People tend to serve as Worshipful Masters relatively early in their Masonic careers these days with the peak in the 4 to 6 year or more broadly the 2 to 8 year range. In the extremes, our newest first-time Worshipful Master has 1.3yrs in Masonry (raised and elected SW months later and then WM the next year). On the other end of the chart we have a Brother who has been a Mason for 63.6yrs and is just now serving his first term as Worshipful Master of his lodge.





Figure 6. 2024-25 Secretary Years in Masonry



As seen in Figure 6, the Secretaries serve a bit later having more Masonic experience, although we do have five Secretaries raised less than a year ago taking on that office as their first. Is that the best thing for them, or the lodge? Similarly, Treasurers tend to have more experience, although we do have two Treasurers who have been Masons less than a year. These may be good ones, but we have had incidents in the past with giving access to all your lodge bank accounts and investments to someone who has just joined, so caution is warranted there.


Finally, as seen in Figure 7, our Chaplains are our most Senior officers, not necessarily in terms of years served in that office, but in terms of years in Masonry. Our Chaplains average 28.5 years in Masonry, and many have 40 or 50+ years.

The final thing I'd like to point out is the rise in the number of Brethren serving offices in multiple lodges. Figure 8 shows how many offices a Brother is serving in this year, for those who are in an office. By far, the majority are serving in just one lodge; however, there is an increasing trend in those serving in multiple lodges at once. This can be seen in Figure 9. This year we have a Brother serving in Top 5 offices in six different lodges at the

same time, and another in five lodges. Those are extremes, but we do have 307 Brethren serving in Top 5


positions in two or more lodges. From a lodge perspective, 410 of our 733 lodges have at least one Top 5

officer who is also a Top 5 officer in another lodge, and 131 lodges have a Top 5 officer who is a Top 5 officer in two or more other lodges. We certainly need to thank these Brethren for such service to the Fraternity, but at the same time, is the trend in Figure 9 is the healthiest for our Institution? – **Zachary Haston, PM**

MONTHLY LAW READING – MASONIC FUNERALS

As Masons we are entitled to Masonic Funerals as set forth in Art. 359 To Whom Extended: "Burial with Masonic ceremonies is a privilege which pertains to all Masons, including Entered Apprentices, Fellowcrafts, and Master Masons, by virtue of their membership. It may be extended to worthy non- affiliated Masons if the Master of the Lodge so determines. It shall be the duty of each Lodge except as otherwise provided in this Chapter, to conduct the funeral ceremonies, in accordance with Masonic customs and usages, in all cases where it was the expressed wish of a member in good standing and is concurred in by his near relatives. In the absence of such expressed wish, the ceremonies shall be performed over the remains of such deceased member when requested by his near relatives after his death. Upon request it may be extended at the discretion of the Master of the Lodge to worthy non-affiliated Masons if he so determines, and to worthy suspended Masons who have been suspended for non-payment of Lodge dues."

As the above article points out, this must come from the expressed wishes of the member and with the concurrence of his family. If you would like to have a Masonic Funeral, it is your duty to make that wish known to your Lodge and your loved ones. There is a form available on the Member Portal to facilitate this for you. It can be found here: Masonic Last Rites Request Form – Jeremy R. Johnson, P.M.



SECRETARY INSTRUCTIONS

The following information is intended primarily for the Secretary but may be meaningful to many of your members.

Lodge Suspense System:

Suspense Dates – Lodge Secretaries should create a suspense system (a reminder system) to alert the Lodge that certain documents are due. This list is offered as a "starter kit' for your consideration:

- **a.** January The Worshipful Master should appoint a Committee on Members in Arrears (Article 319a).
- **b.** May 31 W. B. and Brandon Carrell Award nominations may be submitted to the Grand Lodge Committee on Public Education for evaluation and recommendation to the Grand Lodge Trustees (Article 14b).
- **c.** Mid-June Look for the Annual Returns Format from GL. (Downloaded from the Grand View System after June 24th. Notify the GS staff if you need the returns mailed as a printout).
- d. June 23 Lodge elections must be completed at the last stated meeting prior to midnight of June 23 (Art. 292). Notify us of the new Lodge Officers immediately so they can be printed in the Directory of Constituent Lodges (do not wait for installation). Submission will be available on the Grand View System from May 24 through midnight June 23.
- e. June 23 Endowed Membership checks must be in the Office of the Grand Secretary by June 23 to start earning interest in order to receive returns by the next year (Art. 318a). Changes to the amount of endowments must be voted on at the same meeting as the Lodge elections, and notification to the Grand Lodge must be before June 24th. Endowed Membership applications received at the Grand Lodge on or after June 24 must be for the amount that the Lodge reported.
- **f.** July 15 Statements of Availability due GS Office. (6a).
- g. July 31 Lodge installations must be performed from June 24 to prior to midnight July 31 (Art. 298).
- h. August 15 Annual Returns Report due to Grand Lodge (Art. 493).
- i. August 15 Resolutions due in GS Office (Art. 172).
- j. September 15 Lodge Minimum Audit Report 71 is due to the GS Office NLT September 15 (Art. 284).
- **k.** September 15 Vanguard Applications are due to the DDGM NLT September 15 and to the Grand Secretary NLT September 30 (refer to Vanguard Application Instructions).
- I. October 1 Lodge By-Laws that must be reviewed by the GL Committee on By-Laws due the GS Office NLT October 1 (Art. 219).
- m. Nov 15 Form 990-N, Electronic Notice (e-Postcard), must be filed with the IRS by Lodges that have gross receipts of \$50,000 or less or do not meet the requirements for filing the IRS 990 or IRS 990EZ. (Lodges must file the appropriate Form 990 no later than the 15th day of the fifth month following the close of the organization's fiscal year.)
- **n.** Dec. 28 Proxy Certificates are due the GS Office NLT December 28 (Art. 4). You should always appoint a Proxy (in case of an emergency) but he would not vote if any of the top three officers were available. Remember, each brother can have no more than four votes. Therefore, a sitting Worshipful Master cannot be a proxy for another Lodge.
