

What Makes This Conference Unique?

Supporting Emerging Trainers

This conference creates space for emerging trainers with real-world expertise in early childhood education to share their knowledge while receiving mentoring and coaching.

A key goal is to expand the number of Black and Brown trainers who can serve as trusted messengers at both local and statewide events while providing Wisconsin Registry-approved training.

<u>Bilingual and Inclusive by Design</u> As a fully bilingual conference, every session offers real-time English/Spanish interpretation through headsets. This ensures participants can choose sessions based on interest, not language, fostering true inclusivity and shared learning.

Prioritizing Educator Well-Being Educator mental health and self-care are built into the day. Breaks for emotional regulation, energizing and calming activities, and resource spaces staffed by mental health professionals create opportunities to recharge. To further support access, a children's activity area is available so participants who may not have secured child care can still fully participate in the event.



Luis Godinez Passion, Motivation, and Purpose: Choosing the Leadership Path in Early Childhood Education

This motivating keynote explores how early childhood educators can channel their personal drive and values into impactful leadership. It highlights the importance of self-awareness, professional purpose, and advocacy in shaping a meaningful career. Attendees will be inspired to reflect on their own journeys and consider how they can lead with intention in their roles. This session encourages a deeper commitment to making a difference in the lives of young children and the field as a whole.

About Luis Godinez: Luis has dedicated over 15 years to ECE as a family child care provider, a K4 public school teacher, and now as an instructor at both Milwaukee Area Technical College and Madison College. He guides future educators as they prepare to enter the classroom, helping them build not just skills, but confidence, purpose, and heart. His work is grounded in the belief that relationships, reflection, and emotional intelligence are at the core of meaningful teaching. He encourages students to see every child as a whole person and to approach their work with compassion, curiosity, and humility. He sees teaching as a human profession that requires us to be present, empathetic, and always learning.

Luis believes that leadership is not always something we seek, but something we step into because we must. In ECE, we are often called to lead to advocate for children, families, and our profession. Luis continues to grow as a leader, even when it stretches him. He encourages others to do the same, to find their voice, and to lead with integrity and purpose, especially when it's difficult.

As a first-generation college graduate, Luis carries the values his parents instilled in him: the importance of work, self-improvement, and honoring the connections we share with others. He believes that diversity is not just something to acknowledge but something to embrace and learn from. Every child, every family, and every aspiring teacher brings a story worth hearing, and he is committed to creating spaces where those stories are respected and celebrated.





Session Descriptions

Breakout #1



1A. Pyramid Model Program Overview - Lisa Garlie, Presenter Language English, Room 4004

If a participant wants to learn more about the Pyramid Model framework and how this framework can be embedded in their program, this is the place to be! In this session we will take a deep dive into Pyramid Model Program Wide Implementation, the benefits to programs that go program wide with Pyramid Model and the connection Pyramid Model has to quality care.



1B. Intentional Shelves: Bias, Representation, and Equity in Early Literacy - Kelly Melton, Presenter Language English, Room 4005

In this engaging and reflective session, early childhood professionals will explore the power of intentional book selection in shaping inclusive, equitable, and culturally responsive learning environments. Participants will examine the connection between early literacy and the school-to-prison pipeline, and how representation in books supports identity development, empathy, and belonging for all children.



IC. Setting Professional and Personal Goals for Well-Being in Early Childhood Education - Ivonne
Caceres, Presenter Language Spanish Room 4006

Early childhood educators shape young minds, but sustaining their own well-being is key to lasting impact. This interactive session offers practical strategies for setting SMART goals that support personal and professional growth. Educators will explore ways to balance responsibilities with self-care, build a growth mindset, and create a mini vision board to visualize their goals. Participants will leave with renewed purpose and clear, actionable steps to support their well-being.





Session Descriptions

Breakout #2



2A. Smooth Transitions During Daily Routines in ECE, Marisela Carpio Presenter Language Spanish Room 4004

Join us for this engaging workshop where we will discuss supporting smooth transitions in childcare. We will discuss how to identify a transition and how to take advantage of these to have a change from one activity to another in your child care routines in a smoother and (why not) fun way. There will be opportunity to share your own transitions and hear from others.



2B. Differences in the process for acquiring your Family Child Care and Child Care Center license. Maria RamírezEspaña Presenter Language Spanish Room 4005

In this session we will discuss the different agencies involved in obtaining a DCF license to open a family childcare or group childcare. We will also Explain the differences in education requirements between Family Childcare and Childcare Centers. As well as analyze and compare the different types of support for child development in family care vs. group care.



2C. Classroom, Community, Culture Strengthening Home School Connections -Jeremy Walton, Presenter Language English Room 4006

Home and school greatly shape a child's development, and strong communication between them is key. Building relationships and a classroom culture that reflects each child's background strengthens this connection. This session explores how culturally responsive practices support collaboration and student success.

In this workshop, participants will acquire the fundamental knowledge to implement safe practices in child care centers, integrating them into their policies and contracts. Key concepts and essential elements that strengthen the protection of children and educators will be covered, while ensuring compliance with DCF, YoungStar, and food program regulations.



3B. Relax, **Recharge**, **Revive**. **Self-care for the heart of ECE**, Sandra Hernandez Presenter Language English Room 4006

In this workshop, you'll explore powerful techniques for managing stress. Not just by reducing it, but by discovering how to balance your stress load in ways that encourage growth, enhance performance and promote a deeper understanding of your own limits. You'll learn how to embrace productive stress and use it as a inspiration for development while mastering effective stress reduction techniques. Building resilience and adapting to challenging situations. This workshop will help you gain the tools to improve mental clarity, and boost your overall well-being.




